An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders under
“The Local Government Act, 1858,” relating to
the Districts of *Malvern, Cowpen, Bristol, Shef-
field, Margate, Bognor, and Otley*; and for other
Purposes relative to certain Districts under the
said Act. [13th July 1868.]

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for the Home Depart-
ment, being One of Her Majesty’s Principal Secretaries
of State, has, under the Provisions of the Local Govern-
ment Act, 1858, duly made certain Provisional Orders which are
contained in the Schedule to this Act annexed; and it is provided
by the aforesaid Local Government Act that no such Orders shall
be of any Validity whatever until they shall have been confirmed
by Parliament, and it is expedient that the said Orders should be
so confirmed, and other Provisions made with respect to certain
Districts already under the Local Government Act aforesaid:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen’s most Excellent Majesty,
by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and
Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled,
and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

The Local Government Supplemental Act, 1868 (No. 5).

Provisional
Orders in

confirmed.

1. The Provisional Orders contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed shall from and after the passing of this Act be absolute, and be as binding and of like Force and Effect as if the Provisions of the same had been expressly enacted in this Act.

Limit of
Time for
compulsory

2. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the City of *Bristol* being, by the Council of the said City, the Local Board of Health in and for the District of the said City and County of *Bristol*, shall not exercise the Powers of compulsory Purchase or taking of Lands under the Provisions of the *Bristol* Provisional Order (in the Schedule to this Act annexed), for the Purposes set forth and described in such Provisional Order, after the Expiration of Five Years from the Date of the passing of this Act.

3. This Act shall be deemed to be incorporated with the Local Government Act, 1858, and shall be as if this Act and the said Local Government Act were One Act.

Short Title.

4. In citing this Act in any other Act of Parliament, or in any Proceeding, Instrument, or Document whatever, it shall be sufficient to use the Words and Figures "The Local Government Supplemental Act, 1868 (No. 5)."

The Local Government Supplemental Act, 1868 (No. 5).

SCHEDULE of Provisional Orders referred to in the preceding Act.

1. MALVERN.—Provisional Order in pursuance of Section 77 of the Local Government Act, 1858, for repealing Parts of and amending the Malvern Improvement Act, 1851, and for other Purposes.
 2. COWPEN.—Provisional Order for altering the Boundaries of the District of Cowpen, in the County of Northumberland, under the Provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858.
 3. BRISTOL.—Provisional Order putting in force the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, within the District of the Bristol Local Board of Health, for the Purchase of Lands by the said Board for Street Improvements.

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MALVERN.

Provisional Order in pursuance of Section 77 of the Local Government Act, 1858, for repealing Parts of and amending the Malvern Improvement Act, 1851, and for other Purposes.

WHEREAS the Local Board of Malvern, acting as the Commissioners for putting into execution the Malvern Improvement Act, 1851, and the Malvern Improvement Amendment Act, 1858, duly adopted for that part of the Parish of Great Malvern in the County of Worcester which is within the limits set forth and described in the Malvern Improvement Act, 1851, the Local Government Act, 1858, except sections 54 and 55 and 56 thereof.

And whereas the said Commissioners, acting as the Local Board for the said Malvern District, have, in pursuance of section 77 of the Local Government Act, 1858, presented to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State a Petition praying for the alteration, amendment, and partial repeal of a certain Act of Parliament in force within their District (entitled the Malvern Improvement Act, 1851), having relation to the purposes of the said Local Government

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Government Act, 1858, and not conferring powers or privileges upon any corporation, company, undertakers, or individuals for their own pecuniary benefit.

And whereas, in pursuance of the said Local Government Act, inquiry has been directed in the said District in respect of the several matters mentioned in the said Petition, and held by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed for the purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

And whereas it appears expedient to issue a Provisional Order in relation to the said matters; but no such Order can be valid without confirmation by Parliament.

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Local Government Act, 1858, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do, by this Provisional Order under my hand, direct,—

That from and after the passing of any Act of Parliament confirming this Order,—

1.—The parts of the herein-before recited Malvern Improvement Act, 1851, shall be partially repealed and altered in the following manner; that is to say,—

Section 40 shall be altered by the omission of the words “not exceeding
“in any one year One shilling in the Pound of the full net annual
“value of the property included in such rate.”

Section 42 shall be repealed.

The first section of the aforesaid Malvern Improvement Act, 1851, shall be altered and amended by adding to the Acts incorporated therein,
“The Waterworks Clauses Act, 1863.”

2.—With the above alterations and amendment, the remaining unrepealed portions of the said Malvern Improvement Act, 1851, and said Local Government Act, 1858, and the Acts incorporated therewith, shall be incorporated, read, and construed as one Act applicable to the said District of Malvern.

COWPEN.

Provisional Order for altering the Boundaries of the District of Cowpen, in the County of Northumberland, under the Provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858.

WHEREAS a Petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, under the provisions of the 77th section of the Local Government Act, 1858, and duly signed by owners and ratepayers of the village of Newsham, township of Cowpen, and parish of Horton, in the county of Northumberland, praying for an alteration of the existing boundary of the Cowpen Local Board District, as set forth in such Petition and shown on the plan accompanying such Petition, the present district being shown by a line coloured blue, and the proposed addition being the area lying within the line coloured red on such Plan:

And

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And whereas, in pursuance of the said Local Government Act, inquiry has been directed in the said district in respect of the matters mentioned in the said Petition, and report has been duly made to me thereon by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose :

And whereas it appears expedient to issue a Provisional Order in relation to the said matters, but no such Order can be valid without confirmation by Parliament :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Local Government Act, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do, by this Provisional Order under my hand, direct,—

That from and after the passing of any Act of Parliament confirming this Order,—

1.—The District of the Local Board for Cowpen, in the county of Northumberland, be altered by there being added thereto all that area lying within the line coloured red on the plan aforesaid, such area being further indicated by the following description, that is to say:—The boundary of the proposed enlarged district which is proposed to be incorporated with the existing Cowpen Local Board District commences at the point C on the line coloured blue on the aforesaid plan, on the stream called The Gut, and at the south-easterly boundary line of the existing Cowpen District; and passes thence in a southerly and westerly direction, along the boundary line which separates the township of Cowpen from the townships of Newsham and South Blyth, and the township of Horton, to the point L on The Gut; thence westerly, along and including such stream or watercourse, to the point M; thence southerly, along the easterly boundary fence of the property numbered 205 on the aforesaid plan, to the point N on the township boundary line above mentioned; thence westerly and northerly, along and following such boundary line, to the point O at the north-west boundary fence of the property numbered 219 on the aforesaid plan; thence along the northerly and easterly boundary fences of the properties numbered 223, 224, 228, and 229 on that plan to the point Q; thence, along the westerly boundary fence of the property numbered 190 thereon, to the point R at a watercourse; thence in an easterly direction, along and including such watercourse, to the point S on the west side of the Blyth and Tyne Railway; and thence in a northerly direction, along and including such Railway, to the point F on the existing line of the Cowpen Local Board District; and thence passing along such last-named boundary line by the points marked G I J K A B, and coloured blue on the said plan, to the starting point at C, so completing the boundary of the proposed enlarged district of Cowpen.

2.—At every election of the members of the Local Board aforesaid which shall take place after the passing of the Act of Parliament confirming this order the members to be elected shall be elected for the Cowpen Local Board District as altered by this Order, and by the votes of owners of and ratepayers in respect of property situate within the district so altered as aforesaid.

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BRISTOL.

Provisional Order putting in force the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, within the District of the Bristol Local Board of Health, for the Purchase of Lands by the said Board for Street Improvements.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the City of Bristol, by the Council of the said City acting as the Local Board of Health in and for the City and County of Bristol, to which the Public Health Act, 1848, was duly applied, and in pursuance of the Provisions of the 75th Section of the Local Government Act, 1858, and after complying with the requirements of that Section by duly giving and serving all notices thereby directed, presented a Petition, under the Seal of the said Local Board, to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, for authority to put in force the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, to enable the aforesaid Local Board of Health to purchase, otherwise than by agreement, certain pieces of land for the purpose of widening, altering, and improving streets and roadways, and for making certain new streets within the aforesaid District of Bristol.

And whereas the said Petition, and the Schedules thereto annexed, duly set forth and described the pieces of land intended to be taken by such Board for such purposes, and the names of the owners, lessees, and occupiers of the aforesaid pieces of land who have assented, dissented, and are neuter in respect of the taking such pieces of land, or who have returned no answer to the notice issued by such Board; and such Petition prayed that the said Board might, with reference to such land, be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act aforesaid with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement; and on the receipt of such Petition Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department directed Robert Rawlinson, Esq., C.B., the Inspector appointed for the purpose, to visit the said District, and the said Inspector has now inquired in the District aforesaid into the subject matter of such Petition, and has duly reported thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order and direct,—

That from and after the passing of any Act of Parliament confirming this Order,—

- 1.—The aforesaid Local Board of Health for the District of Bristol shall be empowered to put in force, with reference to the land referred to and described in the Schedule to this Order annexed, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement.

Provisional Order for extending the Borrowing Powers of the Bognor Local Board.

WHEREAS the Local Board for the District of Bognor, in the County of Sussex, proposed to carry out, under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, works of a permanent nature within their District, but the sum that will be required to carry out the said works will, with the loans already sanctioned, exceed the assessable value for one year of the premises assessable under the said Act within such District:

And whereas the said Board have now, under the authority of the 78th section of the Local Government Act, 1858, petitioned me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to extend the limit of borrowing power for the carrying out of the said works to an amount which, when added to the sums of which the borrowing has been already sanctioned under the said Act and the Bognor Local Acts, shall not exceed in the whole two years' assessable value of the premises assessable under the said Act first mentioned within the District:

And whereas, after due inquiry and report by Robert Morgan, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose, I am of opinion that the prayer of such Petition should be granted; but the same cannot be done without the consent of Parliament:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers now vested in me as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, I do hereby, by this Provisional Order under my hand, direct as follows:—

That from and after the passing of any Act of Parliament confirming this present Order—

The Local Board for the District of Bognor in the county of Sussex shall have power to borrow for the execution of the aforesaid works, on mortgage of the rates leviable by the said Local Board under the aforesaid Acts, such sums as they may from time to time be authorized by the sanction of the Secretary of State to borrow, up to an amount which, when added to the amounts of the loans already borrowed, shall not exceed in the whole two years' assessable value of the premises assessable under such Acts within the aforesaid District; the whole of such sums as may be hereafter

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hereafter borrowed under the authority of this Order and the Act confirming the same to be repaid, with interest thereon, within a period of fifty years from the date of the borrowing thereof.
