CHAPTER lix.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Amersham, Ashby-de-la-Zouch, and Basford Unions, the Borough of Chard, the Local Government District of Croydon, the Borough of Cheltenham, the Rural Sanitary District of the Hendon Union, the Local Government Districts of Hornsey and Leyton, the City of Lincoln, the Borough of Plymouth, the Local Government District of Redditch, the Rural Sanitary District of the Shardlow Union, and the Local Board of Health District of Woolwich. A.D. 1880.

[19th July 1880.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have, as regards the districts, boroughs, and city herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875:

38 & 39 Vict.
c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provision herein contained should be enacted as regards one of such districts:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. The Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. Whereas by a Provisional Order of the General Board of Health, dated the twenty-first day of May one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, which was duly confirmed by the Public Health Supplemental Act, 1852, (No. 2,) in this section called

Special provisions as regards the Local Board of Health District of Woolwich.
15 & 16 Vict. c. 69.

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A.D. 1880. "the Supplemental Act," the Public Health Act, 1848, was applied
11 & 12 Vict. c. 63. to the parish of Woolwich, and by section eight of the Supplemental,
11 & 12 Vict. c. 63. Act it was enacted that the Supplemental Act should be deemed to
11 & 12 Vict. c. 63. be incorporated with the Public Health Act, 1848, and should be
as if the Supplemental Act and the Public Health Act, 1848, were
one Act :

And whereas the Supplemental Act is still in force in the said
parish of Woolwich :

38 & 39 Vict. c. 55. And whereas by section three hundred and forty-three of the
11 & 12 Vict. c. 63. Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health Act, 1848, the Local
21 & 22 Vict. c. 98. Government Act, 1858, the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867, and
30 & 31 Vict. c. 113. certain Acts amending the same, were wholly repealed, and in
consequence of such repeal doubts have arisen whether those Acts
are still in force in the said parish of Woolwich :

11 & 12 Vict. c. 63. It is hereby declared that the Public Health Act, 1848, the
21 & 22 Vict. c. 98. Local Government Act, 1858, the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867,
30 & 31 Vict. c. 113. and the several Acts amending the same, so far as those Acts were
38 & 39 Vict. c. 55. in force in the parish of Woolwich immediately prior to the passing
of the Public Health Act, 1875, shall be deemed to have remained
38 & 39 Vict. c. 55. and to continue in force in that parish, anything in the Public
Health Act, 1875, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Short title. **3.** This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's
