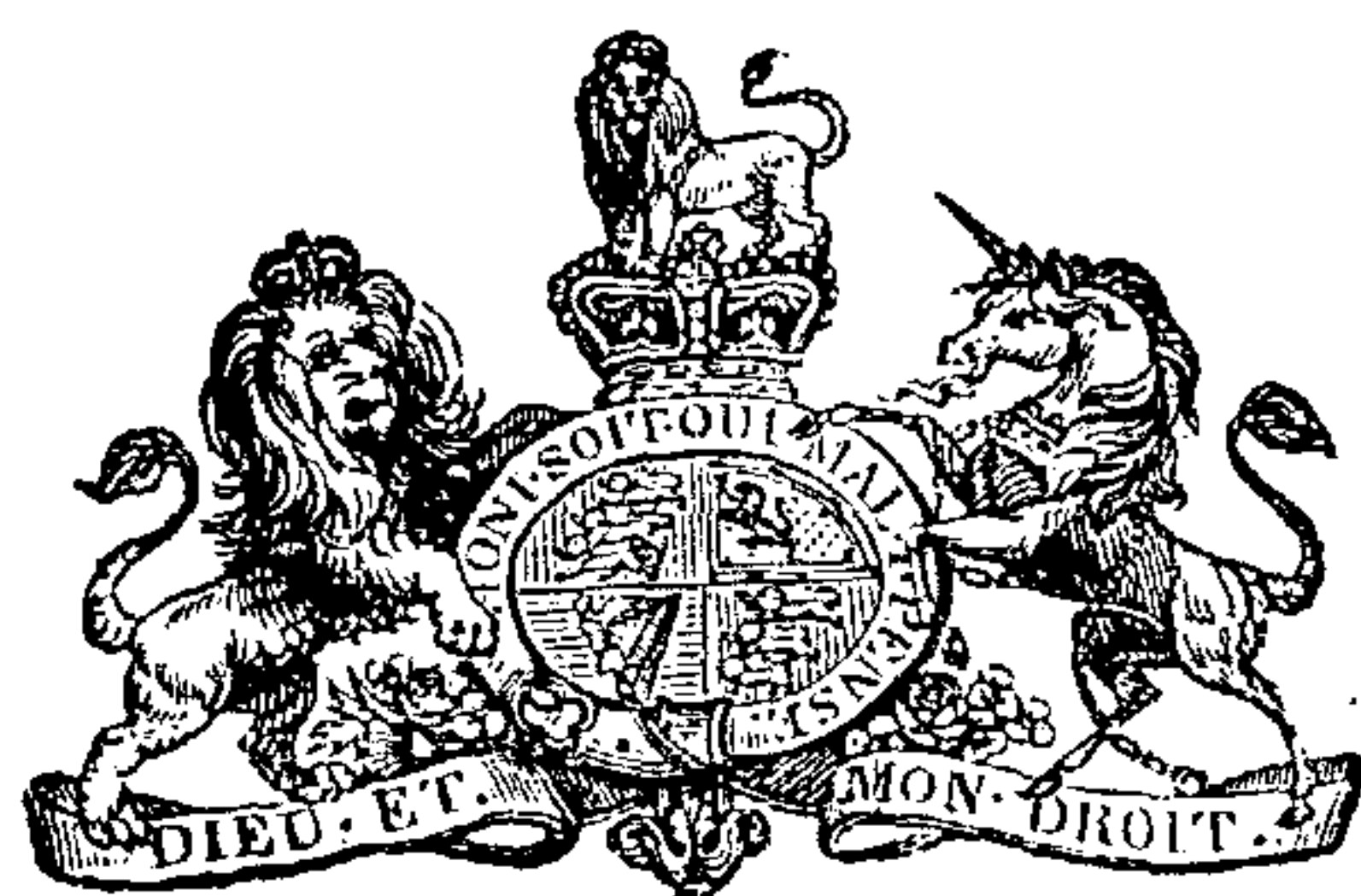

**CHAPTER xxiii.**

An Act to confirm certain Orders of the Local Government Board under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, relating to the Parishes of Beaumont, Crosby-upon-Eden, Saint-Cuthbert's-Without (Carlisle), and Stanwix; and to the Townships of Cassop, East Heddon, Fawdon, Newburn, Newburn-Hall, Quar-  
rington, South-Gosforth, Throckley, and Wallbottle.

**W**HEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879:

And whereas the said Orders have become provisional, and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing the date of this Act.

CARLISLE UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Carlisle Union, in the County of Cumberland ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of Beaumont, Crosby upon Eden, Saint Cuthbert's Without (Carlisle), and Stanwix, in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of divided parishes, and in certain cases to deal with areas for highway purposes ;

And whereas the said parishes of Beaumont, Crosby upon Eden, Saint Cuthbert's Without (Carlisle), and Stanwix are included in the said Carlisle Union ;

And whereas the several Parishes named in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided Parishes within the meaning of the said Acts, the parts thereof, which are described in column 2, being either isolated and detached or nearly detached from the remainder, or being on one side while the residue of the Parish is on the other side of a river ;

And whereas each of the said parts respectively is included in the separate Highway Parish named in column 4 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part ;

And whereas a proposal having been made that each of the aforesaid parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some adjoining Parish, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in column 3 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangements may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Article I. The several parts described in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Parishes named in column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of those Parishes, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Parish which is named in column 3 opposite to the description of such part.

Article II. The said several parts shall cease to be parts of the separate Highway Parishes named in column 4 of the said Schedule, and each of such parts shall be included in the separate Highway Parish named in column 5 opposite to the description of such part.

Article III. This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships of East Heddon, Fawdon, Newburn, Newburn Hall, South Gosforth, Throckley, and Wallbottle, in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and detached parts of divided parishes ;

And whereas the said Townships of East Heddon, Fawdon, Newburn, Newburn Hall, South Gosforth, Throckley, and Wallbottle are included in the said Castle Ward Union ; and the said Townships are Parishes within the meaning of the said Acts ;

And whereas the several Townships named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided so that parts thereof, which are described in Column 2, are isolated and detached from the remainder ; and a proposal having been made that each of the said isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Township to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some Parish or Township which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Township to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Township named in Column 3 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District ;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Article I.—The several isolated and detached parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Townships named in Column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of those Townships, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Township which is named in Column 3, opposite to the description of such part.

Article II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law  
Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879,  
We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of  
divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Townships of Cassop and Quarrington are included in the said Durham Union ;

And whereas the said Township of Cassop is divided into two parts which are isolated and detached from each other, and a proposal having been made that each of the said parts of the said Township should be amalgamated with some adjoining township, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that the said parts of the said Township of Cassop should be amalgamated with the said Township of Quarrington, which they adjoin, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District ;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us, by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :

Article I. All the parts of the said Township of Cassop shall be amalgamated with the said Township of Quarrington ; and the said Township of Quarrington, as so altered, shall be designated the Township of Cassop-cum-Quarrington.

Article II. This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.
