



CHAPTER clii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Districts of Brecon, Canterbury, East Barnet Valley, East Stonehouse, Gorleston, Hardingstone, Kingston-upon-Hull, Liverpool, Lytham, Merthyr Tydvil, Portsmouth, Road, Shipley, and Willesden. A.D. 1874.

[30th July 1874.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have, as regards the several districts herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, and the Public Health Act, 1872, respectively :

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and the provisions herein contained should be enacted in reference to three of the said districts :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, except as herein mentioned, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. The Provisional Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. Notwithstanding anything in this Act contained it shall not be lawful for the urban sanitary authority for the borough of Brecon to purchase, take, enter upon, or interfere with in any way, without the previous consent in writing of the owner thereof for the time being, the lands or any part thereof first, secondly, and thirdly described in the schedule to the Order with respect to the borough of Brecon dated the third day of June one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and hereby confirmed, the owner of Lands of Lord Tredegar not to be taken without his consent.

The Local Government Board may divide districts named into wards.

3. The Local Government Board may, if they see fit, after the passing of this Act, divide the districts of East Barnet Valley and Hardingstone into wards for the election of members of the local boards for such districts, and may assign and determine the number of such members to be elected for the respective wards.

Provision for the property and debts in the East Barnet Valley District.

4. As soon as the said East Barnet Valley District shall be constituted, and the local board for such district shall be elected, all the works, land, and other property in the parish of East Barnet respectively executed, purchased by, leased to, or vested in either the sewer authority of the said parish under any of the Acts known as the Sanitary Acts and the Sewage Utilization Acts, or in the rural sanitary authority of the Barnet union under the Public Health Act, 1872, shall be transferred to the said local board, subject to all debts, obligations, and liabilities in respect thereof now outstanding.

Title of the Act.

5. This Act may be cited as "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1874 (No. 4)."

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Brecon to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brecon, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brecon, acting by the Council, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough, require to purchase and take certain lands and premises situate and being partly within and partly without the said Borough, and which are set forth and described in the Schedule hereunder, for the purposes of sewage outfall, disposal, and purification;

And whereas the Council of the said Borough have made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices as required by the Local Government Act, 1858, and have presented a Petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands and premises, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement;

And whereas upon receipt of such Petition, the Local Government Board directed an Inquiry to be held in the District in which the lands and premises are situate, as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said Petition, which Inquiry has been held and report duly made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, acting under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, do, by this Our Order, empower the said Urban Sanitary Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands and premises set forth and described in the Schedule hereunder, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

BOROUGH OF BRECON.

Provisional Order for extending the Borrowing Powers of the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Brecon.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brecon, in the County of Brecknock, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS certain street improvements and waterworks have been made and constructed within the Borough of Brecon, in the County of Brecknock, at a cost of thirteen thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds;

And whereas the said sum of thirteen thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds is due and owing from the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Borough, acting by the Council, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough;

And whereas the said Council propose, under the powers and provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, and of the Acts incorporated therewith, or some of them, to execute certain additional works of sewerage within their District, at an estimated cost of thirteen thousand five hundred pounds;

And whereas the said sum of thirteen thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds, together with the said sum of thirteen thousand five hundred pounds, which will be required for the works proposed to be executed as aforesaid, will exceed one year's assessable value of the premises within the said District, in respect whereof the money for the execution of such works may be borrowed, but will not exceed two years assessable value thereof;

And whereas the Council require to borrow such a sum as will be required for the said additional works, and have applied to the Local Government Board, praying them to extend their borrowing powers to two years assessable value of the premises within their District in respect whereof the money for the execution of such works may be borrowed;

And whereas the Local Government Board, upon receipt of such application, directed an Inquiry to be held thereon, and the same was held, after due notice, and a report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, acting under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brecon, acting by the Council, as such Urban Sanitary Authority as aforesaid shall have power to borrow, for the execution of the additional works above mentioned, on mortgage of the rates leviable by them under the Local Government Act, 1858, such a sum or sums as may from time to time be approved by the Local Government

A.D. 1874. Board, which, together with the said sum of thirteen thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds so due as aforesaid, shall not exceed the sum of twenty-eight thousand three hundred and sixty-two pounds, being two years assessable value of the premises assessable within the said District, in respect whereof the money for the execution of such works may be borrowed, such sum or sums to be repaid with interest thereon in such proportions and at such periods as the said Council, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, shall from time to time agree upon with the person or persons from whom such sum or sums shall be borrowed, so nevertheless that the whole of the sum or sums so borrowed be repaid within such period, not exceeding fifty years from the date of the borrowing thereof, as the said Council, with such sanction, shall determine.

CITY AND BOROUGH OF CANTERBURY.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the City and Borough of Canterbury to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and Borough of
Canterbury, in the County of Kent, being the Urban Sanitary
Authority for that City and Borough;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and Borough of Canterbury, acting by the Council, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that City and Borough, require to purchase and take a certain piece of land and premises, situate and being without the said City and Borough, and set forth and described in the Schedule hereunder, for the purposes of works of sewage outfall;

And whereas the Council of the said City and Borough have made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices as required by the Local Government Act, 1858, and have presented a Petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said piece of land and premises, to be allowed to put in force the powers

of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement ; A.D. 1874.

And whereas upon receipt of such Petition, the Local Government Board directed an Inquiry to be held in the District in which the said piece of land and premises are situate, as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said Petition, which Inquiry has been held and report duly made to them thereon :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, acting under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, do, by this Our Order, empower the said Urban Sanitary Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the piece of land and premises set forth and described in the Schedule hereunder, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

A piece of land containing by admeasurement one acre and one rood, or thereabouts, situate near the river Stour, in the Parish of Hackington, otherwise St. Stephen, in the County of Kent, and owned and occupied by William Cannon.

DISTRICT OF EAST BARNET VALLEY.

Provisional Order for constituting the East Barnet Valley Urban Sanitary District.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Barnet Union, in the Counties of Hertford and Middlesex ; —

To the Inhabitants of the Parishes of East Barnet and Chipping or High Barnet, in the County of Hertford, and of the Parish of Hadley or Monken Hadley, in the County of Middlesex, all in the said Union ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 24 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by Provisional Order, declare any portion of any Rural Sanitary District to be an Urban Sanitary District,

A.D. 1874. — and that, upon such Order being confirmed by Parliament, the portion of the District referred to therein shall become a Local Government District, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction of a Local Board;

And whereas the Parish of East Barnet and the part of the Parish of Chipping Barnet or High Barnet herein-after described, both in the County of Hertford, and the part of the Parish of Hadley or Monken Hadley, in the County of Middlesex, herein-after described, form part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Barnet Union, in the said Counties, and it has been represented to the Local Government Board that it is expedient that such part of the said Rural Sanitary District should be constituted an Urban Sanitary District, and that a Provisional Order should be issued for that purpose;

And whereas the Local Government Board directed an Inquiry to be held on the subject, and the same was held, after due notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, acting under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare, that, on and after the First day of October next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, All that part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Barnet Union which comprises the Parish of East Barnet, so much of the Parish of Hadley or Monken Hadley as is not included in the Urban Sanitary District of Barnet, and so much of the Parish of Chipping Barnet or High Barnet as lies to the east of the west side of the north road from London to Chipping Barnet, between the points where the boundary line of the Liberty of Saint Albans and the southern boundary line of the Barnet Urban Sanitary District cross such road, and to the east of the eastern boundary of the Barnet Urban Sanitary District, shall be an Urban Sanitary District within the meaning of the Public Health Act, 1872, under the name of the East Barnet Valley Urban Sanitary District;

And We do Order and Direct that the Members of the Local Board of such District shall consist of twelve persons, who shall be qualified as required by the Local Government Act, 1858, and be elected in the manner prescribed by that Act in the case where a Local Board is to be elected in a place having a known and defined boundary in which there is no Churchwarden nor any Overseer.

DISTRICT OF EAST STONEHOUSE.

A.D. 1874.

Provisional Order for partial Repeal and Alteration of Local Act.

To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of East Stonehouse, in the County of Devon; —

To the Commissioners for executing the powers and provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled “*An Act for supplying with Water the Parish or Township of East Stonehouse, in the County of Devon, and for amendment of Act;*” —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS under the powers and provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled “*An Act for supplying with Water the Parish or Township of East Stonehouse, in the County of Devon, and for amendment of Act,*” certain Commissioners were appointed to execute the said Act in the Parish and Township of East Stonehouse aforesaid, and the liberties and precincts thereof in the County of Devon;

And whereas on or about the Second day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted within the Parish of East Stonehouse;

And whereas the East Stonehouse Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of East Stonehouse, have applied to the Local Government Board to alter and amend the above-mentioned Local Act as herein-after mentioned;

And whereas, upon receipt of the said Petition, the Local Government Board directed an Inquiry to be held, and the same was held, after due notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do hereby Order and Direct that, from and after the Twenty-ninth day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order:—

I. Sections 1, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11, Sections 14 to 17 both inclusive, and Sections 19 and 38 to 42 both inclusive, of the herein-before recited Local Act shall be wholly repealed.

Provided that all matters and things commenced by the said Commissioners under the authority thereof, and not concluded on the day aforesaid, shall be continued under the same until the said Local Board shall take charge of and continue the same.

II. Sections 6, 12; 19 to 37 both inclusive, 43, 44, 45, and 46, shall be altered by the substitution therein in all places of the term “East Stonehouse Local Board” in the place and stead of the term “the Commissioners.”

III. All the jurisdiction, powers, rights, lands, hereditaments, moneys, property, effects, duties, rents, rates, penalties, debts, and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Commissioners under the said Local Act shall be transferred to the East Stonehouse Local Board.

IV. All rents, rates, assessments, penalties, or other moneys or assets due to or in the hands of the Commissioners at the date aforesaid, and hereby transferred to the said Local Board, shall be applied by the Local Board in the first place in the payment of any principal money, interest, or other debts incurred by the Commissioners and hereby transferred to the said Local Board, and then in aid of the General District Rate of the Local Government District of East Stonehouse.

V. The East Stonehouse Local Board shall pay off the sum of five thousand three hundred and fifty pounds, being the balance of a loan raised by the said Commissioners under Section 11 of the herein-before recited Local Act, and transferred to the said Local Board by this Order, together with interest thereon, by equal annual payments extended over thirty years from the date aforesaid.

*Provisional Order for dissolving the Local Government District of Gorleston
and Southtown, in the Counties of Suffolk and Norfolk.*

To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban
Sanitary District of Gorleston and Southtown, in the Counties of
Suffolk and Norfolk ;—

To the Directors and Acting Guardians of the Poor within the Hundred
of Mutford and Lothingland, in the County of Suffolk, being the
Rural Sanitary Authority for that Incorporation ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section Twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1872,
the Local Government Board are, by Provisional Order, empowered to dissolve

any Local Government District, and to merge any such District in some other Sanitary District; A.D. 1874.

And whereas, on or about the Twenty-ninth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the Local Government Act, 1858, came into force in the District of Gorleston and Southtown, in the Counties of Suffolk and Norfolk, and such District then became a Local Government District within the meaning of the above-recited Section;

And whereas part of the said Local Government District of Gorleston and Southtown was situated within the Borough of Great Yarmouth, and became from the passing of the Public Health Act, 1872, merged in the Urban Sanitary District of such Borough, of which the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of that Borough, acting by the Council, became, from the same date, the Urban Sanitary Authority;

And whereas the remaining part of the said Local Government District which adjoins the Rural Sanitary District of Mutford and Lothingland, continued on the passing of the said Act to be a Local Government District, and subject for all sanitary purposes to the jurisdiction of the Gorleston and Southtown Local Board;

And whereas it was represented to the Local Government Board that it would be desirable that so much of the said Local Government District as is now subject to the jurisdiction of the Gorleston and Southtown Local Board should be dissolved, and should be merged in the Rural Sanitary District of Mutford and Lothingland; and the Local Government Board caused a local Inquiry, of which public notice was duly given, to be made upon the subject, and have received a report thereon, and have determined that it is expedient that such dissolution should be effected:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, acting under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the Twenty-ninth day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, so much of the said Local Government District of Gorleston and Southtown as is still subject to the jurisdiction of the Gorleston and Southtown Local Board shall be dissolved, and shall be merged in the Rural Sanitary District of Mutford and Lothingland, and be subject to the jurisdiction of the Directors and Acting Guardians of that Rural Sanitary District.

DISTRICT OF HARDINGSTONE.

Provisional Order for extending the Local Government District of Hardingstone.

To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Hardingstone, in the County of Northampton;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Northampton Union, in the County of Northampton, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union;—

To the Inhabitants of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James, Dallington, in the County of Northampton, and in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section Twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1872, the Local Government Board are empowered, by Provisional Order, to declare any portion of a Rural Sanitary District immediately adjoining a Local Government District to be included in such last-mentioned District, and it is enacted, that thereupon such included portion shall, for all sanitary purposes, be deemed to form part of such last-mentioned District, and that, where any Local Government District is increased in extent under that section, the Provisional Order shall prescribe the number of members to be elected for the District when altered;

And whereas application has been made to the Local Government Board by the Hardingstone Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Hardingstone, in the County of Northampton, requesting them to incorporate with the Local Government District of Hardingstone a certain place named the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James, Dallington, in the County of Northampton, situate immediately adjoining the Local Government District of Hardingstone, and forming part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Northampton Union;

And whereas, upon receipt of the said application, the Local Government Board directed an Inquiry to be held, and the same was held, after due notice thereof, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, acting under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare that, from and after the Twenty-ninth day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, All that part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Northampton Union, known as the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James, Dallington, in the County of Northampton, shall be included in the said Local Government District of Hardingstone, and shall, for all sanitary purposes, be deemed to form part of such last-mentioned District.

And We do further Order and Direct that the number of Members to be elected for the Hardingstone Local Board shall be increased from seven to fifteen, and that the eight additional Members shall be elected in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, within two months after the said Twenty-ninth day of September, as if there were eight casual vacancies in the Local Board, and that in addition to the places of the original Members of the Local Board which will become vacant at the first annual election of Members of the Local Board after the date aforesaid, the places of three of the eight Members so elected for the first time (such places to be selected by the Local Board by lot), and at the second annual election three of the remaining five places (to be selected in like manner), and at the third annual election the two remaining places shall become vacant and be filled up; and thenceforth the proceedings at all future elections shall take place as though the number of Members for the Local Board had been originally fixed at fifteen instead of seven. A.D. 1874.

Provided that any casual vacancy in the places of these eight Members (prior to the expiration of the third year of office) shall be dealt with in like manner as in the case of casual vacancies in the places of the original Members of the Board.

BOROUGH OF KINGSTON-UPON-HULL.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Kingston-upon-Hull to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

Provisional Order for constituting the Willesden Urban Sanitary District.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Hendon Union, in the County of Middlesex, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union;—

To the Inhabitants of the Parish of Willesden, in the said Union and County;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 24 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by Provisional Order, declare any portion of any Rural Sanitary District to be an Urban Sanitary District, and that, upon such Order being confirmed by Parliament, the portion of the

District referred to therein shall become a Local Government District, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction of a Local Board; A.D. 1874.

And whereas the Parish of Willesden, in the County of Middlesex, is comprised in the Rural Sanitary District of the Hendon Union, in the County of Middlesex, and it has been represented to the Local Government Board that it is expedient that the said Parish should be constituted an Urban Sanitary District, and that a Provisional Order should be issued for that purpose;

And whereas the Local Government Board directed an Inquiry to be held on the subject, and the same was held, after due notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, acting under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare that, from and after the Twenty-ninth day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, All that part of the said Rural Sanitary District of the Hendon Union which comprises the said Parish of Willesden shall be and is hereby constituted an Urban Sanitary District within the meaning of the Public Health Act, 1872, under the name of the Willesden Urban Sanitary District, and such Urban Sanitary District shall become a Local Government District, and be subject to the jurisdiction of a Local Board.

And We do Order and Direct that the Members of the said Local Board shall consist of fifteen persons, who shall be qualified as required by the Local Government Act, 1858, and be elected in the manner prescribed by that Act, in the case where a Local Board is to be elected in a place having a known and defined boundary in which there is no Churchwarden or any Overseer.
