



CHAPTER cxvii.

An Act to authorise the Repeal of Rates and Duties now levied in the Port of Limerick and to authorise other Harbour Rates to be levied in lieu thereof and to authorise the Limerick Harbour Commissioners to borrow Money on the security of the said Rates and for other purposes.

A.D. 1888.

[24th July 1888.]

WHEREAS by an Act (local and personal) passed in the 4th year of His late Majesty King George the 4th intituled An Act for the erection of a Bridge across the River Shannon and of a floating dock to accommodate sharp vessels frequenting the port of Limerick the Limerick Bridge Commissioners were incorporated for the purpose of erecting such bridge and floating dock :

And whereas by an Act (local and personal) passed in the 4th and 5th years of His late Majesty King William the 4th the Limerick Bridge Commissioners were reconstituted and were among other things authorised to levy certain tolls rates and duties in lieu of the tolls rates and duties authorised by the said first mentioned Act and to borrow money for the purpose of constructing new quays and other works for the improvement of the port and harbour of Limerick and for the formation of a floating dock :

And whereas another Act (local and personal) was passed in the 10th and 11th years of the reign of Her Majesty to amend the said recited Acts of 1823 and 1834 and under its provisions the Limerick Bridge Commissioners were charged with the execution of the powers of the Act of 1847 and their name was changed to the name of the Limerick Harbour Commissioners and they were authorised to construct a floating dock in lieu of the floating dock authorised by the Act of 1834 and to borrow from the Commissioners of Public Works in Ireland further money for that purpose :

And whereas by the Limerick Harbour (Composition of Debt) Act 1867 the debts due and owing by the Limerick Harbour Commissioners in respect of sums advanced from time to time by the

A.D. 1888. — Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury were compounded and enacted to be assumed and taken at the sum of sixty-five thousand pounds of which fifty-five thousand pounds subject to deduction as therein mentioned in respect of receipts to accrue from Harbour dues during the period between the 1st day of July 1866 and the passing of the said Act was secured upon the harbour rates and the Public Works Loan Commissioners were authorised to lend and the Harbour Commissioners to borrow a sum not exceeding twenty thousand pounds for the purpose of improving the said port and constructing a graving dock therein and also a further sum of three thousand seven hundred and seventy-nine pounds nine shillings and one penny in respect of a debt formerly due to Sir Thomas Deane :

And whereas the receipts aforesaid amounted to five thousand five hundred and eighty-six pounds two shillings and the principal sum secured upon the harbour rates as aforesaid was forty-nine thousand four hundred and thirteen pounds eighteen shillings :

And whereas by the Limerick Harbour Act 1867 the Limerick Harbour Commissioners were reconstituted and all the property and rights of the port and harbour of Limerick were vested in the Limerick Harbour Commissioners and the rates and duties theretofore paid under the authority of the Act of 1847 ceased and were repealed and new harbour rates were authorised to be levied in lieu thereof and also rates for a graving dock which the said Commissioners were authorised to construct :

And whereas extensive rebuilding or repairs are now necessary to make good the injuries and damage recently sustained by portion of the floating dock works which will require an expenditure of twenty thousand pounds and the Limerick Harbour Commissioners have not funds at their disposal to meet such expenditure and it is expedient that they be empowered to borrow any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole the principal sum of twenty thousand pounds on the terms of such advance being secured on the rates and dues to be fixed by this Act in lieu of the rates tolls and duties fixed by the said Act of 1867 and on the rates and other revenue of the said Harbour Commissioners :

And whereas it is expedient the said rates tolls and duties fixed by the said Act of 1867 should be repealed and that new rates and dues should be fixed by the authority of Parliament and levied in order to provide for the payment of the compounded debt and interest thereon and also for payment of the loan granted by the Public Works Loan Commissioners in respect of the advance made for the graving dock and also for the payment of the money by this Act authorized to be borrowed for the purpose of the said repairs and for the general maintenance of the port :

And whereas there are no charges upon the rates duties rents and income now leviable or receivable by the Limerick Harbour Commissioners other than and except the loans specified in Schedule B to this Act: A.D. 1888.

And whereas the objects aforesaid cannot be attained without the authority of Parliament:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Limerick Harbour Act 1888. Short title.

2. In this Act—

The term “the Treasury” means the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland for the time being. Interpretation of terms.

The terms “Limerick Harbour Commissioners” “Harbour Commissioners” and “Harbour Board” respectively mean (unless a different meaning is expressed or implied) the Limerick Harbour Commissioners for the time being.

The term “Commissioners of Public Works” means the Commissioners of Public Works in Ireland for the time being.

The terms “port” and “harbour” mean the port and harbour of Limerick and the River Shannon included within the jurisdiction of the Harbour Commissioners as defined by the recited Acts or any of them together with the quays piers jetties tidal basins and other works connected therewith but does not include Wellesley Bridge or the approaches thereto or the swivel bridge and the other works connected therewith or the several piers and harbours in the estuary of the River Shannon now or at the time of the passing of the Limerick Harbour Act 1867 vested in the Commissioners of Public Works.

The term “harbour rates” includes all rates and dues leviable from time to time in the port and harbour of Limerick under this Act and set forth in Schedule A to this Act annexed.

Terms which by the recited Acts or any of them or of the Acts and parts of Acts incorporated therewith have special meanings assigned to them have in this Act the same respective meanings unless excluded by the subject or context. Same meanings to words incorporated in this Act.

3. From and after the passing of this Act the rates and duties specified in Schedule A annexed to the Act of 1867 heretofore paid to the Limerick Harbour Commissioners under the authority of that Alteration of rates.

A.D. 1888. — Act for the use of the Limerick Harbour Commissioners shall cease and determine and the same are hereby repealed and the several harbour rates specified in Schedule A to this Act annexed shall be paid to and levied and received by the Limerick Harbour Commissioners in lieu thereof and all such harbour rates respectively shall and may be paid to and shall be levied and recovered and recoverable by the Harbour Commissioners in the manner and by the same ways and means as the said rates and duties authorised to be paid and recovered under the said recited Acts were paid to levied and recovered by the Commissioners of Public Works or by the Harbour Commissioners and their predecessors the Limerick Bridge Commissioners and the said harbour rates authorised by this Act shall not be altered at any time after the commencement of this Act without the authority of the Treasury in writing first had and obtained under the hand of one of their secretaries for the time being. Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Harbour Commissioners with the like consent at any time or times after the commencement of this Act after any such alteration of the said rates to raise the same provided that the maximum rates authorised to be levied by this Act be in no case exceeded. Provided also that in respect of the articles for which a lower scale of rates on imports is specified in the said Schedule A the rates specified in such lower scale shall be those to be received by and paid to the Commissioners and shall be levied and recoverable by them in the manner and ways aforesaid in lieu of the rates in the higher scale specified for such articles for such periods and so long as the Treasury do not require the rates specified in the said higher scale to be levied and that the Treasury may and shall have from time to time full power to determine the period during which the higher or lower scale of harbour rates respectively on the said articles shall be in force.

Power to borrow.

4. It shall be lawful for the said Harbour Commissioners to borrow for the purposes of the rebuilding or the repairs of the said floating dock any sum or sums not exceeding twenty thousand pounds upon the credit and security of the rates and dues leviable under this Act and of the rents and other income of the said Harbour Commissioners and on mortgage of the said rates dues rents and other income and such loans shall be repaid by fifty equal half-yearly instalments of principal with at the same time interest calculated at the rate of four per cent. per annum on the balance of the loan for the time being due.

Saving priorities.

5. The loans mentioned in the Schedule B to this Act shall have priority of charge over all loan or loans made under this Act.

Amendment of graving dock dues.

6. It shall be lawful for the Harbour Commissioners to charge levy and collect the graving dock rates on steam vessels using the

graving dock at Limerick on the gross registered tonnages of such vessels respectively according to the scale provided by the Limerick Harbour Act 1867 and save in respect of such steam vessels nothing in this Act shall in any way vary or affect the right or powers of the Harbour Commissioners in respect of the said graving dock or the rates or tolls chargeable thereon. 7. The costs charges and expenses of and incident to the preparing applying for obtaining and passing of this Act shall be paid by the Harbour Commissioners out of the first moneys which shall be paid to them under the provisions of this Act. Costs of Act.
