



CHAPTER vii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Improvement Act District of Cambridge, the Local Government Districts of Cheshunt and Cleckheaton, the Borough of Portsmouth, and the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Stockport and Wangford Unions (two). [25th September 1886.] A.D. 1886.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875 :

38 & 39 Vict.
c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament ; and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the dates therein respectively mentioned, have full validity and force. The Orders in Schedule confirmed.

2. The sanitary authorities mentioned in the said Orders shall not under the powers of this Act or of those Orders, without the consent of the Local Government Board, purchase or acquire in any city, borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or part of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses which, after the passing of this Act, have been, or on the fifteenth day of December last were, occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers. For the purposes of this section, the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artizans, labourers, and others working for wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family, and persons, other than domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

3. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1886.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Commissioners appointed for putting into execution the above-mentioned Local Acts of Parliament (herein-after referred to as "the Commissioners"), as the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Cambridge, in the County of Cambridge, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of making a new street from Tenison Road to Station Road, in their District:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the Commissioners, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands
