Cap. xxxiii.

An Act for repairing the Road from *Dover* in the County of *Kent*, through *Deal*, to *Sandwich* in the said County. [14th *June* 1839.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Thirty-seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act for repairing and widening the Road 37 G. 3. leading from the Town and Port of Dover, through the Town and c.156. Borough of Deal, to a certain Place in the Parish of Sholden called Foulmead Field; and for making a new Road through Part of the said Field and Hacklinge Brooks, and Part of a certain other Field called Word Field, to or near to a Messuage or Farm House called Upton Farm, in the Parish of Worth otherwise Word; and for repairing and widening the Road from thence to the Town and Port of Sandwich: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fifty-eighth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act to continue the Term and alter and enlarge the Powers 58 G. 3. of an Act of the Thirty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, for re- c.26. pairing the Road from Dover in the County of Kent, through Deal, to Sandwich, in the said County: And whereas the Trustees appointed in or by virtue of the said Acts have proceeded to put the same into execution, and have from Time to Time borrowed considerable [Local.] Sums

Sums of Money upon the Credit of the Tolls thereby authorized to be collected, which Money, together with an Arrear of Interest thereon, still remains due and owing, and cannot be repaid, nor can the said Road be properly maintained and improved, or kept in repair, unless the Powers and Provisions of the said Acts are altered and enlarged, and additional Tolls granted for those Purposes: And whereas it is expedient that the said recited Acts should be repealed, and other Powers granted in lieu thereof: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Recited Acts Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the Commencement of this Act the said recited Acts shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

This Act to be put in execution instead thereof.

II. And be it further enacted, That instead thereof this Act shall be put in execution for the Purpose of more effectually repairing, altering, improving, and keeping in repair the present Turnpike Road leading from the Town and Port of Dover in the County of Kent, through the Town and Borough of Deal, to the Town and Port of Sandwich in the said County.

IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Power to Trustees appointed by this Act, at any Meeting from Time to Time appoint adto be held for that Purpose (of which Meeting and of the Pur-Trustees. pose thereof, Fourteen Days Notice shall be given, as is directed by the Acts in force relating to Turnpike Roads in England respecting the Appointment of Trustees on Vacancies), to elect, nominate, and appoint any Number of fit Persons, being duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in England, not exceeding Three in the whole, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, in addition to the Trustees hereby nominated and appointed; and such Trustees so elected and appointed shall be and they are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities as if they had been named and appointed by this Act.

V. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold Place of their First Meeting after the Commencement of this Act at the First Meet-Guildhall in Deal aforesaid, or at some convenient House or Place ing. on or near the said Road, on the Third Friday next after the Commencement of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Eleven in the Forenoon and Four in the Afternoon, and shall then and there proceed to put this Act into execution, and shall and may then, and from Time to Time afterwards, adjourn to and meet at such Times, and at such Places either upon or near to the said Road, as the said Trustees, or the major Part of them present at any of such Meetings, shall think proper and appoint.

VI. And be it further enacted, That in all Cases in which the Power to sell said Trustees now are or shall at any Time hereafter become abso- Toll Houses lutely possessed or entitled, by Purchase or Exchange, or by any which may become other legal Means, of or to any Piece or Parcel of Ground upon unnecessary. which any Toll House, with or without Outhouses and Appurtenances thereto belonging, shall have been erected, it shall be lawful for the Trustees absolutely to sell and dispose of the same or any Part thereof, together with the Ground whereupon the same may stand, and all Outhouses, Gardens, and Appurtenances belonging thereto, whenever the same shall be considered by the said Trustees to be useless or unnecessary for the Purposes of this Act, to any Person or Persons whomsoever, either by public Auction or private Sale, at or for such Price or Prices as the said Trustees can obtain for the same; and in case of any such Sale being made as aforesaid it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to convey the said Toll Houses, Gardens, and Premises to the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof; and upon Payment of the Purchase Money to the Treasurer of the Trustees for the Time being, and upon and from and after the Execution of the Conveyance, such Purchaser or Purchasers shall hold and enjoy the Premises

in Fee Simple, discharged from all Trusts, and free from all Incumbrances whatsoever, and shall not be obliged to see to the Application of the Purchase Money, nor be answerable for the Misapplication or Nonapplication thereof: Provided always, that such and the like Preference and Priority of purchasing the Premises so to be sold shall always be given to the Owner or Owners of the next adjoining Land as is by the Statute for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England directed to be given in case of the Sale of any Piece or Pieces of Ground not wanted for the Purposes of a Turnpike Road.

Power to take Tolls.

VII. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees, from and after the Commencement of this Act, shall and may cause to be demanded and taken at each and every Turnpike, Toll House, Toll Bar, or Chain now erected, set up, and continued, or which shall hereafter be erected or set up, upon or across or on the Side of the said Road, by each and every such Person as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time appoint for that Purpose, or their Lessees, and on every Day, such Day to be computed from Twelve of the Clock at Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next succeeding Night; before any Horse, Mule, Ass, Beast, or other Cattle, or any Coach, Cart, or other Carriage, shall be permitted to pass through the same, any Sum not exceeding the respective Tolls following; (that is to say,)

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast (except an Ass), drawing any Coach, Chariot, Phaeton, Calash, Car, Curricle, Vis à Vis, Chaise Marine, Chaise Diligence, Van, Caravan, Sociable, Berlin, Landau, Barouche, Chair, Gig, Whiskey, Hearse, Litter, Cart, or other Carriage, the Sum of Three-pence:

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast of Draught, drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, Van, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, where the Fellies of the Wheels are of a less Breadth than Four and a Half Inches, the Sum of Three-pence:

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast of Draught, drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, Van, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, where the Fellies of the Wheels are of the Breadth of Four and a Half Inches and of less Breadth than Six Inches, the Sum of Twopence Halfpenny:

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast of Draught, drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, Van, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, where the Fellies of the Wheels are of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, the Sum of Two-pence:

For every Four-wheeled Carriage fixed in any Manner to any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, or other Carriage, the Sum of Sixpence: For every Two-wheeled Carriage so fixed, the Sum of Three-pence: For every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of One Penny:

For every Ass drawing any Carriage, the Sum of Two-pence:

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of Tenpence per Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number:

For every Drove of Calves, Hogs, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Five pence per Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number:

For

For every Carriage of any Description whatever, propelled by Steam, Gas, Machinery, or any other like Means, the Sum of One Shilling:

And for every Dog drawing any Cart, Carriage, or other Vehicle, the Sum of One Penny:

Which said several and respective Tolls shall be and the same are Tolls vested hereby vested in the said Trustees, and shall be applied for the Pur- in Trustees. poses of this Act in the Manner herein-after directed.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That in all Cases where there As to fracshall be a fractional Part of One Halfpenny in the Calculation or tional Parts Amount of the Tolls hereby granted, or any of them, the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be demanded, paid, and taken in lieu of such fractional Part.

IX. And be it further enacted, That if the Tolls hereby authorized Tolls to be to be taken shall have been paid for the passing of any Horse, paid but Cattle, Beast, or Carriage through any One of the Turnpikes, Toll passing and Gates, Bars, or Chains to be continued or erected upon, across, repassing or on the Side of the said Road, such Horse, Cattle, Beast, or the same Carriage, except as herein-after mentioned, shall (upon a Ticket Day. being produced denoting such Payment) be permitted to pass and repass Toll-free through the same Turnpike, Toll Gate, Bar, or Chain, and also through such Turnpike, Toll Gate, Bar, Chain, or Side Gate as the Ticket for such Payment shall free, at any Time during the same Day.

X. And be it further enacted, That for and in respect of all Tolls to be Horses or other Beasts drawing any Stage Coach, Stage Waggon, Cart, Van, Caravan, or other Stage Carriage carrying Passengers or Goods for Payment, Hire, or Reward, for which Tolls shall every Time have been paid at any such Toll Gate; Turnpike, Side Gate, or Chain as aforesaid, and which shall return through the same on the ing on the same Day, the respective Tolls herein-before mentioned and made same Day; payable shall be paid for every Time of passing and repassing on the same Day through every such Toll Gate, Turnpike, Side Gate, and Chain, in the like Manner as if no Toll had before been paid thereat.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the respective Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for and in respect of all Horses and other Beasts of Draught travelling for Hire, and drawing any Post Hiring; Chaise or other Carriage, for every Time of passing or repassing along the said Road as often as a fresh Hiring thereof shall take place.

XII. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable for or in respect of any Carriage propelled or moved by Steam, Gas, Carriages, Machinery, or any other like Means, shall be paid every Time of of passing passing and repassing of such Carriage through each Toll Gate, Turnpike, Side Gate, or Chain on the said Road.

Present Toll Gates continued, and Power given to erect additional Toll Gates.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That all and every the Toll Gates, Toll Bars, Turnpikes, and Toll Houses and Weighing Machines, now standing and being upon the said Road or upon the Sides thereof, shall remain and be continued until removed by any Orderor Orders of the said Trustees; and it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, at a public Meeting of the said Trustees, to order and cause to be erected, set up, and built, upon, in, or across the said Road or any Part thereof, or upon the Sides thereof, when, where, and as they shall judge necessary, any Gate or Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, Side Gate or Side Gates, Side Bar or Side Bars, Chain or Chains, and also from Time to Time to order and cause to be taken down and removed, or altered or discontinued, the present Toll Gates, Turnpikes, and Side Gates, and such future Gates, Turnpikes, Side Gates, Side Bars, and Chains as they the said Trustees shall think proper.

Power to remove Toll Gates

XIV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees or any Five or more of them, and they are hereby empowered, from Time to Time, when and so often as they shall think proper, to cause any of the Turnpikes or Toll Gates or Toll Houses which are already erected in, upon, or across or on the Side or Sides of the said Road, by virtue of the said recited Acts, and continued by this Act, and all and every or any Toll Gate and Toll House to be erected on the said Road by virtue of this Act, to be removed to and erected in, upon, or across, or on the Side or Sides of such other Part or Parts of the said Road as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time at any Meeting order and direct, provided that none of the said Toll Gates or Turnpikes shall be removed as aforesaid unless Fourteen Days previous Notice of the Intention to remove the same shall have been given in One or more of the Newspapers published in the County of Kent.

Limiting the Number of Gates.

XV. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Collector of the said Tolls, to demand or take such Tolls for or in respect of the same Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage in any One Day at any greater Number of the Toll Gates, Turnpikes, Side Gates, Side Bars, or Chains now erected and continued, or which shall hereafter be erected or set up, upon or across or on the Side of the whole Line of the said Road, than is herein-after mentioned, notwithstanding there may be a greater Number erected or placed thereon; (that is to say,) at no more than Two Toll Gates or Turnpikes, or Side Gates or Side Bars, or Chains, on such Part of the said Road as lies between the said Towns of Dover and Deal; nor at more than Two Toll Gates or Turnpikes, or Side Gates or Side Bars, or Chains, on such Part of the said Road as lies between the said Towns of Deal and Sandwich.

Application XVI. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls and all other Monies to be received by virtue of the said recited Acts and of this Act, as also all the Monies which at the Time of the Commencement of this Act shall have been raised or produced under the said recited Acts, and shall then be undisposed of, shall be applied and disposed of as herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) in the first place, in paying and

and defraying all the Costs, Charges, and Expences incident to and attending the obtaining and passing of this Act, together with lawful Interest for Money advanced by any Person or Persons for that Purpose; in the second place, in paying the Interest now due and which shall become due upon the several Principal Sums from Time to Time remaining due and owing on Mortgage or Security of the Tolls by the said recited Acts or this Act granted; and in the third place, in defraying the Expences of amending, repairing, widening, altering, improving, and keeping in repair the said Road, and of executing the several other Powers, Intents, and Purposes of this Act; and lastly, in reducing, paying off, and discharging the said several Principal Sums due on such Mortgages or Securities as aforesaid.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That none of the Tolls authorized No Part of by this Act to be taken upon the said Road, nor any of the Monies raised by virtue of the said recited Acts, or to be raised by virtue repairing of this Act, shall be laid out or expended in the Repair, Lighting, Streets. or Improvement of any Part of the said Road in any Town the Streets whereof are repaired or lighted under the Authority of any Local Act of Parliament.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed Public Act. and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence Commenceupon the Twelfth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and ment and thirty-nine, and shall continue and be in force for and during the Term of Act. of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
