



## CHAPTER xiv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Rural Sanitary District of the Barnet Union, the Boroughs of Kingston-upon-Hull and Newport (Mon.), and the City of York. A.D. 1886.

[25th September 1886.]

**W**HEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875 :

38 & 39 Vict.  
c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders as set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the dates therein respectively mentioned, have full validity and force. Orders in Schedule confirmed.

2. The sanitary authorities mentioned in the said Orders shall not under the powers of this Act or the said Orders purchase or acquire in any city, borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or part of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses, which after the passing of this Act have been, or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers. Special provision as to houses of labouring class.

For the purposes of this section the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artizans, labourers, and others working for

A.D. 1886. — wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages, but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family, and persons, other than domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other  
Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Sanitary Authority, from  
and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force,  
with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the  
continuance of any existing public rights of highway, and for the purposes  
aforesaid, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts with respect to  
the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

Provided that, as regards the land numbered 106 and described in Part II. of the Schedule hereto, the said Urban Sanitary Authority shall only be empowered to exercise the powers conferred by this Order in respect to that portion of the burial ground which lies to the north of the line showing the "proposed line of street" on the plan deposited with the Local Government Board, and if the said Urban Sanitary Authority shall acquire that portion, nothing herein contained shall authorise them to remove any body, or the remains of any body, interred therein, without first obtaining such license as is required by law in that behalf.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Newport, in the County of Monmouth, acting by the Council, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of raising, widening, and improving the approach to Newport Bridge from the High Street, within the said Borough :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Urban Sanitary Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and for the purpose aforesaid, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

Provided that the said urban sanitary authority shall not construct on the shore of the sea, or of any creek, bay, arm of the sea, or navigable river communicating therewith, where and so far up the same as the tide flows and reflows, any work without the previous consent of the Board of Trade, to be signified in writing under the hand of one of the secretaries or assistant secretaries of the Board of Trade, and then only according to such plan and under such restrictions and regulations as the Board of Trade may approve of, such approval being signified as last aforesaid, and where any such work may have been constructed, the said urban sanitary authority shall not at any time alter or extend the same without obtaining previously to making any such alteration or extension the like consents or approvals. If any such work be commenced or completed without such consent and approval, the Board of Trade may abate and remove the same and restore the site thereof to its former condition at the cost and charge of the said urban sanitary authority, and the amount of such costs and charges shall be a debt due from the said urban sanitary authority to the Crown, and shall be recoverable accordingly with costs.
