

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local A.D. 1884. Government Board relating to the City and County of Bristol, the Cities of Carlisle and Coventry, the Local Government District of Northwich, the Borough of Preston, the Rural Sanitary District of the Taunton Union, and the Borough of Warrington. [7th August 1884.]

TATHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Pro-VV visional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875:

38 & 39 Vict.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be c. 55. confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the The Orders same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from in schedule and after the dates therein respectively mentioned, have full validity and force.

2. And whereas the London and North-western Railway Com- Special pany require to widen and improve their London and Birmingham Railway where the same passes by the side of Whitley Common, the Coventry and to enlarge their depôt at that place: And whereas it would be greatly for the advantage of the urban sanitary authority for the city of Coventry that they should be empowered to construct and use a bridge across the railway for foot passengers and vehicles to connect their present cemetery and the proposed new cemetery; therefore be it enacted, that the urban sanitary authority may sell and convey to the company so much of the said common not exceeding one acre as the company may require for the said

Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1884.

A.D. 1884. purposes, and the London and North-western Railway Company in consideration of such sale and conveyance may sell and convey to the urban sanitary authority, for the purpose of enlarging their proposed new cemetery and providing additional means of access thereto, all or any part of certain land belonging to the railway company in the parish of Saint Michael, Coventry, on the south side of their said railway and lying between such railway and the said common, together with the right or easement of constructing and using a bridge both for foot passengers and vehicles over the said railway between the present cemetery and the said proposed new cemetery.

3. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1884.

CITY AND COUNTY OF BRISTOL.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the City and County of Bristol to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the City of Bristol, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the City and County of Bristol;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the City of Bristol, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the City and County of Bristol, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto, for the following purposes, viz.:

1. The lands mentioned in Part I. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of widening, altering, and improving White Ladies Road, in the said City and County.

2. The lands mentioned in Part II. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of making a new street from Pembroke Vale to Worcester Villas, in the said City and County.

- 3. The lands mentioned in Part III. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of widening and improving the Hotwell Road between Dowry Square and Gloucester Terrace, in the said City and County.
- 4. The lands mentioned in Part IV. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving Highbury Place and making a new street from Saint Michael's Park to Woodland Road, Tyndalls Park, in the said City and County.
- 5. The lands mentioned in Part V. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving Lower Maudlin Street, Lewins Mead, Bridewell Street, and Rupert Street, in the said City and County.
- 6. The lands mentioned in Part VI. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving Richmond Road, Montpelier, in the said City and County.
- 7. The lands mentioned in Part VII. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving East Street and Mill Lane, Bedminster, in the said City and County.
- 8. The lands mentioned in Part VIII. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving part of Redcliff Mead Lane, in the said City and County.
- 9. The lands mentioned in Part IX. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving Redcliff Street, in the said City and County.
- 10. The lands mentioned in Part X. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving Thunderbolt Street, the Broad Quay, and Marsh Street, in the said City and County.
- 11. The lands mentioned in Part XI. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving Leek Lane, York Street, and Philadelphia Street, in the said City and County.
- 12. The lands mentioned in Part XII. of the said Schedule, for the purpose of altering, widening, and improving Leadhouse Lane and Lawrence Hill, in the said City and County:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Urban Sanitary Authority from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the continuance of any existing public rights of highway, and for the purposes aforesaid, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.
