

CHAPTER Ixxvi.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local A.D. 1875.

Government Board relating to the Districts of Barmouth and Chiswick, the Borough of Harwich, the Districts of Heywood (two), Keighley, Northwich, and Saint Neots, and the Borough of Tiverton. [29th June 1875.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have, as regards the several districts herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, and the Public Health Act, 1872, respectively:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be The Pro- and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof Orders in shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and schedule confirmed.
- 2. This Act may be cited as "The Local Government Board's Short title. Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1875 (No. 3)."

DISTRICT OF BARMOUTH.

Provisional Order to enable the Barmouth Local Board to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

To the Barmouth Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Barmouth, in the County of Merioneth; ---

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Barmouth Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Barmouth, in the County of Merioneth, require to purchase and take certain lands and premises, which are described in the Schedule hereto annexed, for the purpose of erecting slaughter-houses thereon, and for carrying out certain works of sewerage and water supply for the said District;

And whereas the said Local Board have, after due publication in the newspaper and service of the several notices, as required by the Local Government Act, 1858, presented a petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by such Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands and premises, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement;

And whereas the Local Government Board, on receipt of the said petition, directed an inquiry to be held in the District as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of such petition, which inquiry has been held, and a report made to them thereon;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do, by this our Order, empower the Barmouth Local Board, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands and premises described in the Schedule hereto annexed, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

DISTRICT OF CHISWICK.

Provisional Order for partially repealing and altering a Local Act.

To the Commissioners for executing the powers and provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the 21st and 22nd years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for the "improvement of the Parish of Chiswick, in the County of Middlesex," and for other purposes";—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS under the powers and provisions of a Local Act of Parliament passed in the 21st and 22nd years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for the improvement of the Parish of Chiswick, in

A.D. 1875. " the County of Middlesex, and for other purposes," certain Commissioners were appointed to execute the said Act in the Parish of Chiswick, in the County of Middlesex;

And whereas the said Parish of Chiswick is an "Improvement Act District," within the meaning of the Public Health Act, 1872, and under the provisions of that Act the said District became, from the date of that Act, an Urban Sanitary District, and the said Commissioners became, from the same date, the Urban Sanitary Authority for such District;

And whereas by Section 33 of the last-mentioned Act, the Local Government Board are empowered, on the application of the Sanitary Authority of any District, by Provisional Order, wholly or partially to repeal, alter, or amend any Local Acts which relate to the same subject-matters as the Sanitary Acts, other than certain Acts specified in that section;

And whereas the Local Act above mentioned relates to the same subject-matters as the Sanitary Acts, and the said Commissioners, as such Urban Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue a Provisional Order for partially repealing and altering that Act;

And whereas, upon receipt of the said application, the Local Government Board directed an inquiry to be held, and the same was held, after due notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the 29th day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the following provisions shall take effect, viz.—

I.—Section 2 of the said Local Act shall be altered, so that the provisions contained in Sections 89 to 95, both inclusive, of the Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847, shall be no longer incorporated with the said Local Act.

II.—Sections 39 to 52 and 54 to 58, all inclusive, and Section 62 of the said Local Act, shall be repealed, except in regard to any arrears of Rates due on the said Twenty-ninth day of September, and any other matter or thing arising out of or dependent upon any of such sections and not then completed or concluded.

III.—The said Commissioners shall, in lieu of the Rates heretofore authorised to be made and levied under the said Local Act, make and levy a General District Rate within the said Parish of Chiswick, in accordance with the provisions of the law relating to the making and levying of such a Rate in an Urban Sanitary District for the time being in force, and apply such Rate to all the purposes of the said Act, and to such other purposes as shall for the time being be chargeable upon a General District Rate in an Urban Sanitary District.

IV.—All the outstanding debts and liabilities of the said Commissioners shall be charged upon and payable out of the said General District Rate so to be made and levied as aforesaid, and the provision as to the Sinking Fund contained in Section 59 of the said Local Act shall apply to the debts and liabilities so charged and payable out of the said General District Rate.

V.—All the accounts of the said Commissioners and of their officers shall be subject to the Audit of the District Auditor, in the like manner and with the

like consequences as in the case of the accounts of Local Boards under any of A.D. 1875. the provisions of the Sanitary Law.

BOROUGH OF HARWICH.

Provisional Order for partially repealing and altering a Local Act.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Harwich, in the County of Essex, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for such Borough; --

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS under the powers and provisions of a Local Act of Parliament passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for paving, cleansing, lighting, and watching the "Town of Harwich, in the County of Essex, and supplying the same with Water," certain Commissioners were appointed to execute the said Act in the Town of Harwich;

And whereas the said Commissioners borrowed the sum of seven thousand pounds, under the powers and provisions of the said Local Act, of which the sum of four thousand six hundred pounds is now due and payable, and is charged upon the rates leviable under that Act;

And whereas under and by virtue of an Act passed in the fifth and sixth years of the reign of King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to provide "for the regulation of Municipal Corporations in England and Wales," the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Harwich, acting by and herein-after called "the Council," became the Commissioners for executing the powers and provisions of the herein-before recited Local Act;

And whereas the Borough of Harwich comprises the Parish of Saint Nicholas, which is conterminous with the Town of Harwich aforesaid, and the Parish of Dovercourt;

And whereas, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, the Council, in exercise of the powers given by Section 87 of the said General Act, ordered that, from and after the date named in their Order, a certain part of the said Parish of Dovercourt should be taken to be within the provisions of the said Local Act for the lighting of the same;

And whereas the Council incurred a certain debt amounting to one hundred pounds to defray the cost of lighting such part of the Parish of Dovercourt;

And whereas, on the passing of the Public Health Act, 1872, the Borough of Harwich became, under Section 4 of that Act, an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of that Borough, acting by the Council, became the Urban Sanitary Authority;

A.D. 1875. And whereas the Council, as such Urban Sanitary Authority, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue a Provisional Order under Section 33 of the last-mentioned Act, for partially repealing and altering the herein-before recited Local Act, as herein mentioned, and for providing better means for the recovery of the duties on coal and culm payable under such Local Act;

And whereas, upon receipt of such application, the Local Government Board directed an Inquiry to be held, and the same was held, after due notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the twenty-ninth day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order,—

- I.—Sections 1 to 10, 12, 14, 15, 18, 20 to 22, 26 to 54, 58, 62 to 74, 76, 77, 79, 80, 82 to 84, all inclusive, of the said Local Act, shall be wholly repealed, except so far as the same shall have been acted upon, and so far as it may be necessary to continue the same for the purpose of enabling the Council to recover all rates due under the said Local Act on the said twenty-ninth day of September.
- II.—The proportion of the rates and assessments fixed by Section 23 of the said Local Act to be borne and defrayed by the tenants and occupiers shall not be levied upon, or payable by, such tenants or occupiers unless and until the full proportion of such rates and assessments by the same Section fixed to be borne and defrayed by the owners or landlords, together with the coal duties payable under the said Local Act, shall be found to be insufficient for the purposes of such Act and of any Provisional Order amending the same, in which case the powers and provisions of the said Section shall be and remain in full force; and the Council may from time to time make rates and assessments in manner provided by Section 16 of the said Local Act for any sum or sums of money to the amount of the proportion of the said rates and assessments fixed by the said Section 23, to be borne and paid by the owners or landlords, and shall have power to recover the same under Section 19 of the said Local Act; and the tenants or occupiers shall be entitled to deduct and retain all moneys which shall be paid by them in respect of the rates and assessments so made out of the rents payable by them to the owners or landlords, by whom the same shall be allowed and be borne and defrayed.
- III.—Every person or company who shall import, land, or otherwise bring in or deliver any coal or culm within the limits of the said Town, or who, under the provisions of the said Local Act, may become liable to pay the said rate or duty on such coal or culm, shall, within twenty-four hours of such coal or culm being imported, landed, brought in, or delivered at or within the limits of the said Town, give notice thereof in writing to the Treasurer of the Borough of Harwich, stating by whom such coal or culm has been imported, landed, brought in, or delivered, and to whom such coal or culm belongs or is consigned, and the quantity thereof; and in default of such notice being given, every person and company importing, landing, bringing in, or delivering such coal or culm, and not giving such notice as aforesaid, shall for each default made by him or them

subject, according to the provisions contained in Section 81 of the said Act, A.D. 1875. to a penalty not exceeding double the rate or duty payable on the said coal or culm, or not exceeding forty shillings, as the Justices before whom the proceedings shall be taken shall in each case determine.

IV.—Section 57 of the said Local Act shall be extended so as to apply to trucks, carts, and other carriages, as well as to ships and vessels.

V.—The power conferred by Section 75 of the said Local Act for borrowing money on the security of the rates therein referred to shall be extended, so as to enable the said Council, as such Urban Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, to borrow such sum or sums as may be required to pay off the present securities for the sum of four thousand six hundred pounds, together with the interest due thereon, and to enable the said Council to repay the money so to be borrowed under this Order by not more than fifty equal annual instalments.

VI.—The Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Harwich shall divide their District into two parts, one part to comprise that portion of the Parish of Dovercourt so added to the Town of Harwich for lighting purposes as aforesaid, and the other to comprise the remainder of the said Borough, and shall make a separate assessment upon the first part for the purpose of levying and making a rate annually in the nature of a Borough Rate, but not exceeding the sum of threepence in the pound, to defray the said debt of one hundred pounds with the interest from time to time accruing thereon, together with the necessary expenses to be incurred in levying, making, and recovering such rate, the first assessment to be made as soon as convenient after the said Twenty-ninth day of September.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the District of Heywood to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Heywood, in the County of Lancaster; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Heywood Local Board, as the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Heywood, in the County of Lancaster, require to purchase and take certain lands and premises situate within their District, and which are described in the Schedule hereto annexed, for the purpose of widening and otherwise improving certain streets and roads in the said District;

And whereas the said Local Board have made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices as required by the Local Government Act, 1858, and have presented a petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands and premises, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement;

And whereas, upon receipt of such petition, the Local Government Board directed an inquiry to be held in the District in which the lands and premises are situate, as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said petition, which inquiry has been held and report duly made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do, by this our Order, empower the Heywood Local Board, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands and premises described in the Schedule hereto annexed, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

DISTRICT OF HEYWOOD.

Provisional Order for amending a Local Act.

To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Heywood, in the County of Lancaster;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 33 of the Public Health Act, 1872, the Local Government Board are empowered, on the application of the Sanitary Authority of any District, by Provisional Order, wholly or partially to repeal, alter, or amend any Local Acts other than certain Acts specified in that Section, which relate to the same subject-matters as the Sanitary Acts;

And whereas by Section 111 of the Heywood Improvement Act, 1867, the Local Board for the Local Government District of Heywood, in the County of Lancaster, are empowered to purchase by agreement any lands and erect thereon a Town Hall and Offices and other public buildings, but no provision is made therein to enable the said Local Board to raise money to enable them to carry these purposes into effect;

And whereas from the date of the first-mentioned Act the said Local Government District of Heywood became an Urban Sanitary District, and the said Local Board became the Urban Sanitary Authority thereof;

And whereas the last-mentioned Act is a Local Act which relates to the same subject-matters as the Sanitary Acts, and the said Local Board, as such Urban Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, have applied to the Local Government Board to amend the said Local Act so as to enable them to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary for carrying out the provisions of Section 111 above recited;

And whereas the Local Government Board, upon receipt of such application, directed an inquiry to be held, and the same was held, after due notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the Twenty-ninth day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the said Local Act shall be amended, and it shall be lawful for the Heywood Local Board, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, to borrow, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the above Section, such sum or sums of money as may from time to time be requisite and shall be approved by the Local Government Board, such loans to be obtained subject to the like conditions and restrictions as loans obtained under the provisions of the Sanitary Law.

DISTRICT OF KEIGHLEY.

Provisional Order for extending the Keighley Local Government District, and the provisions of certain Local Acts.

To the Local Board of Health, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Keighley, in the West Riding of the County of York;—

To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Bingley, in the said Riding; --

To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Oakworth, in the said Riding; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section Twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1872, the Local Government Board are empowered, by Provisional Order, to declare any portion of a Local Government District immediately adjoining a Local Government District to be included in such last-mentioned District, and it is enacted, that thereupon such included portion shall, for all sanitary purposes, be deemed to form part of such last-mentioned District, and that where any Local Government District is increased in extent under that Section, the Provisional Order shall prescribe the number of members to be elected for the District when altered;

And whereas by Section Thirty-three of the Public Health Act, 1872, the Local Government Board are empowered, on the application of the Sanitary Authority of any District, by Provisional Order, wholly or partially to repeal, alter, or amend any Local Acts, other than certain Acts specified in that Section, which relate to the same subject-matters as the Sanitary Acts;

And whereas by Section Sixteen of the Sanitary Law Amendment Act, 1874, the Local Covernment Board, when applied to by a Sanitary Authority for

the alteration or amendment of any Local Act under Section Thirty-three above recited, are empowered to extend, by Provisional Order, the provisions of any Local Act therein referred to beyond the boundaries of the District comprised therein;

And whereas the provisions of the Local Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto are in force within the Local Government District of Keighley, in the West Riding of the County of York, and relate to certain subject-matters, the same as are provided for by the Sanitary Acts;

And whereas the Keighley Local Board of Health, as the Sanitary Authority for the said Local Government District, have applied to the Local Government Board to extend their District by incorporating therewith those parts of the Local Government Districts of Bingley and Oakworth, both in the said West Riding, which are described in the First Schedule hereto annexed, and to alter the said Local Acts by extending the provisions thereof as herein mentioned;

And whereas the parts of the said Local Government Districts of Bingley and Oakworth proposed to be incorporated with the Local Government District of Keighley are situated immediately adjoining thereto;

And whereas, upon receipt of the said application, the Local Government Board directed inquiry to be held on the subject, and the same was held after due notice thereof, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare that, from and after the Twenty-ninth day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, All those parts of the Local Government Districts of Bingley and Oakworth which are described in the first Schedule hereto annexed shall be separated from the said Districts respectively, and shall be included in the Local Government District of Keighley, and shall thenceforth, for all sanitary purposes, form part of such last-mentioned District.

And We do Order that, from and after the date aforesaid,-

I.—The number of members to be elected for the Keighley Local Board shall remain and be the same as before the date of this Order.

II.—The provisions of the several Local Acts mentioned in the second part of the Schedule hereto annexed, so far as they relate to the present Local Government District of Keighley, shall be extended beyond the boundaries of the District comprised in such Local Acts, and shall apply to and be in force within the whole of the Local Government District of Keighley as hereby extended.

All that part of the Local Government District of Bingley comprised within a line commencing at the point situate in the old watercourse of the River Aire, and distant about one chain from the northerly side of the road leading from Dalton to Marley and Bingley, where the boundary between the Townships of Bingley and Morton joins the boundary between the Parish of Keighley and the Parish of Bingley; and proceeding thence in a south-easterly direction along the first-mentioned boundary to a point in the said old watercourse opposite to the extreme north-easterly corner of a close, called "Willow Holme," now or

lately belonging to Joseph Craven and occupied by William Wilkinson; thence in a south-westerly, south-easterly, southerly, and south-westerly direction along the easterly fence of the said "Willow Holme" to its point of junction with the northerly fence of the said road from Dalton to Marley; and thence in a westerly direction along the north side of the said road to a point distant about four chains ten links east of the north-east corner (abutting upon the said road) of a close, called "Clay Butts and Cote Ing," now or lately belonging to the said Joseph Craven and occupied by the said William Wilkinson; thence southerly in a straight line across the said road and through lands belonging to William Ferrand to the extreme south-east corner of the said close, called "Clay Butts and Cote Ing," and westerly along the north fence of the Midland Railway to the point where such fence crosses the boundary between the Parishes of Keighley and Bingley; thence in a north-easterly and northerly direction along the last-named boundary to the starting point.

2ndly. All that part of the Local Government District of Oakworth comprised within a line commencing at the point where the boundary of the Keighley Local Government District crosses the north side of the road leading from the bridge over the River Worth, at Dalton, and running thence in an easterly direction along the north side of the said road, and including it, to the old bed or watercourse of the River Aire, and thence along the centre of the said old bed to the point of junction of the boundary lines between the Townships of Bingley, Keighley, and Morton; thence southerly along the said boundary lines between the said Townships of Bingley and Keighley to the south side of the footpath commencing at "Thwaites House," and in a westerly direction along the south side of the said footpath, and including it, to the highway leading to Thwaites Brow; thence across the said highway to a point on the south side of Thwaites main street where it meets the boundary of the Keighley Local Government District, but so as not to include any building or part of a building on the south side of the said main street; thence in a northerly direction along the said boundary to the starting point.

Provisional Order for dissolving the Local Government Districts of Northwich and Witton-cum-Twambrooks, and for other purposes.

- To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Northwich, in the County of Chester; —
- To the Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Witton-cum-Twambrooks, in the said County; —
- To the Inhabitants of the Townships of Castle Northwich, Hartford, Leftwich, and Winnington, all in the said County; —
- To the Guardians of the Poor of the Northwich Union, in the said County, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union; ---

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 22 of the Public Health Act, 1872, the Local Government Board are, by Provisional Order, empowered to dissolve any Local Government District, and to merge any such District in some other Sanitary District, and it is enacted that any Order made in pursuance of that section may provide for the settlement of any differences, or the adjustment of any accounts or apportionment of any liabilities arising between Districts, Parishes, or other Places, in consequence of the exercise of any powers conferred by that section, and may direct the persons by whom and to whom any moneys found to be due are to be paid, and the mode of raising such moneys;

And whereas on or about the Twenty-fifth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the Local Government Act, 1858, came into force in the Township of Northwich, in the County of Chester, in the Northwich Union, and such Township became a Local Government District within the meaning of the above-recited section;

And whereas certain market buildings have been purchased, and a new Market House and other buildings have been erected in the said Local Government District, in respect whereof certain debts have been incurred by the Northwich Local Board;

And whereas on or about the Seventeenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the Local Government Act, 1858, came into force in the Township of Witton-cum-Twambrooks, in the said County and Union, and such Township became a Local Government District within the meaning of the above-recited section;

And whereas certain works of street improvement have been executed in the Local Government District of Witton-cum-Twambrooks, in respect whereof a debt of two hundred and forty-eight pounds ten shillings has been incurred by the Witton-cum-Twambrooks Local Board;

And whereas it was represented to the Local Government Board that it would be desirable to dissolve the said Local Government Districts, and to merge them in the Rural Sanitary District of the Northwich Union; and the Local Government Board caused local inquiries, of which public notice was duly given, to be made upon the subject, and report has been made to them

thereon, and they have determined that it is expedient that such dissolution A.D. 1875. should be effected:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the Twenty-ninth day of September next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the Local Government Districts of Northwich and Witton-cum-Twambrooks shall be dissolved, and shall be merged in the Rural Sanitary District of the Northwich Union, and be subject to the jurisdiction of the Guardians of the Poor of that Union, as the Sanitary Authority for such Rural Sanitary District.

And whereas by Section 24 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by Provisional Order, declare any portion of any Rural Sanitary District to be an Urban Sanitary District, and that, upon such Order being confirmed by Parliament, the portion of the District referred to therein shall become a Local Government District, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction of a Local Board;

And whereas by Section 15 of the Sanitary Law Amendment Act, 1874, it is enacted that when the Local Government Board form an Urban Sanitary District under Section 24 above recited, they may, by the Order constituting the District, if they see fit, divide the District into Wards for the election of members of the Local Board;

And whereas from and after the date aforesaid the said Local Government Districts will, for the purposes of the Sanitary Acts, be merged in and form part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Northwich Union;

And whereas the Townships of Castle Northwich, Hartford, Leftwich, and Winnington, all in the County of Chester, are comprised in the said Rural Sanitary District;

And whereas certain works for the supply of water have been executed in the Township of Castle Northwich, in respect whereof certain debts were incurred by the Sewer Authority of that Township;

And whereas it is expedient that that part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Northwich Union which comprises the said Townships of Northwich, Wittoncum-Twambrooks, Castle Northwich, and the parts of the Townships of Hartford, Leftwich, and Winnington described in the Schedule hereto annexed, shall be constituted an Urban Sanitary District, and that such District be divided into Wards as herein mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare that, from and after the First day of October next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, All that part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Northwich Union which comprises the Townships of Northwich, Witton-cum-Twambrooks, Castle Northwich, and the parts of the Townships of Hartford, Leftwich, and Winnington described in the Schedule hereto annexed, shall be, and is hereby constituted an Urban Sanitary District within the meaning of the Public Health Act, 1872, under the name of the Northwich Urban Sanitary District, and that such Urban Sanitary District shall become a Local Government District, and be subject to the jurisdiction of a Local Board.

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Provided that the Guardians of the Poor of the Northwich Union, acting as the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union, shall continue to act for the said Urban Sanitary District in all respects as if this Order were not made until the first meeting of the Local Board to be elected for the said District.

And We do hereby Order that,

I.--The Northwich Urban Sanitary District, when constituted as aforesaid, shall for the purposes of the Election of a Local Board be divided into three Wards to be termed the Witton Ward, the Northwich Ward, and the Castle Ward respectively.

II.—The Witton Ward shall consist of the Township of Witton-cum-Twambrooks, the Northwich Ward shall consist of the Township of Northwich, and so much of the Township of Leftwich as is described in the Schedule hereto annexed, and the Castle Ward shall consist of the Township of Castle Northwich and so much of the Townships of Hartford and Winnington as is described in the Schedule hereto.

III.—The members of the said Local Board shall consist of eighteen persons, who shall be qualified as required, and be elected in the manner prescribed, by the law in force for the time being for the election of members of a Local Board, in the case where such Board is to be elected in a place having a known and defined boundary in which there is no Churchwarden or any Overseer.

Provided that the notice for the first election of members shall be published within one calendar month next following the said First day of October, and the members first elected, and any member elected to fill a casual vacancy among the members first elected, shall hold their or his office respectively as if they or he had been first elected at an annual election in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

IV.—One-third of the members of the Local Board for the said Local Government District shall be elected by the Witton Ward, one-third by the Northwich Ward, and the remaining third by the Castle Ward.

V.—From and after the date of the first meeting of the Local Board to be elected for the Northwich Urban Sanitary District, all the powers, rights, duties, lands, tenements, hereditaments, moneys, properties, works, debts, liabilities, and obligations, including so much of the said debts respectively as may be due at the date of the constitution of the said Urban Sanitary District, belonging to, exerciseable by, or attaching to, the Local Boards for the Local Government Districts hereby dissolved, and the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Northwich Union, on behalf of the Township of Castle Northwich, shall be transferred to the Local Board to be elected for such Urban Sanitary District, and the said debts shall be charged equally and uniformly upon the General District Rate of the said Urban Sanitary District.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

A.D. 1875.

1st. All that part of the Township of Hartford which lies to the north and east of a line drawn from the boundary line separating the Townships of Hartford and Winnington at the top of Burrows Hill to the north end of the west fence of the Nursery Ground occupied by William Owen, and along such last-named fence to the north side of the West Cheshire Railway; thence southerly across such last-named railway and south-easterly along and including the same to a brook flowing south; thence south-easterly along and including such brook to and along the fence dividing a field belonging to Colonel Marshall from a field belonging to Allan Royle, thence south-easterly along the boundary fence dividing "The Cloughs" belonging to the trustees of the River Weaver from a field belonging to Colonel Marshall as far as the River Weaver, and thence to the boundary line between the Townships of Hartford and Leftwich in the centre of the said River Weaver, together with such further part of the Township of Hartford as is situate north of the turnpike road from Northwich to Chester, west of the Township of Castle Northwich, south of the Township of Winnington, and east of such part of the Township of Winnington as is included in the Ecclesiastical Parish or District of St. John, Hartford.

2ndly. All that part of the Township of Leftwich which lies on the east and south sides of the original and natural course or channel of the River Weaver, on the west side of the River Dane, and on the west side of a line drawn from the centre of such last-mentioned river to and along a fence which separates land belonging to and occupied by William Worthington from land belonging to the said William Worthington, in the occupation of Thomas Middleton, so far as the fence of the shrubbery outside the wall of the garden of and in the occupation of the said William Worthington, and round the said fence of the said shrubbery to and along the north side of the approach road to the farm of the said William Worthington, occupied by the said Thomas Middleton, as far as the east side of the highway leading from Northwich to Middlewich; thence across the said highway along the west side of and excluding such last-mentioned highway and on the east side of Dobell's Lane to its termination; and from thence on the easterly side of the fence of a certain field in the Township of Leftwich in the occupation of Joseph Dobell so far as the centre line of the said River Weaver.

3rdly. All that part of the Township of Winnington which lies on the east side of a line drawn from the west end of a Quay belonging to the Trustees of the River Weaver, and across the towing-path of the said River Weaver to the north end of a fence separating certain lands and premises of the Trustees of the River Weaver from certain lands in Winnington aforesaid of Messrs. Brunner, Mond, & Co., and thence southerly along the last-mentioned fence to the point where it joins the west fence of the Winnington branch of the Cheshire Lines Committee; thence westerly along such last-mentioned fence to the point where it joins the west fence of Winnington Park; thence easterly and southerly along the fence of Winnington Park to the east side of the high road leading from Northwich to Warrington; thence northerly along and including such high road to a point opposite the north end of the boundary fence of the dwelling-house and premises belonging to and occupied by William Sutton Bradburn; thence along such last-named boundary fence to a fence separating a parcel of land commonly called "The Lay" from another parcel of land commonly called "The Further Holdings Moss," both belonging to and

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occupied by James Morton; then south-westerly along such last-mentioned fence to the boundary line separating the Township of Winnington and Castle Northwich, together with all such other part of the Township of Winnington as is comprised in the Parish of the Ecclesiastical District of St. John, Hartford, in the County of Chester.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the District of Saint Neots to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

To the Saint Neots Improvement Commissioners, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Saint Neots, in the County of Huntingdon;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Saint Neots Improvement Commissioners, as the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Saint Neots, in the County of Huntingdon, require to purchase and take the lands, easements, rights, and premises which are described in the Schedule hereto annexed, for the purpose of constructing thereon works for the sewerage and water-supply of the said District;

And whereas the said Commissioners have made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices as required by the Local Government Act, 1858, and have presented a petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands, easements, rights, and premises, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement;

And whereas, upon receipt of such petition, the Local Government Board directed an inquiry to be held in the District as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said petition, which inquiry has been held and report duly made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do, by this our Order, empower the Saint Neots Improvement Commissioners, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands, easements, rights, and premises described in the Schedule hereto annexed, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, as extended by the Sanitary Law Amendment Act, 1874, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

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- 1. A plot of ground containing two acres or thereabouts, being part of Saint Neots Common, situate in the Parish of Saint Neots, in the County of Huntingdon, and belonging to the Saint Neots Common Proprietors, and occupied by them or their tenants or lessees.
- 2. Part of Saint Neots Common aforesaid, required for a foot and carriage way to the plot of ground first described.
- 3. An easement or right to lay and maintain a main sewer across Saint Neots Common.
- 4. An easement or right to lay and maintain a main outfall drain across Saint Neots Common.
- 5. An easement or right to lay and maintain a main outfall drain under the public road leading from Saint Neots to Little Paxton.
- 6. An easement or right to lay and maintain a main outfall drain under or through the abutments and waterway of the bridge over the overfall or backwater channel at the Paper Mills.
- 7. An easement or right to lay and maintain a main outfall drain under a field belonging to George Wm. Rowley, and occupied by Thomas Edey.
- 8. A plot of land containing one quarter of an acre, or thereabouts, being part of a field called "Coney-Gear," in the parish of Eynesbury, in the county of Huntingdon, belonging to Alexander Peppercorn, and occupied by Samuel Marshall.
- 9. An easement or right to lay and maintain a main pipe across the field called "Coney Gear" aforesaid, and a right of foot and carriage way over the same.
- 10. An easement or right to lay and maintain a main pipe under the public streets in the village of Eynesbury.

Provisional Order for dissolving the Tiverton Improvement Act District.

- To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Tiverton, in the County of Devon, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough;—
- To the Commissioners for executing the powers and provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for paving and "otherwise improving the Town of Tiverton, in the County of Devon," and of another Act of Parliament passed in the Third year of the reign

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of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for amending and enlarging the powers and provisions of an Act of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act for 'paving and otherwise improving the Town of Tiverton, in the County 'of Devon,' and for lighting the said Town;"—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS under the powers and provisions of a Local Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for paving and otherwise improving the Town of "Tiverton, in the County of Devon," and of another Act of Parliament passed in the Third year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for amending and enlarging the powers and provisions of an "Act of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act for paving "and otherwise improving the Town of Tiverton, in the County of Devon,' and "for lighting the said Town," certain Commissioners were appointed to execute the said Acts in the Town of Tiverton;

And whereas the District for which the said Commissioners acted was an Improvement Act District within the meaning of the Public Health Act, 1872;

And whereas the Borough of Tiverton, which comprises within its area the whole of the said Improvement Act District, became, under the provisions of Section Four, and from the date of the last-mentioned Act, an Urban Sanitary District, of whom the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of that Borough, acting by the Council, became, from the same date, the Urban Sanitary Authority;

And whereas by Section Twenty-two of the last-mentioned Act, it is enacted that in the case of a Borough comprising within its area the whole of an Improvement Act District, the Local Government Board may, by Provisional Order, dissolve such District, and transfer to the Council of the Borough the jurisdiction and powers of the Improvement Commissioners of such District;

And whereas the said Urban Sanitary Authority have applied to the Local Government Board to issue a Provisional Order to dissolve the District of the said Commissioners, and to transfer their jurisdiction and powers to the said Authority;

And whereas, upon receipt of the said application, the Local Government Board directed an inquiry to be held, and the same was held, after due notice, and report has been made to them thereon;

And whereas it appears to the Local Government Board expedient that the said District should be dissolved, and that all the powers now vested in the said Commissioners should be transferred as aforesaid:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the Thirty-first day of December next following the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the following provisions shall take effect, viz.:—

I.—The said Improvement Act District shall be dissolved, and all the A.D. 1875. jurisdiction, powers, rights, lands, hereditaments, tenements, moneys, property, effects, and liabilities vested in or now attaching to the said Commissioners under the said Local Acts shall be transferred to the Council of the Borough of Tiverton, and the name of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of that Borough, acting by the Council, as the Urban Sanitary Authority thereof, shall be substituted throughout the said several Acts in the place of the said Commissioners: Provided always, that all matters and things commenced by the Commissioners under the authority of the said Local Acts, and not then concluded, shall be continued by them under the same until the Council shall take charge of and continue the same.

II.—The liability for the whole of the debts incurred by the Commissioners, and then outstanding, shall be transferred to the said Council, who shall make provision for the liquidation of the same out of the Borough Fund or Rate of the said Borough within the term of thirty years from the date aforesaid.

III.—For the purpose of liquidating any debts charged by the said Commissioners upon the rates, tolls, or other funds under their control, the said Council may from time to time, if they see fit, borrow the requisite amount, and charge the Borough Fund or Rate with the repayment thereof within the period aforesaid.
