



## CHAPTER xxi.

An Act to confirm certain Orders of the Local Government Board under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, relating to the Parishes of Ashburnham (two), Brightling, Catsfield, Dallington (two), Hartwell, Ninfield, Stoke Mandeville, and Warbleton.      A.D. 1886.  
[4th June 1886.]

**W**HEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879:      39 & 40 Vict. c. 61.

And whereas the said Orders have become provisional, and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament:      42 & 43 Vict. c. 54.

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing the date of this Act.      The Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Poor Law) (No. 3) Act, 1886.      Short title of the Act.

### BATTLE UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Battle Union, in the County of Sussex ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of Ashburnham, Brightling, and Dallington, in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of Divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Ashburnham, Brightling, and Dallington are included in the said Battle Union ;

And whereas the said Parish of Dallington is divided so that certain parts thereof, which are described in Column 1 of the schedule to this Order, are isolated and detached from the remainder ; and a proposal having been made that each of the said parts should be separated from that parish and be amalgamated with some parish which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, we caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above mentioned, and report has been made to us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid parts should be separated from the Parish of Dallington, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in Column 2 of the said schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with section 4 of the Act first above mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District ;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the statutes in that behalf, We hereby order as follows :—

ARTICLE I. The several isolated and detached parts of the Parish of Dallington, which are described in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order, shall respectively cease to be parts of that Parish, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Parish which is named in Column 2 opposite to the description of such part.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of Ashburnham, Catsfield, and Dallington, in the said Battle Union ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of Ninfield and Warbleton, in the said Hailsham Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of Divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Ashburnham, Catsfield, and Dallington are included in the said Battle Union, and the said Parishes of Ninfield and Warbleton are included in the said Hailsham Union ;

And whereas the several Parishes named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided Parishes within the meaning of the said Acts, certain parts thereof which are described in Column 2 being either isolated and detached or nearly detached from the remainder ;

And whereas a proposal having been made that each of the said parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some adjoining Parish, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in Column 3 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby order as follows :—

ARTICLE I. The several isolated and detached or nearly detached parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Parishes named in Column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of those Parishes, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Parish which is named in Column 3 opposite to the description of such part.

ARTICLE II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

And whereas a proposal having been made that certain parts of the said Parish of Stoke Mandeville which are isolated and detached from the remainder, and are bounded by the Parishes of Aylesbury with Walton, and Hartwell, should be separated from the said Parish of Stoke Mandeville and be amalgamated with some adjoining Parish, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above mentioned, and report has been made to us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid isolated and detached parts of the said Parish of Stoke Mandeville should be separated therefrom, and be amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish of Hartwell, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District ;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the statutes in that behalf, We hereby order as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—All the aforesaid isolated and detached parts of the said Parish of Stoke Mandeville shall cease to be parts of that Parish, and shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Hartwell.

ARTICLE II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.
