An Act for more effectually widening and improving the Road from *Wells* to *Highbridge*, with a Road thereout to *Cheddar*, all in the County of *Somerset*. [21st June 1841.]

WHEREAS the Road leading from the City of *Wells* to the Turnpike Road from *Bristol* to *Bridgwater*, at or near *Highbridge* in the Parish of *Burnham*, and also the Road branching out of such first-mentioned Road at or near a Place called *Port Elm* otherwise *Port Way Elm*, in the Out-Parish of *Saint Cuthbert* in *Wells* aforesaid, to the *Wedmore* Turnpike Road in the Parish of *Cheddar*, all in the County of *Somerset*, are much out of repair, and incommodious for the passing of Waggon, Carts, and Carriages: And whereas it would be of great Benefit to the Inhabitants and Occupiers of Property in the several Parishes and Places aforesaid, and to the Public at large, if the said Roads were widened, improved, maintained, and made Turnpike; but the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in

this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That all Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the Time being acting for the County of *Somerset*, the Mayor and Justices of the City of *Wells* for the Time being, together with *Edward Wright Band Clerk, Samuel Birch, John Cripps, Francis Keball Dean, William Edwards, Sand; Robert Phippen Edwards, Peter Fry, Cheddar Street, Axbridge; John Fry, Joseph Giles, James Garrod, Thomas Gilling, John Gilling, John Glanvile, John Hardwich, James Brock Keel, George Keel, John Kempthorne Clerk, George Lax, John Lax, Joseph Lovell Lovell, Edward Lovell, Edwin Lovell, Thomas Lax, Edward Norman, Northload; George Barons Northcote the younger, William Benjamin Naish, Arthur Phippen, Jeremiah Dewdney Parsons, John Belfour Plowman, Joseph Ruscombe Poole, Gabriel Stone Poole, William Reeve, Edward Greville Ruddock Clerk, Benjamin Tyley, William Thorpe Clerk, Daniel Tremlett Clerk, the Honourable and Reverend Lord John Thynne, William White Clerk, Joseph Wollen, Edward Nicklin Wells*, and their Successors, being duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in *England*, shall be Trustees for putting this Act into execution.

Power to ap-
point addi-
tional Trus-
tees.

II. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, at any Meeting under this Act, to elect any Number of Persons, duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in *England*, not exceeding Three in the whole, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, in addition to the Trustees hereby nominated; and such Trustees so elected shall have the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been hereby appointed.

First Meet-
ing of Trus-
tees.

III. And be it enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold their First Meeting at the *George Inn* in the Parish of *Wedmore* in the said County of *Somerset*, or at some other convenient Place in the Neighbourhood of the said Roads, upon the Day of the Commencement of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, and shall then, and from Time to Time thereafter, adjourn to and meet at such Times, and at such Places in the Neighbourhood of the said Roads, as they shall think proper.

Power to
appoint
Committees.

IV. And be it enacted, That the said Trustees may appoint Committees out of their own Number to take the Care and Management of any particular Part of the said Roads, or to execute any of the other Purposes of this Act, according to such Instructions and Regulations as shall be laid down by the said Trustees at any General Meeting; and the said Committees and their Surveyors may proceed and act according to such Appointment, but shall always be accountable according to the Instructions and Regulations so to be made.

Roads to

V. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be put in execution for the Purpose of widening, improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair the Road commencing at or near the Western End of
High

High Street, in the In-Parish of *Saint Cuthbert* in the City of *Wells*, and passing from, through, or into the said In-Parish of *Saint Cuthbert* in the said City of *Wells*, and the Out-Parish of *Saint Cuthbert* in *Wells* aforesaid, and the Parishes, Townships, or Extra-parochial Places of *Wookey*, *Meare*, *Wedmore*, *Mark*, *East Brent*, *Burnham*, *Brean*, and *Huntspill*, and terminating in the said Turnpike Road from *Bristol* to *Bridgwater* at or near the End of the Highway called *Wabrow Lane* at *Highbridge* aforesaid, and also the Road branching out of the said Road by this Act intended to be made Turnpike, commencing at or near a Place called *Port Elm* otherwise *Port Way Elm* in the said Out-Parish of *Saint Cuthbert*, and passing from, through, or into the said In-Parish and Out-Parish of *Saint Cuthbert* in *Wells*, and *Wookey* aforesaid, and the Parishes, Townships, or Extra-parochial Places of *Westbury*, *Rodney Stoke*, *Nylandcum-Batcombe*, and terminating in the Parish of *Cheddar* at or near the Turnpike Road called the *Wedmore* Turnpike Road, between the Town of *Axbridge* and the Village of *Cheddar*, all in the said County of *Somerset*.

VI. And whereas a Map or Plan describing the Line of the said Roads, and the Lands through which the same are intended to be made, together with a Book of Reference thereto, containing a List of the Names of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, has been deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of *Somerset*; be it therefore enacted, That the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County, to the end that all Persons may at all seasonable Times inspect and peruse the same, and have Copies thereof or Extracts therefrom, paying to the said Clerk of the Peace the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts; and the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference, or any Copy thereof respectively or of any Part thereof respectively, certified by the said Clerk of the Peace or his Deputy for the Time being to be a true Copy thereof, shall be good Evidence in all Courts of Law or elsewhere.

Map or Plan deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace to remain there and be open to Inspection.

VII. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to widen and improve the said Roads herein-before described in the Line and through the Lands delineated in the Map or Plan and described in the Book of Reference herein-before mentioned, of such Width as they may think proper, not exceeding Sixty Feet, together with such Footpaths, Bridges, Embankments, Ditches, Drains, Fences, and other necessary Works upon or near thereto as they may think requisite, and for the Purposes aforesaid to take possession of the Lands and Premises described in the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference, making Satisfaction for the same to the Owners thereof, and other Persons interested therein, for the Damage which such Owners or other Persons may respectively sustain thereby; and it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and for their Surveyors and Workmen, from Time to Time to enter upon the said several Lands, and to stake out the same, for the Purposes

Power to widen and improve Roads according to Plan.

Purposes of this Act, at such Times and in such Manner as the said Trustees or Surveyors shall think necessary or expedient.

Trustees empowered to deviate from Plan to an Extent not exceeding 100 Yards.

VIII. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, in widening and improving the said Roads, to deviate from the Line delineated upon the said Map or Plan: Provided always, that no such Deviation shall extend to a greater Distance than One hundred Yards from the said Line, or into the Lands of any Person not described in the said Map or Plan, or in the said Book of Reference, without the Consent in Writing of the Party in or through whose Lands any such Deviation shall be proposed to be made.

Lands marked on the Plan may be used, notwithstanding Errors in the Book of Reference or Schedule.

IX. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to widen and improve the said Roads in the Line or through the Lands delineated upon the said Map or Plan, although such Lands, or the Situation thereof, or the Names of the Owners or Occupiers thereof, may happen to be omitted, mis-stated, or erroneously described in this Act, or in the Schedule thereto, or in the said Map or Plan, or in the said Book of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the said County of *Somerset*, in Petty Sessions assembled, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Omission or Mis-statement proceeded from Mistake; and the Certificate of the said Justices shall be deposited with and remain in the Custody of the said Clerk of the Peace for the Time being.

The Freehold and Inheritance of Lands to remain and be vested in the Persons of whom they are purchased.

X. And be it enacted, That when any Lands shall be purchased by the said Trustees for the Purpose of widening or improving the said Roads, the Freehold and Inheritance in the Lands so purchased in case the same shall be of Freehold Tenure, and in case the same shall be of any other Tenure the Estate and Interest therein, shall not, (notwithstanding any Provisions in any of the Acts in force for regulating Turnpike Roads in *England*;) by means of any such Purchase, or any Conveyance or Assurance made in pursuance thereof, be vested in the said Trustees, but such Freehold and Inheritance, or the Estate and Interest in such Lands, shall, notwithstanding such Purchase and Conveyance or Assurance, remain and be vested in the Persons in whom the same were vested immediately prior to such Purchase by the said Trustees; and the said Trustees shall, by means of such Purchase and Conveyance or Assurance, be entitled to a perpetual Right of Way in, over, or upon the Lands so purchased by them.

The Right of Way to cease when Lands are not wanted.

XI. Provided always, and be it enacted, That if at any Time any Land purchased by the said Trustees under the Authority of this Act shall not be wanted for the Purposes thereof, and the Road for which the same was purchased shall cease to be an Highway, then the Right of Way in or over the said Lands shall cease and be extinguished; and the Freehold and Inheritance in the said Lands in case the same shall be of Freehold Tenure, and the Estate and

Interest in such Lands in case the same shall be of any other Tenure, shall be and remain in the Persons then entitled to the same, freed and discharged from such Right of Way.

XII. Provided also, and be it enacted, That the said Trustees shall have the same Power and Authority of cutting, digging, and using the Lands taken by them for the Purposes of this Act as the said Trustees would have had in case they had purchased the Fee Simple or the whole Estate and Interest in the said Lands.

Trustees to have the same Power of digging as if they had purchased the Fee Simple.

XIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That the Powers and Authorities given by this Act shall not authorize the said Trustees to take or pull down, or to use or injure, any Dwelling House or other Building, or to take, use, or injure any Curtilage, Orchard, Garden, Yard, Park, Paddock, Lawn, Shrubbery, planted Walk or Avenue to a House, or any inclosed Ground planted and set apart as a Nursery for Trees, or any Part thereof respectively, (except such as are mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed,) without the previous Consent in Writing of the Owner or Proprietor thereof, and all other Persons interested therein.

Trustees restrained from pulling down Houses not in Schedule.

XIV. Provided also, and be it enacted, That in case the said Trustees shall not, within the Space of Three Years from the Commencement of this Act, pay for the Lands which they are by this Act authorized to take, then and from thenceforth all the Powers by this Act or by any other Act granted in relation to the taking of Lands for the Purposes of Turnpike Roads shall, so far as relate to the Lands herein-before authorized to be taken for the Purposes of this Act, cease and be utterly void, unless with the Consent of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands respectively.

Limiting the Time for purchasing Property,

XV. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to demand and take, at the several and respective Toll Gates or Toll Bars which shall by virtue of this Act be upon, across, or on the Sides of the said Roads, the following Tolls; (that is to say,)

Power to take Tolls,

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Carriage, any Sum not exceeding Four-pence :

Tolls,

For every Horse or other Beast (not drawing), laden or unladen, any Sum not exceeding One Penny :

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, any Sum not exceeding Five-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

For every Drove of Calves, Swine, Sheep, or Lambs, any Sum not exceeding Two-pence Halfpenny *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

For every Carriage propelled or drawn by Steam, or other Power than Animal Power, any Sum not exceeding Two Shillings :

And for every Dog drawing any Cart, Carriage, or other Vehicle, any Sum not exceeding Two-pence :

Which said Tolls shall be taken before any Horse, Ass, Beast, or other

other Cattle or Carriage whatsoever shall be permitted to pass through any Toll Gate or Bar which shall be by virtue of this Act upon or across the said Roads or on the Sides thereof.

Fraction of a Halfpenny in Tolls.

XVI. And be it enacted, That in all Cases in which there shall be a fractional Part of a Halfpenny in the Amount of the Tolls by this Act authorized to be collected the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be payable in lieu of such fractional Part.

Only One Toll to be payable on Roads.

XVII. And be it enacted, That no more than Two Tolls on the Road from *Wells* to *Highbridge*, nor more than One Toll on the Road from *Port Way Elm* to *Cheddar*, shall be taken for passing and repassing once only in the same Day (to be computed from Twelve of the Clock at Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next succeeding Night) with the same Horses, Beasts, Cattle, or other Animal or Thing liable to Toll or Duty, through all the Toll Gates or Bars to be erected on each of the said Roads.

Persons having paid Toll to return Toll-free.

XVIII. And be it enacted, That all Horses and Cattle (except Horses or Cattle drawing any Stage Coach, Waggon, or other Stage Carriage as herein-after mentioned) in respect whereof the Toll hereby authorized to be taken shall have been paid at any Toll Gate or Bar on either of the said Roads, or on the Sides thereof, shall, upon a Ticket denoting such Payment being produced, be permitted, in returning through the same Toll Gate or Bar, and in going and returning through such other Gate or Bar (if any) as the Ticket for such Payment shall free, to pass Toll-free the same Day.

Post Chaises to pay every Time of passing with fresh Hiring.

XIX. Provided always, and be it enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for all Horses or Cattle drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage travelling for Hire as often as a new Hiring shall take place, in the same Manner as if no previous Payment of Toll in respect of such Horses or Cattle had been made on the same Day.

Regulations as to Stage Coaches, &c.

XX. And be it enacted, That all Horses and Cattle drawing any Stage Coach, Waggon, or other Stage Carriage conveying Passengers or Goods for Hire or Reward, and any Carriage propelled or drawn by Steam or any other Power than Animal Power, in respect whereof the Toll hereby authorized to be taken shall have been paid at any Toll Gate or Bar, shall, upon a Ticket denoting such Payment being produced, be permitted to pass once Toll-free on the same Day through any other Gate or Bar which such Ticket would free in the Case of Horses or Cattle drawing any other Carriage; and no further or additional Toll shall be payable in respect of the Horses or Cattle drawing any Stage Coach or other such Carriage as aforesaid at any Toll Gate or Bar, the Payment at which shall be freed by such Ticket as aforesaid, on account only of their conveying other Passengers, or of the Horses or Cattle drawing the same having been changed.

XXI. And

XXI. And be it enacted, That between the First Day of *November* in every Year and the First Day of *April* in the next succeeding Year there shall be payable at each Toll Gate or Toll Bar Double the Toll hereby payable for every Horse, Mule, or other Beast of Draught drawing any Waggon or other Carriage employed in carrying any Hop Poles, Use Poles, Timber, or Wood.

Timber, &c. to pay Double Toll between 1st of November and 1st of April.

XXII. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, at any Meeting to be specially called for the Purpose, to make an Order from Time to Time that the Tolls payable by virtue of this Act for any Horse or Beast drawing any Waggon, Cart, or other Carriage, laden only with Lime or Chalk for the Improvement of Land, or returning unladen or empty from having been so employed, shall be reduced to such other Tolls as the said Trustees shall at any such Meeting agree or determine; and after the making of any such Order such reduced Tolls only shall, in respect of the Matters last-mentioned, be payable.

Trustees may reduce the Tolls on Lime or Chalk for Manure.

XXIII. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to order and cause to be set up, in, upon, or across the said Roads, or on the Sides thereof, any Toll Gate or Bar, and to remove the same, as they shall think proper.

Respecting Toll Gates.

XXIV. And be it enacted, That all Monies which shall be received by the said Trustees on or in respect of the Lines of Road authorized by this Act to be widened and improved shall be applied, in the first place, in discharging the Expences of obtaining and passing this Act, or otherwise incident thereto; secondly, in widening, improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair the said Roads, and in putting this Act into execution with reference thereto; thirdly, in paying and discharging any Interest which may from Time to Time become due and be owing in respect of any Money which may hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls to be collected on the said Roads; and lastly, in reducing, paying off, and discharging any Principal Sums of Money which may be due on the Credit of the Tolls to be taken on the said Lines of Road by this Act authorized to be widened and improved.

Application of Monies.

XXV. And be it enacted, That no more Money shall be expended in the Repair of either of the Roads comprised in this Act than shall be collected on such Road, or borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls collected thereon.

No more Money to be laid out, &c. than taken on any Road.

XXVI. And be it enacted, That no Money shall be laid out on either of the said Roads within the Limits of any Act of Parliament passed for the Improvement of any Town, nor shall any Toll be collected therein.

No Tolls to be taken or Money laid out in Towns.

XXVII. And whereas a Portion of the said Road from *Wells* to *Highbridge* forms Part of the Road authorized to be repaired under and by virtue of an Act passed in the Eighth Year of the Reign of

His Majesty King *George* the Fourth, intituled *An Act for making and maintaining a Road from Chappel's Corner in the Parish of Ashcott to join the Bristol Turnpike Road at or near Rowberrow Hill, all in the County of Somerset*, and the Erection of any Turnpike Gate thereon, whereat to demand and take Toll, would be very prejudicial to the Public travelling on the said Road from *Chappel's Corner* to *Rowberrow Hill*; be it therefore enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Trustees for executing this Act, and the Trustees for executing the said Act of the Eighth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King *George* the Fourth, at any of their Meetings, to enter into an Agreement in respect of the Expence of repairing and maintaining the said Portion of the said Road, and for the exempting from Toll Horses, Cattle, and Carriages passing upon the same, upon such Terms and Conditions, and in such Manner and Form, as the said respective Trustees shall think just and right; and only in the event of the Trustees for executing the said Act of the Eighth Year of the Reign of His said Majesty neglecting or refusing to pay a fair Equivalent of the Expence of repairing and maintaining the said Portion of the said Road shall it be lawful for the Trustees for executing this Act to collect any Toll thereon: Provided always, that such Agreement shall be made and entered into at a Meeting of the Trustees for executing the said Act of the Eighth Year of the Reign of His said Majesty, of which Meeting Fourteen Days Notice shall be given in a Newspaper of the said County of *Somerset*, and affixed upon the Toll Gates erected upon the said *Chappel's Corner* and *Rowberrow Hill* Road; of the Time and Place of holding such Meeting, and that such Agreement is intended to be made thereat.

Trustee or

XXVIII. And be it enacted, That no Trustee or Clerk acting under the Authority of this Act, if not otherwise interested, shall be deemed incompetent to give Evidence, or shall be disqualified from giving Evidence, in any Action, Suit, or other Proceeding brought by or against him in such his Capacity of Trustee or Clerk, by reason of his being Plaintiff or Defendant in such Action, Suit, or Proceeding.

Roads not to
be exempt
from any
general Act.

XXIX. And be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall be deemed to exempt the Roads comprised in this Act from the Provisions of any general Act relating to the Consolidation or other improved Arrangement of Turnpike Roads which may pass during the present or any future Session of Parliament.

Term of Act.

XXX. And be it enacted, That this Act shall commence on the Third *Monday* next after the passing thereof, and shall continue in force for the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the Session of Parliament which shall then next follow.

Construction
of certain

XXXI. And be it enacted, That in construing this Act Words importing the Singular Number shall be understood to include the Plural Number, and Words importing the Plural Number shall

be understood to include the Singular Number; and the Word "Person" shall be understood to include Corporation; and Words importing the Masculine Gender shall be understood to include Females as well as Males; and the Word "Lands" shall be understood to include Messuages, Tenements, and Hereditaments; unless in any of the Cases aforesaid there be something in the Subject or Context repugnant to such Construction.

XXXII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed to be Public Act. a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such.
