An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders under
“The Local Government Act, 1858,” relating to
the Districts of *Southampton, Bradford, Whit-*
church and Dodington, Royton, Kendal, and
Sunderland. [13th July 1868.]

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for the Home Department, being One of Her Majesty’s Principal Secretaries of State, has, under the Provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, duly made certain Provisional Orders, which are contained in the Schedule to this Act annexed, and it is provided by the aforesaid Local Government Act that no such Orders shall be of any Validity whatever until they shall have been confirmed by Parliament, and it is expedient that the said Orders should be so confirmed :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen’s most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Provisional Orders contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed shall, from and after the passing of this Act, be absolute, and confirmed.

2. This Act shall be deemed to be incorporated with the Local Government Act, 1858, and shall be as if this Act and the said Local Government Act were One Act.

3. In citing this Act in any other Act of Parliament, or in any Proceeding, Instrument, or Document whatever, it shall be sufficient to use the Words and Figures "The Local Government Act, 1868 (No. 2)."

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SOUTHAMPTON.

Provisional Order for extending the Borrowing Powers of the Southampton Local Board of Health.

WHEREAS the Local Board of Health for the District of Southampton propose to carry out, under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, works of a permanent nature within their district, but the sum that will be required to carry out the said works will, with the loans already sanctioned, exceed the assessable value for one year of the premises assessable under the said Act within such district:

And

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And whereas the said Board have now, under the authority of the 78th section of the Local Government Act, 1858, petitioned me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to extend the limit of borrowing power for the carrying out of the said works to an amount which, when added to the sums of which the borrowing has been already sanctioned under the said Act, shall not exceed in the whole two years assessable value of the Premises assessable under the said Act within the district :

And whereas, after due inquiry and report by Robert Morgan, Esquire, the inspector appointed by me for the purpose, I am of opinion that the prayer of such Petition should be granted, but the same cannot be done without the consent of Parliament :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power now vested in me as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, I do hereby, by this Provisional Order under my hand, direct as follows:—

That from and after the passing of any Act of Parliament confirming this present Order—

The Local Board of Health for the District of Southampton shall have power to borrow for the execution of works of a permanent nature as aforesaid, on mortgage of the rates leviable by the said Local Board of Health under the aforesaid Act, such sums as they may from time to time be authorized by the sanction of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State to borrow, up to an amount which, when added to the amounts of the loans already so sanctioned, shall not exceed in the whole two years assessable value of the premises assessable under such Act within the aforesaid district; the whole of such sums to be repaid, with interest thereon, within a period not exceeding fifty years from the date of the borrowing thereof.

BRADFORD (YORKSHIRE).

*Provisional Order for extending the Borrowing Powers of the
Bradford Local Board of Health.*

WHEREAS the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the borough of Bradford, in the county of York, acting as the Local Board of Health in and for that borough, propose to carry out, under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, works of a permanent nature within their district, but the sum that will be required to carry out the said works will, with the loans already sanctioned, exceed the assessable value for one year of the premises assessable under the said Act within such district :

And whereas the said Local Board of Health have now, under the authority of the 78th section of the Local Government Act, 1858, petitioned me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to extend the limit of borrowing power for the carrying out of the said works to an amount which, when added to the sums of which the borrowing has been already sanctioned under the said Act, shall not exceed in the whole two years assessable value of the premises assessable under the said Act within the district.

And whereas, after due inquiry and report by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the inspector appointed by me for the purpose, I am of opinion that the prayer of such Petition should be granted, but the same cannot be done without the consent of Parliament :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power now vested in me as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, I do hereby, by this Provisional Order under my hand, direct as follows :—

That from and after the passing of any Act of Parliament confirming this present Order—

The Local Board of Health for the district of Bradford aforesaid shall have power to borrow for the execution of works of a permanent nature, on mortgage of the rates leviable by the said Local Board of Health under the aforesaid Act, such sums as they may from time to time be authorized by sanction of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State to borrow, up to an amount which, when added to the amounts of the loans already so sanctioned, shall not exceed in the whole two years assessable value of the premises assessable under such Act within the aforesaid district ; the whole of such sums heretofore borrowed and hereafter to be borrowed as aforesaid to be repaid, with interest thereon, within a period of fifty years from the date of the borrowing thereof.

The said Local Board of Health for the district of Bradford aforesaid shall be empowered to put in force, with reference to the land and premises referred to and described in the Schedule to this Order annexed, and in the Petition herein-before referred to, and shown as regards such lands and premises upon the plan accompanying such Petition, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement.

KENDAL.

Provisional Order putting in force the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, within the District of Kendal in the County of Westmoreland, for the Purchase of Lands by the Local Board of Health for the aforesaid District for Purposes of Drainage, &c.

WHEREAS the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the borough of Kendal, in the county of Westmoreland, by the Council of the said borough, acting as the Local Board of Health for the district of the said borough, and in execution of the Public Health Act, 1848, the Local Government Act, 1858, the Sewage Utilization Act, 1865, and the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867, or some or one of them, have presented a Petition to the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, M.P., as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, for authority to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking, otherwise than by agreement, of certain lands and hereditaments for the undertaking herein-after mentioned, namely, for the purpose of receiving, storing, disinfecting, or distributing the sewage and drainage of the said district, and for the construction thereon, or in some part or parts thereof, of sewers, drains, tanks, engines, pumps, pipes, apparatus, ways, and works for the sewage, and for receiving, storing, disinfecting, or distributing the sewage of all or any part or parts of the said district, and for roads and access to the same sewage and works :

And whereas the said Petition duly set forth the several pieces of land and the several buildings intended to be taken by such Board for such purposes, and the names of the owners, lessees, and occupiers of the aforesaid land and buildings who have assented, dissented, or are neuter in respect of the taking thereof, or who have returned no answer to the notice issued by such Board ; and such Petition prayed that the said Board might, with reference to such land and buildings, be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act aforesaid with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement ; and on the receipt of such Petition Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department directed Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed for the purpose, to visit the said district, and the said Inspector has now inquired in the district aforesaid into the subject-matter of such Petition, and has duly reported thereon :

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SUNDERLAND.

Provisional Order altering the Borough of Sunderland Act, 1851, and the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1865, in force within the District of the Local Board of Health for the Borough of Sunderland in the County of Durham, for Extension of their Borrowing Powers.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sunderland, in the county of Durham, being the Local Board of Health in and for the district of the said borough, under the Borough of Sunderland Act, 1851, the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1865, and the Sunderland Extension and Improvement Act, 1867, have, in pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, and after complying with the requirements thereof, presented a Petition, under the seal of the said Local Board, to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, for a partial alteration and repeal of their Local Acts, so as to extend their borrowing powers under the same:

And whereas, after due inquiry and report by Robert Morgan, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose, I am of opinion that the prayer of such Petition should be granted, but the same cannot be done without the consent of Parliament:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power now vested in me as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, I do hereby, by this Provisional Order under my hand, direct as follows:—

That from and after the passing of any Act of Parliament confirming this present Order—

- 1.—The Seventh section of the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1865, is hereby repealed.
- 2.—Notwithstanding anything in Section 81 of the Borough of Sunderland Act, 1851, or in any other enactment contained, the total amount of the money borrowed and to be borrowed, and for the time being remaining due, on all or any of the mortgage securities under which the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Borough of Sunderland, whether as a Municipal Corporation or as the Sunderland Local Board of Health, are liable, or which they are authorized to give, other than the bridge and ferry tolls arising under the "Wearmouth Bridge Act, 1857," or "The Sunderland Ferry Act, 1867," shall not at any time exceed in the whole one year's assessable value of the premises assessable under the Local Government Act, 1858, within their District, including the amount of one hundred thousand pounds authorized to be raised by them under the powers of the Sunderland Extension and Improvement Act, 1867.
