1879 CHAPTER cxciv 42 and 43 Vict

2 Power of verderers to allow cattle of strangers to depasture in forest.

The verderers may in their discretion allow cattle and other animals belonging [^{F1}to commoners in excess of the number they are entitled to depasture by virtue of their rights of common or belonging] to persons not being commoners, but being owners or occupiers of land adjacent to or abutting on the forest, to depasture in the forest . . . ^{F2}

Any moneys payable to the verderers under or in pursuance of this Act may be recovered by them either as debts or in manner in which they are empowered under the ^{M1}New Forest Act 1877 to recover moneys leviable by them under that Act.

Any fines and moneys received by the verderers under or in pursuance of this Act shall be carried by them to the account of the general fund established under the New Forest Act 1877 and applied accordingly.

A person depasturing cattle or other animals in the forest in pursuance of this Act shall not thereby acquire any right of common or other right in, to, or out of the forest.
