



CHAPTER xxii.

An Act to confirm certain Orders of the Local Government Board under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, relating to the Parishes of Blandford - Saint - Mary, Bryanston, Charlton - Adam, Charlton - Mackrell, Compton - Dundon, King - Weston, Llangynog, Llanrhaidr - yn - Mochnant (Montgomery), Llanrhaidr-yn-Mochnant (Denbigh), Pennant, Pimperne, Steepleton Preston, Tarrant-Keynston, Tarrant-Rushton, Turnworth, Winterborne - Clenston, and Winterborne-Stickland. [4th June 1886.] A.D. 1886.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879 :

And whereas the said Orders have become provisional, and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing the date of this Act.

BLANDFORD UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Blandford Union, in the County of Dorset ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of Blandford Saint Mary, Bryanston, Pimperne, Steepleton Preston, Tarrant Keynston, Tarrant Rushton, Turnworth, Winterborne Clenston, and Winterborne Stickland, in the said Blandford Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board are empowered to deal by Order with parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Blandford Saint Mary, Bryanston, Pimperne, Steepleton Preston, Tarrant Keynston, Tarrant Rushton, Turnworth, Winterborne Clenston, and Winterborne Stickland are included in the said Blandford Union ;

And whereas the several Parishes named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided Parishes, each of the parts thereof which is described in Column 2 being isolated and detached from the remainder, or situate on one side of a river while the residue of the Parish is on the other side of such river, or otherwise so situate as to render the relief of the Poor in, or the local government of, such parts in conjunction with the residue of the Parish inconvenient ; and a proposal having been made that each of the said parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some Parish which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in Column 3 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Article I. The several parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Parishes named in Column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of those Parishes, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Parish which is named in Column 3 opposite to the description of such part.

Article II. This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

LANGPORT UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Langport Union, in the County of
Somerset ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of
Charlton Adam, Charlton Mackrell, Compton Dundon, and King
Weston, in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law
Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879,
We, the Local Government Board are empowered to deal by Order with parts
of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Charlton Adam, Charlton Mackrell, Compton
Dundon, and King Weston are included in the said Langport Union ;

And whereas the said Parish of Charlton Adam is divided into several parts
which are isolated and detached from each other, and one of such parts is so
situated that a portion thereof (described in paragraph (a) below), is nearly
detached from the remainder thereof (described in paragraph (b) below) :—

(a) All that portion of the isolated and detached part adjoining the Parishes
of Compton Dundon, King Weston, Butleigh, and Somerton, which consists
of the allotments numbered 735 to 744, both inclusive, on the plan attached
to the Award of the parishes of Charlton Adam and Charlton Mackrell,
dated the year 1809 ;

(b) All the remaining portion of the said isolated and detached part adjoining
the said Parishes of Compton Dundon, King Weston, Butleigh, and
Somerton ;

And whereas a proposal having been made that each of the said parts of the
said Parish of Charlton Adam should be amalgamated with some adjoining
Parish, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to
be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above mentioned,
and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that the said part of the said Parish of Charlton
Adam described in paragraph (a) above should be amalgamated with the said
Parish of Compton Dundon, which it adjoins ; that the part of the said Parish
of Charlton Adam described in paragraph (b) above should be amalgamated with
the said parish of King Weston, which such part adjoins ; and that all the
remaining parts of the said Parish of Charlton Adam should be amalgamated
with the said Parish of Charlton Mackrell, which such parts adjoin ; and the
Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with

Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District: A.D. 1886.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:

Article I. All the aforesaid part of the said Parish of Charlton Adam described in paragraph (a) above shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Compton Dundon.

Article II. All the aforesaid part of the said Parish of Charlton Adam described in paragraph (b) above shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of King Weston.

Article III. All the remaining parts of the said Parish of Charlton Adam shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Charlton Mackrell.

Article IV. This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

LLANFYLLIN UNION.

Llangynog,
&c. Order.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Llanfyllin Union, in the Counties of Montgomery and Denbigh ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parishes of Pennant and Llangynog, of the Parish of Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Montgomery, and of the Parish of Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Denbigh, all in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of divided parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Pennant, Llangynog, Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Montgomery, and Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Denbigh, are included in the said Llanfyllin Union ;

And whereas the said Parish of Pennant is a divided Parish within the meaning of the said Acts, the under-mentioned parts thereof being isolated and detached or nearly detached from the remainder, namely :—

(a.) All that isolated and detached part known as Pennant Upper, and adjoining, amongst other Parishes, the Parishes of Hirnant and Llangynog ;

(b.) All that isolated and detached part which is situated in the County of Denbigh, and contains 59 acres or thereabouts and is bounded by the

Parishes of Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Montgomery,
and Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Denbigh ;

- (c.) All that nearly detached part known as the Township of Cornorion, being that part of the Parish of Pennant which is situate to the south of the middle of the River Nant Pen-y-garnedd, and which separates the detached part of the Parish of Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Montgomery, from the main part of that parish ;

And whereas a proposal having been made that the said parts of the said Parish of Pennant should be separated from that Parish and be amalgamated with some adjoining Parish, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above cited, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that the said parts of the said Parish of Pennant should be separated therefrom, and that the part described in paragraph (a.) above should be amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish of Llangynog ; that the part described in paragraph (b.) above should be amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish of Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Denbigh ; and that the part described in paragraph (c.) above should be amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish of Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Montgomery ; and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above cited, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Article I.—All that part of the said Parish of Pennant described in paragraph (a.) above shall cease to be part of that Parish, and shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Llangynog.

Article II.—All that part of the said Parish of Pennant described in paragraph (b.) above shall cease to be part of that Parish, and shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Denbigh.

Article III.—All that part of the said Parish of Pennant described in paragraph (c.) above shall cease to be part of that Parish, and shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Llanrhaidr yn Mochnant, in the County of Montgomery.

Article IV.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.
