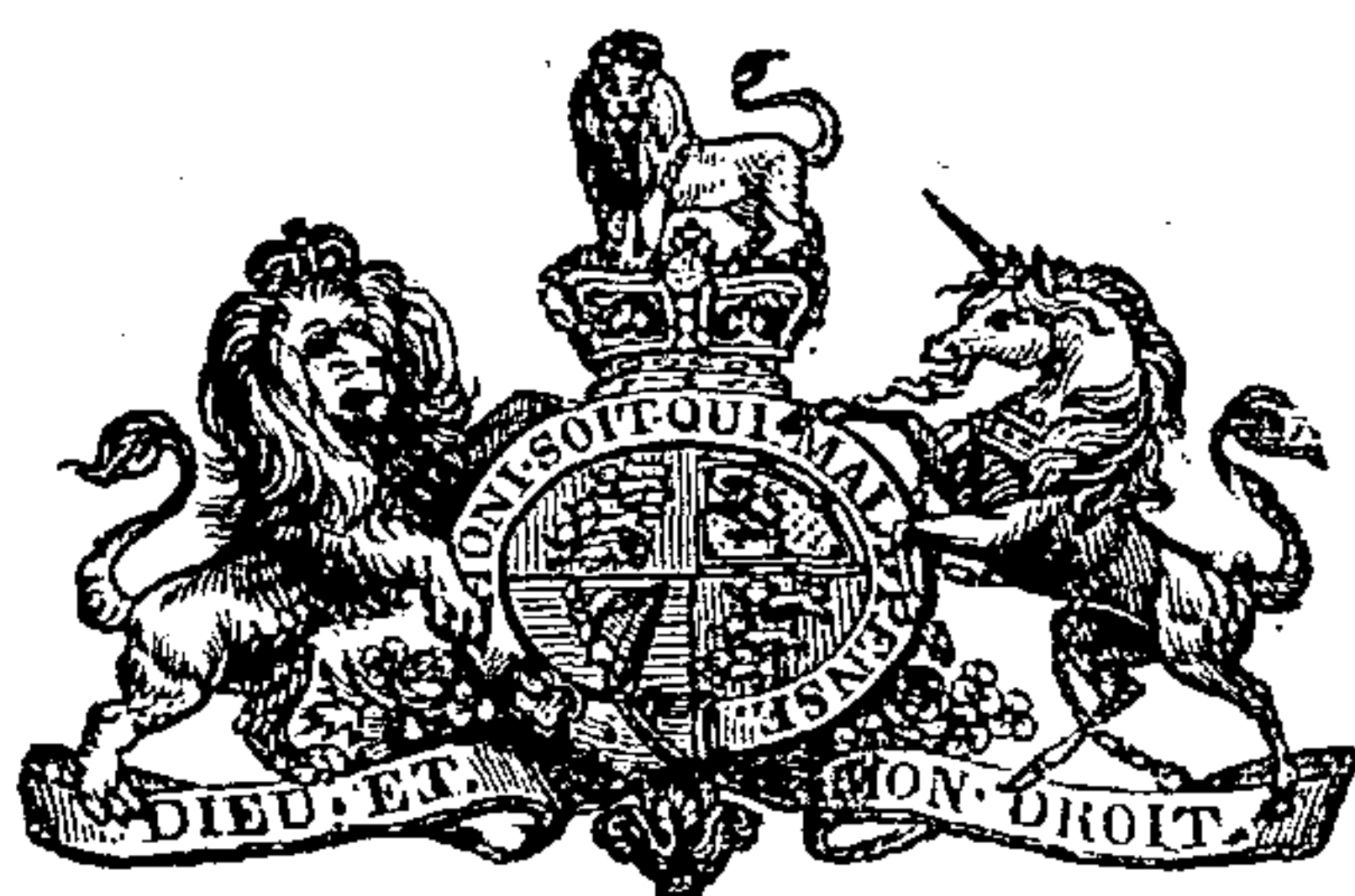

CHAPTER liv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board for Ireland relating to Dromore West and Kilrush Unions. A.D. 1886.  
[25th June 1886.]

**W**HEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland have, as regards the above-named places, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed, under the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878 :

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereunto annexed shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. The Provisional Orders in Schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board (Ireland) Provisional Orders Confirmation (Dromore West and Kilrush) Act, 1886. Short title.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the Dromore West Union, being the Burial Board for the District consisting of the said Union, have, at a special meeting duly convened in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, section 172, determined that a Burial Ground shall be provided for the said District, and are about to take the lands herein-after described for the purpose of forming such Burial Ground, and have presented a petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, praying that they may be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, with reference to the said lands :

And whereas the said lands are not nearer than one hundred yards to any dwelling-house :

And whereas all advertisements and notices required by the said Act having been previously published, served, and given, the Local Government Board for Ireland has caused a local inquiry to be held as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said petition, and it appears to the said Board to be proper to assent thereto :

It is ordered by the Local Government Board for Ireland as follows :

Compulsory  
powers to take  
lands.

1. From and after the time of the confirmation of this Order by Parliament, the Guardians of the Poor of the Dromore West Union, acting as the Burial Board of the district consisting of the said union, shall be empowered to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, with reference to that part of the townland of Aderavoher, in the barony of Tireragh, and county of Sligo, containing two acres and four perches, statute measure, or thereabouts, and bounded on the north by the fair green of Rosslea and Mr. Mullen's land, on the east by the public road leading from Dromore West to Easky, and on the south and west by another part of the said lands of Aderavoher, and delineated on a plan of the said proposed burial ground deposited with the said petition at the office of the Local Government Board for Ireland in Dublin.

2. In this Order the expression "the Lands Clauses Acts" means the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, as the same is amended by the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860, the Railways Act (Ireland), 1851, the Railways Act (Ireland), 1860, the Railways Act (Ireland), 1864, and the Railways Traverse Act. Interpretation of terms.
3. The powers of compulsory purchase given by this Order shall not be exercised after the expiration of three years from the time of the confirmation of this Order by Parliament. Duration of compulsory powers.
4. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as the Easky Burial Ground Provisional Order, 1886. Short title of Order.

WHEREAS there are in the town of Kilrush, in the County Clare, Town Commissioners elected under the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854.

And whereas the number of the inhabitants of the said town being less than six thousand, the said Commissioners have presented a petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland, in pursuance of the provisions of the seventh section of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, praying for a Provisional Order to separate the said town from the rural sanitary district consisting of the Kilrush Poor Law Union, wherein the said town is situate, and to constitute the said town an urban sanitary district :

And whereas public notice of the purport of the proposed Order has been duly given by advertisement, in the manner provided by the said Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and the Guardians of the Poor of the Kilrush Union have passed a resolution approving of the proposed Order :

And whereas the Local Government Board for Ireland have considered the matter of the said petition, and it appears to the said Board to be proper to comply with the prayer thereof :

Order.

It is ordered by the Local Government Board for Ireland as follows :

1. From and after the time when this Order shall be confirmed by Act of Parliament, the said town of Kilrush shall be separated from the rural sanitary district consisting of the Kilrush Poor Law Union, and thenceforth the said town of Kilrush shall be constituted an urban sanitary district, subject to all the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and of the Public Health (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879, and of all other Acts of Parliament affecting urban sanitary districts.
2. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as the Town of Kilrush Provisional Order, 1886.
