An Act for repairing and maintaining several Roads leading from the Town of *Bromyard* in the County of *Hereford*, and other Roads adjoining thereto in the said County and in the County of *Worcester*, and for making several new Lines of Road connected therewith in the same Counties.

[30th *June* 1842.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Second Year of the Reign of His Majesty King *George* the Fourth, intituled *An Act for repairing and maintaining several Roads leading from the Town of Bromyard in the County of Hereford, and other Roads adjoining thereto in the said County and in the County of Worcester*: And whereas considerable Sums of Money have been advanced upon the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by the said Act, which Money still remains owing, together with an Arrear of Interest thereon, and such Money cannot be paid off or the Interest thereof discharged, nor can the said Roads be effectually improved and kept in repair, unless further Powers are granted and the Term of the said Act further continued: And whereas it will be

of great public Utility and Convenience if the following Highways or Lines of Roads, namely, the Parish Carriage Highway, commencing at the *Worcester* Turnpike Road upon *Bromyard Down* in the Township of *Linton*, and branching thence in a Northerly Direction over the said Down until it unites with the *Pensax* Turnpike Road in the Township of *Norton* in the County of *Hereford*; and another Parish Carriage Highway commencing from the *Hereford* Turnpike Road at a Place called *Burley Gate*, on the Confines of the Parish of *Much Cowarne*, where it joins the Parish of *Ocle Pitchard* in the County of *Hereford*, and leading thence in an Easterly Direction through the said Parish of *Much Cowarne* and the Parish of *Bishop's Frome* in the said County of *Hereford* to the Village of *Bishop's Frome*, to join the Turnpike Road leading from *Bromyard* towards *Ledbury*, and crossing the said Road leading thence in a North-easterly Direction through the said Parish of *Bishop's Frome*, and the Parish of *Acton Beauchamp* in the County of *Worcester*, by *Acton's Green*, to the Confines of the Parish of *Suckley* in the said County of *Worcester*; and One other Parish Carriage Highway commencing at *Acton's Green* in the said Parish of *Acton Beauchamp* in the County of *Worcester*, and leading thence in a South-easterly Direction through the said Parish of *Acton Beauchamp*, and the Parishes of *Evesbatch* and *Cradley* in the County of *Hereford*, to a Place called *Ridgway's Cross*, where it enters the Turnpike Road leading from *Hereford* to *Worcester* in the said Parish of *Cradley*, were made Turnpike, widened, and improved, whereby several inconvenient Hills and circuitous Roads will be avoided, and the Distance greatly diminished; and such new Lines of Roads respectively are intended to be made Part and Parcel of the Roads now included in the said recited Act: And whereas it is expedient that the said recited Act should be repealed, and that further and more effectual Powers should be granted, as well for repairing and improving the said present Roads, as also for making and maintaining the several new Lines of Roads herein mentioned; but the Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That upon the First Day of *August* next after the passing of this Act the said recited Act shall be repealed, and that this Act shall thereafter be put into execution during the Term and for the Purposes hereinafter mentioned.

II. And be it enacted, That all Monies due to and all Property and all Choses in Action vested in the Trustees under the said recited Act hereby repealed shall, immediately on the Commencement of this Act, be vested in the Trustees for executing this Act; and such last-mentioned Trustees may sue for and recover the same, and act in respect thereof, as effectually as if the same had been vested in them under the said recited Act; and they shall be liable to all the Debts and Engagements to which the Trustees under the said recited Act were liable at the Repeal thereof.

III. And

III. And whereas the Road leading from a House called the *White Horse* in the said Town of *Bromyard*, through *Sheep Street* in the said Town, and thence by the *Firs* to a House called the *Firs Cottage*, (being Part and Parcel of the Turnpike Roads by the said recited Act directed to be kept in repair,) has, in consequence of a new Line of Road made by the Trustees acting under the Powers of the said recited Act, commencing in the *High Street* in the said Town of *Bromyard*, and running by a Place called *Piccadilly*, and over *Flaggoner's Green*, nearly parallel with the said old Piece of Road towards *Leominster*, together with the Toll House called *Sheep Street Toll House*, become useless and unnecessary for the Purpose of this Act; be it enacted, That the said Parcel of Road from the *White Horse* to the *Firs Cottage* aforesaid shall cease to be Turnpike Road, and the Trustees for executing this Act shall be entirely relieved and discharged from the Care and Maintenance thereof, from and after such Time as the Diversion herein-after authorized to be made shall have been to the Satisfaction of any Two Justices completed: Provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Trustees herein-after appointed to sell the said Toll House called *Sheep Street Toll House*, with the Appurtenances, either by public Auction or private Contract, at such Price as can be reasonably obtained for the same respectively; and the said Trustees shall apply the Purchase Money thereof respectively for such and the like Purposes as the Tolls by this Act authorized to be collected are hereby directed to be applied; and until such Diversion shall have been completed as aforesaid it shall and may be lawful for the Trustees and they are hereby authorized to demand and receive at the said *Sheep Street Toll House* the several Tolls herein-after imposed by this Act, and apply the same in the Manner directed by this Act with respect to the Tolls hereby directed to be collected on the Third District.

Road from the White Horse, Bromyard, to the Firs Cottage discontinued, and Toll House to be sold.

IV. being duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in *England*, shall be the Trustees for putting this Act into execution.

Power to
appoint

V. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees at any Meeting under this Act, after such Notice as herein-after provided for, to elect any Number of Persons duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in *England*, not exceeding Five in the whole, at any one of such Meetings, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, in addition to the Trustees hereby nominated: Provided nevertheless, that no such Election shall be made but at a Meeting of which Notice shall have been given by the Clerk to the said Trustees, or by any Three or more of such Trustees, by Advertisement inserted in some Newspaper usually circulated in the said Town of *Bromyard* and Neighbourhood thereof, expressing the Purpose and the Time and Place for every such Election, at least Fourteen Days previous to every such Meeting; and such Trustees so elected shall have the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been hereby appointed.

VI. And be it enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold their First Meeting at *Dumbleton Hall* in the Town of *Bromyard* aforesaid on the First *Tuesday* in *August* next after the passing of this Act, between the Hours of Eleven of the Clock in the Forenoon and Three of the Clock in the Afternoon, or at some other convenient Place in the Neighbourhood of the said Roads; and shall then, and from Time to Time thereafter, adjourn to and meet at such Times, and at such Places in the Neighbourhood of the said Roads, as they shall think proper.

VII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be put in execution for the Purpose of more effectually improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair the present Turnpike Roads; (that is to say,) the Road leading from a House in the Occupation of *Harriett Eckley* Spinster, in the said Town of *Bromyard*, to *Herefordshire Lake* in the Parish of *Whitborne*, at or near the *Sapey* Turnpike Gate where it joins the *Worcester* Turnpike Road, and to *Acton's Green* in the County of *Worcester*, and also to another Part of *Herefordshire Lake* in the Township of *Linton* in the said Parish of *Bromyard* on the Confines of the Parish of *Suckley* in the said County of *Worcester*, which Line or Lines of Road shall constitute the First District; the Road leading from a House called the *New Road House*, in the Occupation of *Ella Harris* Spinster, in the said Town of *Bromyard*, to *Stoke Lacy* Church, to join the *Hereford* Turnpike Road, and through the Parishes of *Avenbury*, *Bishop's Frome*, and *Castle Frome*, to join the *Ledbury* Turnpike Road, which shall constitute the Second District; the Road leading from the aforesaid *Hereford* Road to a Place called the *Halfway Ash*, where it joins the *Leominster* Turnpike Road, which shall constitute the Third District; the Road leading from the *Sheep Street* in the said Town of *Bromyard* to a Place called *Perry Bridge* in the Parish of *Stoke Bliss* where it joins the *Tenbury* Turnpike Road, which shall constitute the Fourth District; the Road leading from the Schoolhouse in the Town of *Bromyard* to a Place called *Poke Lane*, at or near the Confines of

the Parish of *Stanford-on-Teme* in the said County of *Worcester*, where it joins the *Hundred House* Turnpike Road, which shall constitute the Fifth District; and also for the Purpose of making and maintaining the several new Lines of Roads in connexion therewith herein-before mentioned; (that is to say,) the Parish Carriage Highway commencing at the *Worcester* Turnpike Road upon *Bromyard Down* in the Township of *Linton*, and branching thence in a Northerly Direction over the said Down until it unites with the *Pensax* Turnpike Road in the Township of *Norton* in the County of *Hereford*, which shall constitute the Sixth District; and another Parish Carriage Highway commencing from the *Hereford* Turnpike Road at a Place called *Burley Gate* on the Confines of the Parish of *Much Cowarne* where it joins the Parish of *Ocle Pitchard* in the County of *Hereford*, and leading thence in an Easterly Direction through the said Parish of *Much Cowarne* and the Parish of *Bishop's Frome* in the said County of *Hereford* to the Village of *Bishop's Frome*, to join the Turnpike Road leading from *Bromyard* towards *Ledbury*, and crossing the said Road leading thence in a North-easterly Direction through the said Parish of *Bishop's Frome* and the Parish of *Acton Beauchamp* in the County of *Worcester*, by *Acton's Green*, to the Confines of the Parish of *Suckley* in the said County of *Worcester*, which shall constitute the Seventh District; and One other Parish Carriage Highway commencing at *Acton's Green* in the Parish of *Acton Beauchamp* in the County of *Worcester*, and leading thence in a South-easterly Direction through the said Parish of *Acton Beauchamp*, and the Parishes of *Evesbatch* and *Cradley* in the County of *Hereford*, to a Place called *Ridgway's Cross* where it enters the Turnpike Road leading from *Hereford* to *Worcester* in the said Parish of *Cradley*, which shall constitute the Eighth District.

VIII. And whereas a Map or Plan describing the several Lines of the new Roads intended to be made, widened, or improved, and of the Lands, Grounds, Hereditaments, and Premises intended to be taken, or through or over which the same is intended to be made or carried, widened, or improved, and a Section of the new Lines of Roads respectively hereby authorized to be made, widened, or improved, and a Book of Reference containing the Names of the Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers of such Lands, Grounds, and Premises, have been deposited at the respective Offices of the Clerks of the Peace for the said Counties of *Hereford* and *Worcester*; be it therefore enacted, That the said Map or Plan, Section, and Book of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said respective Clerks of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may at seasonable Times inspect and peruse the same, and have Copies thereof or Extracts therefrom, paying to the respective Clerks of the Peace for the said Counties of *Hereford* and *Worcester* for the Time being the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts; and the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference, or any Copy thereof respectively, or of any Part thereof respectively, certified by the said respective Clerk of the Peace or his Deputy for the Time being to be a true Copy thereof, shall be good Evidence in all Courts of Law or elsewhere.

Map or Plan deposited with the Clerks of the Peace to remain there and be open to Inspection.

Power to make new Roads, &c. according to Plan.

IX. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to set out, make, widen, and complete the said respective new Lines of Roads herein described in the respective Lines and through the Lands delineated in the Map or Plan and described in the Book of Reference herein-after mentioned, of such Width as they may think proper, not exceeding Sixty Feet, together with such Footpaths, Bridges, Embankments, Ditches, Drains, Fences, and other necessary Works upon or near thereto as they may think requisite, and for the Purposes aforesaid to take possession of the Lands and Premises described in the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference, making Satisfaction for the same to the Owners thereof and other Persons interested therein for the Damage which such Owners or other Persons may respectively sustain thereby; and it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and for their Surveyors and Workmen, from Time to Time to enter upon the said several Lands, and to stake out the same for the Purposes of this Act, at such Times and in such Manner as the said Trustees or Surveyors shall think necessary or expedient.

Trustees empowered to deviate from Plan to an Extent not exceeding One hundred Yards.

X. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees in making the said new Lines of Roads respectively to deviate from the Line delineated upon the said Map or Plan: Provided always, that no such Deviation shall extend to a greater Distance than One hundred Yards from the said Lines respectively, or into the Lands of any Person not described in the said Map or Plan or in the said Book of Reference, without the Consent in Writing of the Party in or through whose Lands any such Deviation shall be proposed to be made.

Lands marked on the Plan may be used, notwithstanding Omissions and Misnomers.

XI. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to make the said new Lines of Roads respectively in or through the Lands delineated upon the said Map or Plan, although such Lands, or the Situation thereof, or the Names of the Owners or Occupiers thereof, may happen to be omitted, mis-stated, or erroneously described in this Act or in the Schedule thereto, or in the said Map or Plan, or in the said Book of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the said Counties of *Hereford* and *Worcester*, or either of such Counties, in Petty Sessions assembled, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Omission or Mis-statement proceeded from Mistake; and the Certificate of the said Justices shall be deposited with and remain in the Custody of the said respective Clerks of the Peace for the Time being.

The Freehold and Inheritance of Lands to remain and be vested in the Persons of whom they are purchased.

XII. And be it enacted, That in case any Lands shall hereafter be purchased by the said Trustees for the Formation of any Road, the Freehold and Inheritance in the Lands so purchased, in case the same shall be of Freehold Tenure, and in case the same shall be of any other Tenure the Estate and Interest therein, shall not (notwithstanding any Provisions in any of the Acts in force for regulating Turnpike Roads in *England*) by means of any such Purchase, or any Conveyance or Assurance made in pursuance thereof, be vested in the said Trustees; but such Freehold and Inheritance, or the Estate and Interest in such Lands, shall, notwithstanding such Purchase

chase and Conveyance or Assurance, remain and be vested in the Persons in whom the same were vested immediately prior to such Purchase by the said Trustees; and the said Trustees shall, by means of such Purchase and Conveyance or Assurance, be entitled to a perpetual Right of Way in, over, or upon the Lands so purchased by them.

XIII. Provided also, and be it enacted, That if at any Time any Land purchased by the said Trustees under the Authority of this Act shall not be wanted for the Purposes thereof, and the Road for which the same was purchased shall cease to be a Highway, then the Right of Way in or over the said Lands shall cease and be extinguished, and the Freehold and Inheritance of the said Land, in case the same shall be of Freehold Tenure, and the Estate and Interest in such Lands, in case the same shall be of any other Tenure, shall be and remain in the Persons then entitled to the same, freed and discharged from such Right of Way.

Right of Way to cease when Lands are not wanted.

XIV. Provided always, and be it enacted, That the said Trustees shall have the same Power and Authority of cutting, digging, and using the Lands taken by them for the Purposes of this Act as the said Trustees would have had in case they had purchased the Fee Simple or the whole Estate and Interest in the said Lands.

Trustees may cut, dig, &c. as if they had purchased the Fee Simple.

XV. Provided always, and be it enacted, That the Powers and Authorities given by this Act shall not authorize the said Trustees to take or pull down, or to use or injure, any Dwelling House or other Building, or to take, use, or injure any Curtilage, Garden, Yard, Park, Paddock, Lawn, Shrubbery, planted Walk or Avenue to a House, or any inclosed Ground planted and set apart as a Nursery for Trees, or any Part thereof respectively, (except such as are mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed,) without the previous Consent in Writing of the Owner or Proprietor thereof and all other Persons interested therein.

Trustees restrained from pulling down Houses, &c. not in Schedule.

XVI. Provided also, and be it enacted, That in case the said Trustees shall not, within the Space of Three Years from the Commencement of this Act, pay for the Lands which they are by this Act authorized to take, then and from thenceforth all the Powers by this Act granted in relation to the taking of Lands for the Purposes of Turnpike Roads shall, so far as relate to the Lands herein-before authorized to be taken for the Purposes of this Act, cease and be utterly void, unless with the Consent of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands respectively.

Limiting the Time for purchasing Property.

XVII. And be it enacted, That notwithstanding the Repeal of the said recited Act the several Tolls thereby granted and made payable shall continue to be paid at the Toll Gates or Toll Bars to be continued or erected upon or on the Sides of the said Roads until the First Day of *September* next after the passing of this Act.

Present Tolls continued until the 1st September 1842.

XVIII. And be it enacted, That upon and after the said First Day of *September* after the passing of this Act it shall be lawful for the

Power to take Tolls.

the

the said Trustees to demand and take, at the several and respective Toll Gates or Toll Bars which shall by virtue of this Act be upon or on the Sides of the said Roads; such Tolls as the said Trustees at any of their Meetings shall direct, not exceeding the Sums following; (that is to say,)

Tolls.

For every Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Coach, Omnibus, Landau, Landaulet, Barouche, Chariot, Chaise, Calash, Curricule, Phaeton, Sociable, Gig, Chair, Car, Caravan, Van, Hearse, Litter, Taxed Cart, or other such like Carriage, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence :

For every Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, notwithstanding any Law to the contrary (except as herein-after mentioned), the Sum of Sixpence :

For every Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage having the Tire of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Four Inches and a Half and less than Six Inches at the Bottom or Sole thereof, and so constructed that when such Wheels shall be rolling on a Flat or level Surface the whole Breadth of the Tire thereof shall bear equally on such flat or level Surface, and the Nails of the Tire of such Wheels countersunk so as not to rise above the Surface of such Tire, the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny :

And in case the Tire of the Wheels of any or either of such last-mentioned Carriages so made and constructed shall be of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards at the Bottom or Sole thereof, the Sum of Three-pence :

For every Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Carriage used for the carrying or conveying of Timber or other heavy Goods, having the fore Axletree and the hind Axletree at a greater Distance than Eight Feet from each other, the Sum of One Shilling :

And in case the Tire of the Wheels of any or either of such last-mentioned Carriage used as aforesaid shall be of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards at the Bottom or Sole thereof, and shall be so constructed that when such Wheels shall be rolling on a flat or level Surface the whole Breadth of the Tire thereof shall bear equally on such flat or level Surface, and the Nails of the Tire of such Wheels constructed, so as not to rise above the Surface of such Tire, the Sum of Eight-pence :

For every empty Carriage with Four Wheels fastened to any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, the Sum of Sixpence :

For every empty Carriage with Two Wheels so fastened, the Sum of Three-pence; and if loaded, Double such respective Sums :

For every Horse, Ass, or Mule, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of One Penny Halfpenny :

For every Ox, Cow, Calf, or Neat Cattle, not drawing, the Sum of One Halfpenny :

For every Hog, Pig, Sheep, or Lamb, the Sum of One Farthing :

For every Carriage moved or propelled by Steam or Machinery, or by any other Power than Animal Power, the Sum of One Shilling per Wheel for each Wheel thereof :

And

And for every Dog, Goat, or other such like Animal, drawing any Cart, Carriage, Truck, Barrow, or other such like Carriage, the Sum of Three-pence :

Which said Tolls shall be taken before any Horse, Mule, Ass, Beast, or other Cattle or Carriage whatsoever shall be permitted to pass through any Toll Gate or Bar which shall be by virtue of this Act upon or across the said Roads or on the Sides thereof.

XIX. And be it enacted, That in all Cases in which there shall be a fractional Part of a Halfpenny in the Amount of the Tolls by this Acts authorized to be collected, the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be payable in lieu of such fractional Part. Fraction of a Halfpenny in Tolls.

XX. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle employed in carrying or conveying, or going empty to fetch, carry, or convey, or returning empty from carrying or conveying, having been employed only in carrying or conveying, on the same Day, any Stones, Bricks, Timber, Wood, Gravel, or other Materials for building, rebuilding, or repairing any present or any future Bridge or Bridges on any Road or public Highway, or Draining Tiles or Lime for the Improvement of Land, shall be exempt from the Payment of the Tolls hereby granted, unless the Tire of the Wheels of the Carriages in which the same shall be conveyed shall be of the Breadth of Four Inches and a Half or upwards at the Bottom or Sole thereof, and so constructed that when such Wheels shall be rolling upon a flat or level Surface the whole Breadth of the Tire thereof shall bear equally on such flat or level Surface, and the Nails of the Tire of such Wheels countersunk so as not to rise above the Surface of such Tire; and when the Wheels of such Carriages shall be of the Breadth of Four and a Half Inches or upwards, and so constructed as aforesaid, then and in such Case no Toll shall be demanded or taken for or in respect of any Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing the same, when employed in carrying or conveying, or going empty to fetch, carry, or convey, or returning empty from carrying or conveying, having been employed only in carrying or conveying, on the same Day, any Stones, Bricks, Timber, Wood, Gravel, or other Materials for building, rebuilding, or repairing any present or any future Bridge or Bridges on any Road or public Highway, or Draining Tiles or Lime for the Improvement of Land, between the Twenty-eighth Day of *February* and the First Day of *October*. Carriages carrying Materials for building Bridges, or Draining Tiles or Lime for Improvement of Land, not to be exempt from Tolls unless the Wheels are Six Inches broad at the Bottom thereof, and the Nails countersunk.

XXI. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, having the Tire of the Wheels of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards at the Bottom or Sole thereof, and so constructed that when such Wheels shall be rolling on a flat or level Surface the whole Breadth of the Tire thereof shall bear equally on such flat or level Surface, and the Nails of the Tire countersunk so as not to rise above the Surface of such Tire, shall be subject or liable to Toll for Overweight. Waggons, &c. with Wheels Six Inches broad and Nails of the Tire countersunk not liable to Toll for Overweight.

Carriages carrying Timber between certain Periods subject to double Toll.

XXII. And be it enacted, That between the Thirtieth Day of *September* and the First Day of *March* in every Year there shall be demanded and taken, for every Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Carriage laden with Timber, Planks, Lime, Bricks, Stones, Tiles, or any Materials for building, on any Part of the said Roads, an additional Toll, equal to Double the Toll hereinbefore made payable for the same.

Only Two Tolls to be payable on any One of the Districts of Roads.

XXIII. And be it enacted, That no more than Two full Tolls shall be taken on any One of the said Districts of Roads for passing and repassing any Number of Times in the same Day, to be computed from Twelve of the Clock at Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next succeeding Night, with the same Horses, Beasts, Cattle, or other Animal or Thing liable to Toll or Duty, except as herein-after mentioned.

Tolls paid at One Gate to free the others within Three Miles in the same District.

XXIV. Provided always, and be it enacted, That if any Toll shall have been paid for or in respect of any Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage passing through any Turnpike, Toll Gate, Side Bar, or Chain continued or to be erected by virtue of this Act (except Horses, Cattle, Beasts, or Carriages carrying Passengers or Goods for Pay, Hire, or Reward, or which shall be let out to Hire, as herein-after mentioned), the same Horse, Cattle, Beast, and Carriage shall, upon the Production of a Ticket denoting such Payment, be permitted at any Time or Times, and from Time to Time, during the Remainder of the same Day upon which such Payment as aforesaid shall have been made (such Day to be computed as aforesaid), to pass Toll-free (except as herein-after mentioned) through the same, and all and every other Turnpike, Toll Gate, Side Bar, or Chain continued or to be erected on the same District of Road, by virtue of this Act, which shall be situated within the Distance of Three Miles from such Turnpike, Toll Gate, Side Bar, or Chain at which such Person shall have paid such Toll and received such Ticket as aforesaid, the Distance of Three Miles to be computed and deemed to be along the Course of the Turnpike Road comprised within this Act, any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

Tolls to be paid but once a Day.

XXV. And be it enacted, That after the Toll hereby imposed for the passing of any Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage through any Turnpike Gate to be continued or erected by virtue of this Act shall have been paid, such Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage shall, upon a Ticket being produced denoting such Payment on that Day, be permitted to pass Toll-free through the same Toll Gate, Turnpike, or Side Gate, and also through any other Gate or Gates which the Ticket for such Payment shall free, at any Time or Times during the same Day, to be computed as aforesaid, except as herein is mentioned.

Tolls in certain Cases to be paid on repassing.

XXVI. Provided nevertheless, and be it enacted, That if any Horse, Beast, or Cattle for which full Toll shall have been paid for passing

passing through any of the said Toll Gates, Toll Bars, or Chains, shall return drawing another or different Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, such Horse, Beast, or Cattle shall not be permitted to repass through such Toll Gate, Toll Bar, or Chain on the same Day without Toll being again paid for such Horse, Beast, or Cattle.

XXVII. And be it enacted, That the Tolls by this Act imposed shall be paid for or in respect of Horses, Beasts, or Cattle drawing Carriages of whatever Description, conveying Passengers or Goods for Hire or Reward, and every Carriage propelled or drawn by Steam, or any other Power than Animal Power, for each Time of passing and for each Time of repassing upon any of the said Roads.

Carriages conveying Passengers or Goods to pay every Time of passing.

XXVIII. Provided also, and be it enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for all Horses or other Cattle drawing any Post-chaises or other Carriages travelling for Hire as often as any new Hiring shall take place, in the same Manner as if no previous Payment of Toll in respect of such Horses or Cattle had been made on the same Day.

Post-chaises to pay every Time of passing with fresh Hiring.

XXIX. And be it enacted, That the several Toll Gates, Bars, and Toll Houses now standing or being upon the said present Turnpike Roads or on the Sides thereof shall be continued until removed by any Order of the said Trustees; and it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to order and cause to be set up in or across the said present Turnpike Roads, and also upon any Road to be made or repaired by virtue of this Act, or on the Sides thereof, any Toll Gate or Bar, and to remove the present or any future Toll Gate or Bar, as they shall think proper.

Toll Gates.

XXX. And be it enacted, That where it shall be necessary to erect any Toll Gate, Toll Bar, or Chain upon or across any of the said Roads which shall lead or pass over any Parts of any Green Fields, Commons, or Waste Grounds, it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to cause Fences and Ditches to be erected and made upon or over such Green Fields, Commons, or Waste Grounds within Half a Mile of such Toll Gate, Toll Bar, or Chain, in such Manner as they shall think necessary, in order to prevent the Payment of Toll being avoided; and if any Person or Persons shall fell down or otherwise displace or destroy, or carry away such Fence, or any Part thereof, or shall fill up or spoil any such Ditch, every Person shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, over and besides the Amount of the Damages thereby occasioned, such Forfeiture and Damages respectively to be recovered before any Two or more Justices of the Peace acting for the said County of *Hereford* or *Worcester*, who shall and are hereby empowered, upon Complaint in Writing to be exhibited before any such Justices of any or either of the Offences aforesaid, to summon the Party complained against before them, and on either the Appearance of such Party, or on due Proof of the Service of such Summons, either personally or by leaving a Copy of the said Summons at the usual Place of Residence of such Party, to hear and determine the Matter of such

Trustees to erect Fences on Commons.

such Complaint, and on Proof of the Offence to convict the Offender, and to adjudge him to pay the Penalty or Forfeiture incurred, and to proceed to recover the same by Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of the Parties so convicted as aforesaid.

Occupiers of Lands to remove Lumps of Earth, &c. from Sides of Roads.

XXXI. And be it enacted, That all and every Occupier and Occupiers of Lands adjoining to any Part of the said Roads shall, on receiving Ten Days Notice in Writing from the Surveyor of any Part of the said Roads for that Purpose, remove and carry away from off the said Roads the Dirt and Soil arising from the paring of the Banks or cleansing of the Ditches, and also the Dirt and Soil to be from Time to Time gathered, collected, scraped, or taken from off the said Roads and laid upon the Sides thereof towards their respective Lands, and all other Filth, Dung, and Rubbish lying on the Sides of the said Roads adjoining to their respective Lands; and in case such Occupier or Occupiers shall neglect or refuse so to do, after receiving such Notice as aforesaid, he and they shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence any Sum not exceeding Twenty Shillings, to be recovered as aforesaid before any Two or more Justices of the Peace acting for the County of *Hereford* or *Worcester*.

Application of the Tolls arising on old Roads.

XXXII. And be it enacted, That all Monies which shall be received by the said Trustees by virtue of this Act, upon the Roads included in the said recited Act hereby repealed, shall be applied as follows; (that is to say,)

Firstly, in paying and discharging the Expences of obtaining and passing this Act, or incident thereto:

Secondly, in paying and discharging any Interest which may from Time to Time be owing in respect of any Money which may have been borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by the said former Act hereby repealed:

Thirdly, in paying the Expences of improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair such Roads, and in putting this Act into execution with reference thereto:

Fourthly, in paying and discharging any Interest which may from Time to Time be owing in respect of any Money which may hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by this Act:

Fifthly, in reducing, paying off, and discharging the several Principal Sums which have been borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by the said former Act hereby repealed.

Application of the Tolls arising on new Roads.

XXXIII. And be it enacted, That all Monies which shall be received by the said Trustees on or in respect of the new Lines of Road authorized by this Act to be made shall be applied as follows; (that is to say,)

Firstly, in discharging the Expences of obtaining and passing this Act, or incident thereto:

Secondly, in making, improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair the said new Lines of Road, and putting this Act into execution with reference thereto:

Thirdly,

Thirdly, in paying and discharging any Interest which may from Time to Time become due and be owing in respect to any Money which may hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls to be collected on the said new Lines of Road :

Fourthly, in reducing, paying off, and discharging any Principal Sums of Money which may be due on the Credit of the Tolls to be taken on the said new Lines of Road by this Act authorized to be made.

XXXIV. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, at any General Meeting to be held pursuant to the Directions of this Act, to order and direct the Treasurer or Treasurers nominated and appointed under this Act for the Time being to pay and defray, out of the Money in his or their Hands arising from the Tolls and Duties collected by virtue thereof, all such Costs, Charges, and reasonable Sums as they the said Trustees, or any of them, or any Justice or Justices of the Peace, shall have been at, put unto, or shall have expended in the due Execution of this Act, and of the Powers and Authorities given and granted thereby, or in prosecuting or defending any Suit or Suits, Indictment or Indictments, Information, or other Prosecution whatsoever which shall be done, or they shall have done or ordered to be done, in the due Execution thereof.

Costs of Trustees and Justices to be paid.

XXXV. And whereas it would be expedient and also desirable for the Interest of the said Trust that the said Road from the *White Horse* to the *Firs Cottage*, which by the Powers of this Act may cease to be a Turnpike Road, should be diverted ; be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, to order and direct that the Treasurer acting under this Act for the Time being shall pay out of the general Fund in his Hands such Sum of Money as may be required to divert the said Road : Provided nevertheless, that such Alteration or Diversion shall be approved of by Two Thirds of the Trustees assembled at the Meeting when such Order and Direction as aforesaid shall be made, and also approved of by the Surveyor or Surveyors of the Highways of the Parishes or Townships through which the Road so diverted shall pass : Provided also, that no such Alteration or Diversion shall be made but at a Meeting of which Notice shall have been given by the Clerk to the said Trustees, or by any Three or more of such Trustees, by causing a Notice of such Meeting to be affixed on the principal outer Door of *Bromyard Church* on Two *Sundays* previous to such Meeting ; and a Copy of such Notice shall also be served on the Surveyor or Surveyors of the Highways of the Parishes or Townships through which the Road so intended to be diverted shall pass.

Power to lay out a Sum not exceeding 100*l.* in Alteration of Road near the Firs.

XXXVI. And be it enacted, That the Road so diverted shall not be considered Turnpike Road, but shall be repaired out of the Funds raised by the Highway Rate for the Parish or Township in which the Road so diverted shall be situate.

Diversions not to be considered Turnpike.

XXXVII. And be it enacted, That no more Money shall be expended in the Repair of any District of Road comprised in this Act

taken on any Road.

than shall be collected on such District of Road, or borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls collected thereon.

Trustees or Clerks not incompetent Witnesses in Actions.

XXXVIII. And be it enacted, That no Trustee or Clerk acting under the Authority of this Act, if not otherwise interested, shall be deemed incompetent to give Evidence, or shall be disqualified from giving Evidence, in any Action, Suit, or other Proceeding brought by or against him in such his Capacity of Trustee or Clerk, by reason of his being Plaintiff or Defendant in such Action, Suit, or Proceeding.

Roads in this Act not to be exempted from any General Act.

XXXIX. And be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall be deemed to exempt the Roads comprised in this Act from the Provisions of any general Act relating to the Consolidation or other improved Arrangement of Turnpike Roads which may pass during the present or any future Session of Parliament.

Term of Act.

XL. And be it enacted, That this Act shall commence on the First Day of *August* next after the passing thereof, and shall continue in force for the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the Session of Parliament which shall then next follow.

Interpretation of Act.

XLI. And be it enacted, That in this Act the following Words and Expressions shall have the several Meanings hereby assigned to them, unless there be something in the Subject or Context repugnant to such Construction ; (that is to say,)

Words importing the Singular Number shall include the Plural Number, and Words importing the Plural Number shall include the Singular Number :

The Word " Person " shall be understood to include Corporation :

Words importing the Masculine Gender shall include Females :

The Word " Lands " shall be understood to include Messuages, Tenements, and Hereditaments.

Public Act.

XLII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such.
