



CHAPTER xlvii.

An Act to amend an Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth entitled
“ An Act for the Management and Direction of the
“ Hospital founded by Joseph Barrington and his sons in
“ the city of Limerick.” [25th June 1885.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the eleventh year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth entitled “ An Act for the Management and Direction of the Hospital founded by Joseph Barrington and his sons in the city of Limerick ” and such Act is in this Act called “ the said Act ”:

And whereas the said Act recites that Joseph Barrington and his sons therein mentioned had purchased ground and had erected at their sole expense a hospital in the city of Limerick for the use of the poor to be called Barrington's Hospital:

And whereas by the said Act it was enacted that the bishop of the diocese of Limerick the rector of the parish in which the hospital is situate the mayor of the city of Limerick the representative in Parliament for the city of Limerick the president of the Chamber of Commerce for the time being of Limerick all for the time being should be ex-officio governors of the said hospital:

And whereas it is expedient that the Roman Catholic bishop of the diocese of Limerick for the time being and the Roman Catholic parish priest of the parish of Saint Mary's in the city of Limerick for the time being shall be ex-officio governors of the said hospital:

And whereas the object aforesaid cannot be effected without the authority of Parliament:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

A.D. 1885. 1. This Act may be cited as Barrington's Hospital Amendment
Short title. Act 1885.

Ex-officio 2. In addition to the governors constituted by the said Act the
Governors. Roman Catholic bishop of the diocese of Limerick for the time
being and the Roman Catholic parish priest of the parish of Saint
Mary's in the city of Limerick for the time being shall be and
remain and are declared to be ex-officio governors of Barrington's
Hospital and City of Limerick Infirmary.
