An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Education A.D. 1880.

WHEREAS the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education have made a Provisional Order under the authority of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, on behalf of the 33 & 34 Vict. School Board for London, and it is requisite that the same should c. 75. be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. The following Order shall be and is hereby confirmed, and Confirmation from and after the passing of this Act shall have full validity and of Order. force.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Education Department Pro- Short title. visional Order Confirmation Act (London), 1880.

### THE SCHOOL BOARD FOR LONDON.

Provisional Order for putting in force the Lands Clauses
Consolidation Act, 1845.

At the Council Chamber, the 25th day of June 1880.
