

CHAPTER clxxv.

An Act for enabling the Local Board of Health for the A.D. 1888. district of the borough of Llanelly to sell certain estates vested in them as trustees to appropriate for public purposes the sites of certain institutions vested in them as trustees on reinstating such institutions elsewhere and for altering the periods for the repayment of certain borrowed moneys making better provision for the health and government of the district; and for other purposes.

7th August 1888.]

HEREAS under the Local and Personal Act chapter one hundred 47 Geo. III. and seven of the second session of the forty-seventh year session 2 cap. 107 of George the Third (in this Act referred to as "the Public Estates (Local and Act") certain lands (in this Act referred to as "the public estates") became vested in trustees by that Act declared with power to lease the same and as by that Act limited to raise money upon the security of the rents and profits thereof and upon trust to apply all moneys so raised amongst other things in the improvement of the town and port of Llanelly or of the public estates and after payment out of the rents and profits of the public estates of the annual charges payable in respect of moneys raised on the security thereof to apply the residue and remainder of such rents and profits in discharging the costs charges and expenses of the said trustees and then in the improvement of the said town and port or either of them (which ultimate residue and remainder so directed to be applied in the improvement of the said town and port are in this Act referred to as "the income of the public estates"):

And whereas by a provisional order dated the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty and made in pursuance of the Public Health Act 1848 and confirmed by the Public Health 13 & 14 Vict. Supplemental Act 1850 (No. 3) (in this Act referred to as "the cap. 108. order of 1850") the borough of Llanelly within the boundaries in that order referred to was constituted a district for the purposes

of the Public Health Act 1848 and the Public Estates Act was in part repealed and all property and estate belonging to or vested in the trustees declared by the Public Estates Act were transferred to and vested in the Local Board of Health for the said district upon the trusts thereof declared and with and subject to the rights powers authorities and duties granted or imposed by so much of the Public Estates Act as was not by that order repealed and so far as the same were not repugnant to or inconsistent with that order or the Public Health Act 1848 or any byelaw which should be made under the Public Health Act 1848: And provision was made that if the property and estate so transferred should be insufficient to satisfy charges created by the trustees declared by the Public Estates Act the deficiency should be charged upon and satisfied out of the general district rates levied in the parts and places which would or ought to have been chargeable with such deficiency if that order had not been made and that all expenses and charges which should be incurred by the Local Board under so much of the Public Estates Act as was not by that order repealed and which should not be defrayed out of the revenues received by the Local Board under the Public Estates Act should be deemed to be expenses incurred by the Local Board under the Public Health Act 1848 and should be defrayed out of the general or special district rates (as the nature of the case might require):

And whereas by the Llanelly (Local Board) Waterwork Act 1865 (in this Act referred to as "the Water Act") the Local Board were made compellable to supply water within the district of the borough of Llanelly for water rents as limited by that Act and were required for the purposes of that Act when and so often as occasion should require to make and levy within the district of the borough of Llanelly in addition to the general district rates a water rate as limited by that Act and were authorised for any of the purposes of that Act to borrow on the security of the water rate and charges for water to be supplied and on the security of the general district rates under the Public Health Acts as in that Act defined not exceeding thirty-five thousand pounds and on the security but subject to any trusts or obligations to which the same might be liable of the public estates not exceeding five thousand pounds and provision was made that the water rates leviable and rates and charges for water under that Act should be primarily liable to be applied in satisfaction of all moneys borrowed under that Act and the interest thereon and in setting apart the sums by that Act required to be set apart and appropriated for the repayment of moneys borrowed under that Act and that all sums paid out of the general district rate under the powers or for the purposes of that Act should from time to time be reimbursed out of any balance from time to time standing to the credit of the waterworks account by that Act required to be kept

after application to such of the objects to which moneys carried to A.D. 1888. that account were under the provisions of that Act to be applied as were in that Act specified:

And whereas by a provisional order dated the seventeenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight and made in pursuance of the Local Government Act 1858 and confirmed by the Local Government Supplemental Act 1868 (in this Act referred to 31 & 32 Vict. as "the order of 1868") the district constituted by the order of cap. x. 1850 was extended:

And whereas by the Llanelly Harbour Act 1878 (in this Act called 41 Vict.

"the Harbour Act") the Llanelly Harbour and Burry Navigation cap. lxxxiii. Commissioners were authorised with the consent of the Local Board and for the purposes in that Act mentioned to borrow sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of fifty thousand pounds upon the security of the harbour revenues and by way of collateral security to charge the same upon the income of the public estates and provision was made that in case the harbour revenues should prove insufficient for the payment of any sum due by way of interest or principal borrowed under the authority of that Act such sum should be deemed to be and should be well charged on the income of the public estates subject to any charges affecting the same respectively and then subsisting and should be paid out of the same: And provision was made that in case the funds in the hands of the Commissioners from the harbour revenues should be at any time insufficient for the repayment of any moneys borrowed by the Commissioners with the consent of the Local Board under the authority of that Act or for the payment of any interest on any moneys so borrowed the Local Board should pay to the order of the Commissioners any sum or sums demanded as in that Act mentioned by the Commissioners out of the surplus income of the public estates for the time being in the hands of the Local Board and out of the accruing income of the public estates: Provided that if by reason of any such payment the income of the public estates should be insufficient for the payment of any principal moneys and interest thereon which had been borrowed by the Local Board under the authority of the Water Act for waterworks purposes and which should be secured upon the public estates the Local Board should make good such deficiency out of the rates rents and charges for water and the water rate by the Water Act authorised and in case the same should be insufficient then out of the general district rates as the case might be so that the total net income of the public estates might if required be available for payment of all principal moneys and interest thereon borrowed under the authority of the Harbour Act and for the time being charged upon the income of the public estates and it was enacted that the lands and hereditaments

A.D. 1888. contained within the limits set forth in Part II. of Schedule A. to that Act should constitute the district of the Local Board and the order of 1850 and the order of 1868 should be respectively construed throughout as if from and after the confirmation of the same respectively the limits of the district of the Local Board thereby respectively fixed had been therein respectively described as the same were respectively described in Part I. and Part II. of the said Schedule A.:

> And whereas it is expedient that the trusts affecting the public estates be so varied that the Local Board be empowered to sell such estates or any part or parts thereof freed from the trusts mentioned in the Public Estates Act and from all charges upon the same created under or by the Public Estates Act the Water Act and the Harbour Act or any of them the proceeds of any such sale or the investments representing such proceeds being held and applied by the Local Board as in this Act provided:

> And whereas it is expedient that the Local Board should no longer be required to make and levy a water rate:

> And whereas it is expedient that the Local Board be empowered at the request of the Commissioners to charge as limited by this Act the general district rate by way of further collateral security for the repayment of moneys borrowed by the Commissioners under the powers of the Harbour Act:

> And whereas it is expedient that the Local Board be empowered to prevent the erection of buildings over the River Lliedi and to require the removal of buildings now existing over that river:

> And whereas it is expedient that the Local Board should be empowered to purchase within seven years from the passing of this Act the undertaking of the Llanelly Gaslight Company as in this Act provided and at a meeting of the company specially convened with notice of the business to be transacted a resolution was passed by a majority of three fourths in number and value of the members present either personally or by proxy approving the provisions of this Act respecting purchase by the Local Board of the company's undertaking:

> And whereas by an indenture dated the twenty-ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six and made between William Henry Nevill and others of the first part the same persons of the second part Thomas Charles Morris and another of the third part and the Local Board of the fourth part and enrolled in Her Majesty's High Court of Chancery in England on the twentyfirst day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven certain land (except all veins and seams of coal and culm lying and being under part thereof) and the buildings on such land (which

land and buildings are in this Act referred to as "the Nevill A.D. 1888. Memorial") became vested in the Local Board upon trust that the said buildings and such other buildings as should thereafter be built thereon should be used for the use of savings bank for the use of benefit societies for the accommodation of classes belonging to the Llanelly Mechanics Institute for a museum and library and for the accommodation of a curator and on failure of all or any of the said primary purposes should be used for all such other public purposes as the Local Board should from time to time direct or appoint:

And whereas by an indenture dated the twentieth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three and made between William Henry Nevill and others of the first part Walter Duncan Thomas of the second part Benjamin Wilfred Thomas of the third part John Raglan Thomas of the fourth part and the Local Board of the fifth part a certain hall or building known as the Llanelly Athenæum and the piece of land forming the site thereof (which land and building are in this Act referred to as "the Llanelly Athenæum'') became vested in the Local Board upon trust to be applied as a site for a building to be used for the purposes of a literary and scientific institution called and known as "the Llanelly Athenæum" and for such other purposes and uses as should be thereafter declared:

And whereas it is expedient that the trusts affecting the lands and buildings vested in the Local Board by the recited indentures respectively be so varied that the Local Board may be empowered to substitute for the existing sites and buildings of the Nevill Memorial and Llanelly Athenæum other suitable sites and suitable and properly furnished buildings to be held upon the trusts by such indentures declared of the existing sites and buildings of the Nevill Memorial and Llanelly Athenæum respectively for the purpose of enabling the Local Board to appropriate and use the existing sites of the Nevill Memorial and Llanelly Athenæum freed from the trusts thereof respectively declared by the said indentures for the purposes of erecting thereon a new town hall public hall offices and conveniences:

And whereas it is expedient that the Local Board be empowered to construct a new town hall public hall and offices and conveniences on a site more convenient than the existing one:

And whereas it is expedient that the Local Board be authorised with the sanction of the Local Government Board to borrow sums of money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of twenty-five thousand pounds for the purpose of purchasing the site for and constructing the new town hall public hall offices and conveniences:

And whereas the Local Board have in the exercise of their statutory powers from time to time borrowed various sums of money and on the twenty-ninth day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven the Local Board owed on account of these moneys the several sums mentioned in the First Schedule to this Act and amounting in the whole to the sum of seventy-four thousand eight hundred and forty-four pounds nine shillings and ninepence:

And whereas it is expedient that further powers in relation to infectious diseases sanitary matters streets buildings private street works police matters street traffic local government and other matters should be conferred on the Local Board:

And whereas the objects of this Act cannot be attained without the authority of Parliament:

And whereas an absolute majority of the whole number of the Local Board at a meeting held on the eighth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven after ten clear days notice by public advertisement of such meeting and of the purpose thereof in the Llanelly and County Guardian a local newspaper published and circulating in the district (such notice being in addition to the ordinary notices required for summoning such meeting) resolved that the expense in relation to promoting the Bill for this Act should be charged on the district fund and general district rate:

And whereas such resolution was published twice in the Llanelly and County Guardian a local newspaper published and circulating in the district and in respect of matters under the jurisdiction of the Local Government Board has received the approval of that Board:

And whereas the propriety of the promotion of the Bill for this Act was confirmed by an absolute majority of the whole number of the Local Board at a further special meeting held in pursuance of a similar notice on the twenty-fourth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight being not less than fourteen days after the deposit of the Bill in Parliament:

And whereas the owners and ratepayers of the district by resolution in the manner provided in the Third Schedule of the Public Health Act 1875 consented to the promotion of the Bill for this Act:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Llanelly Short title. Local Board Act 1888.
 - 2. This Act is divided into parts as follows:--

3. In construing this Act the following words and expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction (that is to say):—

Interpretation of terms.

- "The district" means the local government district of the borough of Llanelly in the county of Carmarthen;
- "The Local Board" means the Local Board of Health for the district;
- "The clerk" "the surveyor" "the treasurer" "the medical officer of health" "the inspector of nuisances" mean respectively the clerk to the Local Board the surveyor to the Local Board the treasurer to the Local Board the medical officer of health for the district and the inspector of nuisances for the district;
- "The district fund" and "the general district rate" mean respectively the district fund and the general district rate of the district;
- "The Commissioners" means the Llanelly Harbour and Burry Navigation Commissioners;
- "The harbour revenues" means the dues tolls rates rents and charges receivable by the Commissioners;
- "The Public Health Acts" means the Public Health Act 1875 and all Acts for the time being in force for amending or extending the same;
- "Daily penalty" means a penalty for each day on which any offence is continued after conviction thereof;
- "Infectious disease" means and includes small-pox cholera typhus typhoid scarlet relapsing continued and puerperal fever

- Scarlatina and diphtheria and such other disease as the Local Government Board may on the application of the Local Board under the provisions and for the purposes of this Act from time to time declare to be infectious;
- "Registered medical practitioner" means any person for the time being registered under the Medical Act 1858 or any Acts amending the same;
- "Public conveyance" means any omnibus hackney carriage fly or other vehicle let or used for the conveyance of passengers for hire within the district whether such vehicle be licensed by the Local Board or not and whether the same be the property of a person residing or of a company having offices within the district or elsewhere;

"Food" includes every article other than water used for food or drink by man;

- "Owner" includes in the case of any building or structure in course of construction or alteration any person by whose orders or at whose cost such building or structure is being constructed or altered such person not being any contractor or builder employed to construct or alter the same;
- "Railway company" means and includes any railway company and any railway and dock company incorporated by Act of Parliament;
- "Dwelling-house" means any building or part thereof used or intended constructed or adapted to be used wholly or partly for human habitation by day or by night;
- "Structure" includes any building wall bridge fence railing balcony hoarding scaffold platform stack of bricks or of timber pier pillar post door gate or other such erection construction or thing;
- "Ground floor" used with reference to any building means that floor thereof the upper surface of which is nearest to the level of the street or ground adjoining the principal or only entrance to such building;
- "New street" means a street laid out after the passing of this Act and includes any part of a street laid out after the passing of this Act in continuation of a street existing at the passing of this Act but shall not include any road or approach to the station or premises of any railway company so far as such road or approach belongs to and is maintained by such company;
- "Place of public resort" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used either ordinarily or occasionally as a church chapel or other place of public worship or as a college or school (not being merely a dwelling-house so used) or as a

theatre public hall public concert room public ball room public lecture room or public exhibition room or as a public place of assembly for persons admitted thereto by tickets or by payment or used or constructed or adapted to be used either ordinarily or occasionally for any other public purpose but shall not include a private dwelling-house used occasionally or exceptionally for any of those purposes;

"Cattle" includes horse mare gelding foal filly ass mule ram ewe wether lamb goat kid swine bull ox cow steer heifer and calf;

"Person" includes corporation;

The several words and expressions to which meanings are assigned in the Public Health Acts or which have therein special meanings have in this Act (except where otherwise expressly provided) the same respective meanings unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction: Provided that the expression "superior courts" or "court of competent jurisdiction" or any other like expression shall be read and have effect as if the debt or demand with respect to which they are respectively used were a simple contract debt and not a debt or demand created by statute.

4. This Act except where otherwise expressly provided shall Limits of Act. apply exclusively to the district.

5. This Act shall be executed by the Local Board with the Execution powers duties and indemnities conferred and imposed by and of Act. according to the provisions of the Public Health Acts and those Acts shall in relation to the Local Board and the several objects and purposes of this Act be read and construed as if the purposes and. provisions of this Act were purposes and provisions of those Acts so far as the same shall be applicable thereto and except so far as any provisions of those Acts are expressly varied or otherwise provided for by this Act.

PART II.—PUBLIC PROPERTY UNDERTAKINGS &c.

The Public Estates.

6.—(1.) The Local Board may with the previous consent of the Powers to Charity Commissioners for England and Wales under their seal sell the public estates or any part thereof or any easement right or privilege of any kind over or in relation to the same.

(2.) Any such sale may be made either of the public estates or any part thereof with or without an exception or reservation of all or any of the mines and minerals therein or of any mines and minerals and in any such case with or without a grant or reservation of

powers of working wayleaves or rights of way rights of water and drainage and other powers easements rights and privileges for or incident to or connected with mining purposes in relation to the public estates or any part thereof or any other land.

(3.) Any sale under this section is included in the expression "a sale of the public estates" when herein-after used.

Regulations respecting sale of public estates.

- 7.—(1.) Every sale of the public estates shall be made at the best price that can reasonably be obtained.
- (2.) A sale of the public estates may be made in one lot or in several lots and either by auction or by private contract.
- (3.) On a sale of the public estates the Local Board may fix reserve biddings and buy in at an auction.
- (4.) A sale of public estates may be made subject to any stipulations respecting title or evidence of title or other things.
- (5.) On a sale of the public estates any restriction or reservation with respect to building on or other user of land or with respect to mines and minerals or with respect to or for the purpose of the more beneficial working thereof or with respect to any other thing may be imposed or reserved and made binding as far as the law permits by covenant condition or otherwise on the Local Board and the public estates or any part thereof or on the other party and any land sold to him.

Completion of sale of public estates by conveyance.

- 8.—(1.) On a sale of the public estates the Local Board may as regards land sold or intended so to be or as regards easements or other rights or privileges sold or intended so to be convey or create the same by deed for the estate or interest of the Local Board therein to the uses and in the manner requisite for giving effect to the sale.
- (2.) Such a deed to the extent and in the manner to and in which it is expressed or intended to operate and can operate under this Act shall be effectual to pass the land conveyed or the easements rights or privileges created discharged from all the limitations powers and provisions of the Public Estates Act and from all estates interests charges and incumbrances subsisting or to arise thereunder and under the Water Act and the Harbour Act or under any of those Acts but subject to and with the exception of all leases and grants at fee farm rents or otherwise and all grants of easements rights of common or other rights or privileges granted or made for value in money or money's worth or agreed so to be before the date of the deed by the Local Board under the Public Estates Act or other statutory power or being otherwise binding on the successors in title of the Local Board.

- 9. Purchase-money paid to the Local Board on a sale of the public estates is herein-after included in the expression "public estates capital money."
- 10. Public estates capital money subject to payment of claims money. properly payable thereout shall when received by the Local Board Investment be by them applied as follows (namely):—

(1.) In payment of costs charges and expenses of or incidental to capital the exercise of any of the powers or the execution of any of the money. provisions of this part of this Act relating to the public estates; and subject thereto

- (2.) In making or contributing to advances on loan to the Commissioners at rates of interest not exceeding three and a half per centum per annum and on the best security which the Commissioners shall be able to give and for periods not exceeding those for which the Commissioners shall be authorised to borrow or re-borrow of such sums as the Commissioners shall for the time being require and be authorised to borrow or re-borrow; and subject thereto
- (3.) In investment on Government securities with power to vary the investment into or for any other such securities:

Provided always that public estates capital money may pending application thereof under any of the sub-sections of this section preceding the last of such sub-sections be temporarily invested by the Local Board on Government securities the income thereof being added to and dealt with as capital. Any such temporary investment is in the provisions of this part of this Act relating to the public estates referred to by the expression "temporary investment."

11. In the provisions of this part of this Act relating to the public Interpretaestates mines and minerals mean mines and minerals whether already "mines and opened or in work or not and include all minerals and substances in minerals" on or under the land obtainable by underground or by surface working &c. and mining purposes include the sinking and searching for winning working getting making merchantable smelting or otherwise convertirg or working for the purposes of any manufacture carrying away and disposing of mines and minerals in or under the public estates or any other land and the erection of buildings and the execution of engineering and other works suitable for those purposes and securities include stocks funds and shares.

12.—(1.) Public estates capital money while remaining unapplied or uninvested and securities on which an investment (other than a temporary investment) of such money is made shall be held by the Local Board in the same manner and on the same trusts as the

- A.D. 1888. public estates would if no part thereof had been sold have been held.
 - (2.) The income of those securities shall be paid or applied as the income of the public estates sold if not sold would have been payable or applicable.
 - (3.) Those securities may be converted into money which shall be public estates capital money.

Powers exerciseable from time to time.

13. The powers and authorities conferred by the provisions of this part of this Act relating to the public estates on the Local Board shall be exerciseable from time to time.

Water Rate.

Local Board not to make a water rate.

14. From and after the passing of this Act anything in the Water Act and the Harbour Act or either of them to the contrary notwithstanding the Local Board shall not make or levy any water rate being a water rate within the meaning of the thirty-fifth section of the Water Act.

Future charge of moneys borrowed on security of water rate &c.

15. From and after the passing of this Act all moneys borrowed on the security of the water rates by the thirty-fifth section of the Water Act required to be made and levied whether or not such moneys shall have been borrowed on the security of such water rates alone shall be deemed to have been borrowed on the security of the general district rates as well as on any other security (if any) other than such water rates and shall together with all interest payable in respect of such moneys be charged upon the general district rates in the manner and to the extent in all respects as the same would have been charged upon the general district rates if the words "the general district rates" had originally been inserted instead of the words "the water rates" in the instrument whereby the same were charged.

Harbour Loans.

Power to Local Board to charge district rate as collateral security for mortgages created by Commissioners.

16. In addition to the powers for securing the repayment of moneys borrowed by the Commissioners under the authority of the Harbour Act with interest conferred by that Act the Local Board may if they think fit in consideration of moneys lent to the Commissioners under that Act or this Act from time to time by way of further collateral security for the repayment of such moneys with interest charge the repayment of such moneys with interest upon the general district rates: Provided that the aggregate amount which may in any one year become payable in respect of any charge or charges thereby created shall not exceed the amount which might in

such year be produced by a general district rate of sixpence in the A.D. 1888. pound of the assessable value for that year of property assessable to the general district rate: Provided also that such collateral security shall cease at the expiration of fifty years from the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety and that the provision made by the Harbour Act for the payment off of moneys borrowed under the authority of that Act shall apply in the case of moneys to be borrowed under the authority of this Act and in the case of the last-mentioned moneys the first instalment shall be paid or the first payment to the sinking fund made on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety as regards any such moneys then borrowed and in respect of any such moneys borrowed subsequent to that date on the first day of January next following the borrowing thereof. Every charge created under this section shall be deemed to be a mortgage to which the provisions of the two hundred and thirty-sixth to the two hundred and thirty-ninth sections (both inclusive) of the Public Health Act 1875 apply and the provisions of those sections shall apply thereto accordingly.

River Lliedi.

17.—(1.) No part of any building or structure whether the Buildings not same shall be an addition to or in the place of any existing building to be erected over the or not shall after the passing of this Act be erected over any part River Lliedi. of the River Lliedi and every person who shall erect any part of any building or structure in contravention of this enactment shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds and the Local Board may give notice in writing to the owner of any part of any building or structure erected in contravention of this enactment requiring him within a reasonable time to be specified in such notice to pull down and remove so much of such building or structure as shall have been erected over the River Lliedi and if the owner shall make default in complying with such requirement to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the time specified in such notice he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings and in case of default the Local Board may if they think fit pull down and remove so much of such building or structure as such notice required the owner to pull down and remove and the expenses incurred by them in so doing shall be repaid to them by such owner and shall be recoverable as a penalty under this Act is recoverable.

(2.) If at any time it shall appear to the Local Board that any part of any building or structure erected before the passing of this

Act is over any part of the River Lliedi and that it is expedient that so much of such building or structure as is over any part of the River Lliedi should be pulled down and removed the Local Board may if they think fit give notice in writing to the owner of such building or structure requiring him within a reasonable time (but not less than one year) to be specified in such notice to pull down and remove so much of such building or structure as is over any part of the River Lliedi and if the owner shall make default in complying with such requirement to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the time specified in such notice he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings and in case of default the Local Board may if they think fit pull down and remove so much of such building or structure as such notice required the owner to pull down or remove and the expenses incurred by them in so doing shall be repaid to them by such owner and shall be recoverable as a penalty under this Act is recoverable: Provided always that if the owner shall comply with such requirement to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the time specified in such notice (but not otherwise) the expenses incurred by him in so doing together with the value of so much of the building or structure as shall have been pulled down or removed in compliance with such requirement (such value being the value at the time of the said notice being given) shall be repaid to the owner by the Local Board and shall be recoverable as compensation is recoverable under the Public Health Act 1875.

- (3.) Provided that nothing in this section contained shall apply to any building or structure existing at the time of the passing of this Act belonging to the Great Western Railway Company or to any addition to any such building or structure or to any building or structure erected by that company in the place of any existing building or structure belonging to them.
- (4.) And provided further that this section shall not apply to any bridge.

Gas Purchase.

Provision respecting purchase of undertaking of the Llanelly Gaslight Company.

18. If at any time within the period of seven years from the passing of this Act the Local Board shall for the purpose of supplying gas within the district or any part thereof desire to purchase the works lands gas mains and undertaking and the property connected therewith of the Llanelly Gaslight Company and shall give to that company twelve months notice in writing of such desire the said company shall sell and transfer to the Local Board all the works lands gas mains and undertaking and

property connected therewith and all the rights powers and A.D. 1888. privileges of the company for such sum and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the Local Board and the said company and failing such agreement upon such terms and conditions and for such price as may be determined by arbitration in the manner provided by the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act 1845: Provided always that any such purchase shall be deemed to be a purpose of the Public Health Act 1875 and a purpose for which the Local Board may exercise the powers of borrowing conferred by that Act and shall be evidenced by a duly stamped deed of conveyance which shall within three months from the date thereof be produced to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue and in default of such production the ad valorem stamp duty with interest at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum shall be recoverable from the Local Board together with full costs of suit and all costs and charges attending the same: Provided also that no such notice shall be given and no such sale and transfer shall take effect without the sanction of the Local Government Board.

Literary and other Institutions.

- 19.—(1.) The Local Board with the previous consent of the Power to Charity Commissioners for England and Wales under their seal may remove and if they shall desire to and for the purpose of enabling them to sites for and erect a new town hall and public hall with requisite offices and rebuild conveniences upon the existing sites of the Nevill Memorial and Nevill Llanelly Athenæum acquire by agreement new and suitable sites and Llanelly for such memorial and athenæum and may with the like consent Athenæum. on such sites erect suitable new buildings for the accommodation of such memorial and athenæum.
- (2.) From and after such time as the Local Board shall under the provisions of this section have acquired new and suitable sites for and have erected suitable and made ready and opened for use new Nevill Memorial and Llanelly Athenæum buildings such new sites and buildings shall be held by the Local Board in the same manner and upon the same trusts as the existing sites and buildings of such memorial and athenæum would have been held by them if this Act had not been passed and from and after the same time the existing sites and buildings of the Nevill Memorial and the Llanelly Athenæum shall be freed and discharged from all the trusts affecting the same respectively under the hereinbefore recited indentures of the twenty-ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six and the twentieth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

(3.) All reasonable expenses of or incidental to any inspection or inspections report or reports which the said Charity Commissioners shall deem it expedient to have made before they shall give such certificate shall be repaid to them by the Local Board.

Power to agree for transfer of literary &c. institutions to Local Board.

- 20.—(1.) The Local Board may at any time after the passing of this Act make and carry into effect an agreement or agreements with the surviving or continuing trustees committee or managers or the beneficial owners of any existing literary or scientific institution or society for the transfer to the Local Board of the lands buildings and effects of or belonging to that institution or society or vested in them as such trustees committee or managers or owners as aforesaid: Provided that in case any such institution or society shall be vested in trustees a committee or managers no transfer shall be effected which shall be inconsistent with the terms of the deed will or other instrument which declares the trust or unless a resolution approving such transfer be passed by three fourths of the subscribers (if any) to such institution or society present at a meeting specially convened with notice of the business to be transacted thereat nor shall any such transfer whatever be made except with the consent of the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales given under their seal in the case of any institution or society within their jurisdiction.
- (2.) Any such transfer may be carried into effect by a deed duly stamped and truly stating the consideration (if any) and thereupon by virtue of the deed and of this Act the lands buildings and effects comprised in the deed shall be transferred to and vest in the Local Board for such estate and interest therein of the respective Trustees as shall be comprised in the deed and such deed may be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Act or to the like effect with such variations and additions as the circumstances require.

Local Board may make byelaws for institutions &c.

21. The Local Board may from time to time make and when made may from time to time vary alter and amend by elaws for regulating any institution transferred to the Local Board under this Act.

Town Hall &c.

Power to erect new town hall &c.

- 22. The Local Board may erect and furnish a new town hall and public hall with requisite offices and conveniences and may appropriate and use as the site of such new town hall and public hall offices and conveniences one of the pieces of land following (that is to say):—
 - (1.) Any piece of land not exceeding two acres in extent which after the passing of this Act the Local Board may by agreement acquire for the purpose of such site; or

(2.) Any piece of land not exceeding one acre in extent which at A.D. 1888. the passing of this Act formed part of the Llanelly public park or pleasure ground and was vested in the Local Board; or

(3.) The land which at the passing of this Act was vested in the Local Board as trustees of the Nevill Memorial and of the Llanelly Athenæum:

Provided that the Local Board shall not appropriate and use as the site of the new town hall and public hall offices and conveniences any land which was at the passing of this Act vested in them as trustees of the Nevill Memorial or of the Llanelly Athenæum unless and until they shall have acquired new and suitable sites for and have erected suitable and made ready and opened for use new Nevill Memorial and Llanelly Athenæum buildings as in this Act provided and provided that the Local Board shall not expend in respect of the acquisition of a site for and of erecting and furnishing the new town hall and public hall offices and conveniences more than twenty-five thousand pounds nor more than shall be approved by the Local Government Board and any expenditure incurred by the Local Board in acquiring sites for the new Nevill Memorial and Llanelly Athenæum buildings and in erecting and making ready for use such buildings as in this Act provided shall be deemed to be an expenditure made for the purpose of acquiring a site for the new town hall and public hall offices and conveniences.

23. The Local Board may from time to time provide and maintain for their offices waterworks and other establishments including the &c. communications stations of any volunteer fire brigades and the private residences of between the firemen thereof such telegraphic telephonic or other electrical offices. communication between such parts of the district as they may deem fit but such telegraphs and telephones shall not be used for the purpose of transmitting telegrams which are within the exclusive privilege conferred upon Her Majesty's Postmaster-General by the Telegraph Acts 1863 to 1885 and in relation to any such telegraphs or telephones the Telegraph Act 1863 shall apply to the Local Board as if the Local Board were a company authorised by special Act of Parliament to construct and maintain telegraphs but so that it shall not be requisite for the Local Board to give any notice respecting the opening for the purposes of telegraphs or telephones of any street under their own management: Provided always that the Local Board shall not place any telegraphic telephonic or other electrical communication or any work under in upon over along or across any railway or dock or dock entrance or approach except with the consent in writing of the owners or lessees thereof first had and obtained.

Store yard or depôt. 24. The Local Board may lay out any lands vested in them as a store yard or depôt for stone and other materials and may erect and construct thereon stables weighing machines tool houses and other buildings and works for the convenient use of such store yard or depôt and may provide and use railway sidings in connexion therewith.

Restriction as to displacing placing persons belonging to labouring class.

25. The Local Board shall not under the powers of this Act purchase or acquire ten or more houses which after the passing of this Act have been or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers.

For the purposes of this section the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics artisans labourers and others working for wages hawkers costermongers persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family and persons other than domestic servants whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

PART III.—FINANCE.

Borrowing.

Power to borrow.

- 26. The Local Board may from time to time (in addition to any moneys which they are now authorised to borrow or which they may be authorised to borrow under the provisions of any public or local Act) borrow at interest on the security of the district fund and general district rate and for the following purposes the following sums (that is to say):—
 - For the purposes of erecting and furnishing a new town hall public hall and requisite offices and conveniences and acquiring a site therefor such sum as they may be authorised by this Act to expend in respect of those purposes; and
 - For paying the costs charges and expenses of this Act as hereinafter defined and for making reasonable payments to holders of
 securities of the Local Board for their consents or for otherwise
 compensating them for the payment off or redemption of or
 substitution for their securities the sums requisite for those
 purposes:

And in calculating the sums which the Local Board may borrow under the provisions of any other enactment any sums they may borrow under this Act shall not be reckoned and the powers of the

Local Board as to borrowing and re-borrowing shall not be restricted A.D. 1888. by any of the provisions of the Public Health Acts.

27. The two hundred and thirty-sixth to the two hundred and Provisions thirty-ninth sections (both included) of the Public Health Act 1875 shall extend and apply mutatis mutandis to and in relation to all mortgages made under the powers of this part of this Act.

28. All provisions subsisting at the passing of this Act prescribing the time at which and the mode in which any moneys ment of borrowed by the Local Board other than moneys borrowed on the moneys. security of the public estates and then owing or to be re-borrowed in lieu thereof by the Local Board shall be repaid are hereby annulled and repealed and in lieu thereof and with respect to the repayment of moneys to be borrowed under the powers of this Act the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):--

As to repayborrowed

- (1.) The Local Board shall repay—
 - All moneys already borrowed and which on the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight were owing by them and all moneys re-borrowed in lieu thereof within thirty-one years from that date;

All moneys borrowed under the powers of this Act for payment of the costs thereof within ten years from the date of the borrowing of the same;

All moneys borrowed under the powers of this Act for the purposes of erecting and furnishing the new town hall public hall offices and conveniences and acquiring a site therefor within such number of years not exceeding sixty years from the respective dates of the borrowing of the same as the Local Government Board shall in each case determine;

All moneys borrowed under the powers of this Act for making payments to holders of securities of the Local Board for their consents or for otherwise compensating them for the payment off or redemption of or substitution for their securities within the respective periods allowed for the repayment of the loans in respect of which such payments are made:

(2.) And such repayment shall be effected—

Either by equal yearly or half-yearly instalments of principal or of principal and interest;

Or by means of sinking funds;

Or partly by such instalments and partly by sinking funds:

(3.) And the sinking funds shall be provided as follows:—

The Local Board in every year after the respective dates in that behalf by this section prescribed shall appropriate and set apart out of the tolls funds and rates on the security of which such moneys shall have been borrowed such equal

annual sums as will with the accumulations thereof by way of compound interest at three per centum per annum with yearly rests be sufficient to pay off the whole of the principal moneys borrowed on such security within the periods by this Act prescribed:

Provided that in calculating the said sums so to be set apart regard shall be had to the balances (if any) which on the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight may be standing to the credit of the then existing sinking funds and which cannot then be applied in the repayment of loans under the provisions in that behalf in this section contained:

(4.) The payment to the said sinking funds shall commence at the following periods (that is to say):—

For repayment of moneys borrowed and owing on the twentyfifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eightyeight on the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine:

For repayment of moneys to be borrowed under the powers of this Act on the twenty-fifth day of March next following the time of the borrowing of such moneys respectively:

(5.) Provided as follows (that is to say):—

- (A.) The Local Board shall on or before the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine pay into every sinking fund existing at the passing of this Act or into the sinking fund created under this Act all sums due to those funds on the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight and a proportionate part of each yearly payment both for instalments and sinking fund in respect of the period between that date and the date of the last of such yearly payments and shall apply every such sinking fund in or towards the repayment of the loan for which it was set apart;
- (B.) The yearly sums so to be appropriated and set apart shall be invested from time to time and accumulated in the way of compound interest by investing the same and the dividends interest and annual income thereof respectively in statutory securities;
- (c.) The Local Board may at any time apply the whole or part of any sinking fund set apart by them in or towards the repayment of the borrowed moneys for the repayment of which such sinking fund was set apart in such order and manner as they deem proper: Provided that in such case they pay into such sinking fund in each year afterwards

and accumulate as herein-before prescribed until the whole A.D. 1888. of the borrowed moneys to which such sinking fund is applicable are discharged a sum equal to the interest produced by the sinking fund or part thereof so applied at the rate per centum on which the annual payments to the sinking fund are based: Provided also that whenever and so long as the yearly income arising from the sinking fund when invested at the same rate of interest as the borrowed moneys then outstanding shall be equal to the annual interest of such borrowed moneys then outstanding the Local Board may in lieu of investing the said yearly income apply the same in payment of such interest and may during such periods discontinue the payment to such sinking fund of the yearly sums required to be so paid thereto.

29. If the Local Board out of the proceeds of the sale or Sinking disposition of lands or other moneys received on capital account funds may be adjusted other than borrowed moneys repay any principal moneys the pay- in certain ments to the sinking fund (if any) established under the provisions events. of this Act or the amounts of the instalments for the repayment of such principal moneys may be reduced to such extent and upon such terms as may from time to time be approved by the Local Government Board.

30. The two hundred and forty-fifth section the two hundred Audit of and forty-seventh section (except so much thereof as is repealed by accounts. the District Auditors Act 1879) and the two hundred and fortyninth and two hundred and fiftieth sections of the Public Health Act 1875 relating to accounts and their audit and the provisions of the District Auditors Act 1879 so far as the same are applicable shall apply to the accounts of the Local Board under this Act and to the audit of such accounts.

31. The clerk shall within twenty-one days after the expiration Annual of each year during which any sum is required to be set apart for a sinking fund or any instalment is required to be paid under this Government Act transmit to the Local Government Board a return in such form Board with as may be prescribed by that Board and verified by statutory declaration of the clerk if so required by them showing the amount funds. which has been paid as an instalment or invested for the purposes of such sinking fund during the year preceding the making of such return and the description of the securities upon which the same has been invested and also showing the purposes to which any portion of the moneys invested for the sinking fund and the interest thereof have been applied during the same period and the total amount remaining invested at the end of the year and in the event of any wilful default in making such return the clerk shall be liable

return to Local respect to sinking

A.D. 1888. to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds which shall be paid to the Local Government Board and shall be recoverable by that Board in the same manner as penalties recoverable under the Public Health Act 1875 in a summary manner may be recovered by parties aggrieved within the meaning of that Act. If it appear to the Local Government Board by such return or otherwise that the Local Board have failed to pay any instalment or to set apart the sum required by this Act for the sinking fund or have applied any portion of the moneys set apart for that fund or any interest thereof to any purposes other than those authorised by this Act the Local Government Board may by order direct that a sum not exceeding double the amount in respect of which such default shall have been made shall be set apart and invested as part of the sinking fund and such order shall be enforceable by writ of Mandamus to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of the Queen's Beuch Division of the High Court of Justice and the provisions of this section shall apply mutatis mutandis to appropriations and annual repayments.

Power to re-borrow.

32. The Local Board may from time to time borrow at interest on mortgage as aforesaid any money necessary for repaying any principal money borrowed under this Act or the repayment of which is provided for by this Act on the same becoming repayable or for the paying off of any of such principal moneys as they can re-borrow at a lower rate of interest and so from time to time: Provided as follows:-

The time for the repayment of any moneys so re-borrowed shall not be extended beyond the unexpired portion of the terms respectively in that behalf prescribed;

For the purpose of repayment the moneys re-borrowed and the moneys originally borrowed shall be deemed the same loan;

The Local Board shall not re-borrow any moneys paid off by means of instalments or a sinking fund or out of the proceeds of the sale or disposition of land or other moneys received on capital account other than borrowed moneys.

Local Board trusts.

33. The Local Board shall not be bound to see to the execution not to regard of any trust whether expressed or implied or constructive to which any loan or security for loan given by them may be subject but the receipt of the person in whose name any loan or security for loan stands in the register book of the Local Board shall from time to time be a sufficient discharge to the Local Board in respect thereof notwithstanding any trusts to which such loan or security may be subject and whether or not the Local Board have had express or implied notice of any such trust or of any charge or incumbrance upon or transfer of such loan or security or any part thereof or interest thereon not entered in their register and the Local Board shall not

be bound to see to the application of the money paid in any such A.D. 1888. receipt or be answerable or accountable for any loss misapplication or non-application of any of such money.

- 34. The Local Board may if they think fit borrow any moneys Power to which they are by this Act authorised to borrow under the borrow powers and subject to the provisions of the Local Loans Act Loans Act 1875 as amended by the Local Loans Sinking Funds Act 1885 by 1875. means of a loan or loans to be raised by the issue of debentures debenture stock or annuity certificates or partly in one way and partly in another. Any moneys borrowed by the Local Board in manner by this section authorised shall be a charge upon and shall be paid out of the same funds and rates as they would be charged upon and paid out of if raised by way of mortgage under this Act and such funds and rates shall in each case be deemed to be the local rate as defined by the Local Loans Act 1875. Every such loan shall be discharged within the time prescribed in that behalf by this Act: Provided always that if the Local Board at any time think fit to form any such sinking fund all sums paid into the same shall be as soon as may be invested by the Local Board in the manner in which sinking funds are by this Act authorised to be invested or applied in paying off a portion of the principal moneys owing by the Local Board.
- 35. All moneys borrowed by the Local Board under the powers Application of this Act shall be applied only to the purposes for which they are respectively authorised to be borrowed and to which capital is properly applicable.

Miscellaneous.

36. The Local Board may if they think fit form a renewal fund Power to to be called "the waterworks renewal fund" to provide for the waterworks renewal of their waterworks and mains and such fund shall be renewal formed by annually appropriating thereto out of the net profits fund. (if any) of the water undertaking of the Local Board such sum not exceeding four hundred pounds in any one year as they from time to time deem expedient and investing the same at compound interest in or upon any statutory security and accumulating the same and the Local Board may from time to time or at any time resort to that fund for any such renewals as in this section authorised. The said fund shall at no time exceed the sum of ten thousand pounds but if it be reduced at any time it may be restored to the said amount. Whenever and so long as the said fund shall amount to ten thousand pounds the interest thereon shall be paid into the district fund.

PART IV .-- INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

Notification of Infectious Disease.

Notice to be given of persons suffering from infectious disease.

37. The following provisions shall apply to and be in force in the district (that is to say):—

- (1.) If any inmate of any building used for human habitation be suffering from any infectious disease the occupier or the person having the charge management or control of such building (or if such occupier or person be prevented by reason of illness or other unavoidable cause then the person in charge of such inmate) shall so soon as he shall become aware of the existence in any such inmate of any such disease forthwith give notice thereof to the medical officer of health at his office;
- (2.) If such inmate be not a member of the family of such occupier or person the head of the family (resident in such building) to which such inmate belongs or if there be no such head or if such head be prevented by illness or other unavoidable cause then such inmate (unless prevented by reason of such disease or of youth) shall on becoming aware of the existence in such inmate or in his own person as the case may be of such disease forthwith give notice thereof to such occupier or person;
- (3.) The Local Board shall provide and supply gratuitously to every registered medical practitioner resident or practising in the district who shall apply for the same forms for the certificate or declaration to be made by such medical practitioner of the particulars herein-after mentioned in relation to such cases according to the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Act;
- (4.) Every registered medical practitioner attending on or called in to visit such inmate shall on becoming aware that such inmate is suffering from any infectious disease forthwith fill up sign and deliver or send to the medical officer of health at his office a certificate or declaration stating according to the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Act the name of such inmate the situation of such building the name of such occupier or person and the nature of the infectious disease from which in the opinion of such medical practitioner such inmate is suffering;
- (5.) The Local Board shall pay to every registered medical practitioner who shall in pursuance of this section duly make and give any such certificate or declaration a fee of two shillings

and sixpence for each such certificate or declaration in respect of cases occurring in his private practice and a fee of one shilling for each such certificate or declaration in respect of cases occurring in his practice as a medical officer to any public body or institution;

- (6.) Every person who shall wilfully offend against any of the enactments contained in this section shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
- 38. The Local Government Board may from time to time on the application of the Local Board by order declare that any infectious disease other than those specifically mentioned in this Act shall be deemed to be an infectious disease within and subject be infectious to the provisions of this Act.
 - Infectious diseases other than those specified may be declared to diseases to which this Act applies.
 - (1.) Any such order may be permanent or temporary only and if temporary the period during which it is to continue in force shall be specified therein and the Local Board shall give public notice of the order by publishing the same by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers circulating in the district and after such public notice has been given the provisions of the section of this Act whereof the marginal note is "Notice to be given of persons suffering from infectious disease" shall so long as the order continues in force apply to the disease specified therein in like manner in all respects as if the disease were an infectious disease specifically mentioned in this Act;
 - (2.) The production of the newspaper containing a copy of the order shall be conclusive evidence that public notice of the order has been so given;
 - (3.) The Local Board shall immediately after any such order shall have been made send a copy thereof to each registered medical practitioner residing in the district but the omission to send any such copy shall not affect the validity of such order.

Provisions as to dealing with Infectious Disease.

39.—(1.) Whenever it shall be certified to the Local Board by Cowkeepers the medical officer of health or by any other registered medical and others to practitioner that the spread of infectious disease is in the opinion of furnish lists such medical officer of health or medical practitioner attributable to in certain the milk supplied by any cowkeeper purveyor of milk or occupier cases. of a dairy milk store or milk shop the Local Board may require such cowkeeper purveyor of milk or occupier to furnish to them

A.D. 1888. within a time to be fixed by them a full and complete list of the names and addresses of all his customers within the district and such cowkeeper purveyor of milk or occupier shall furnish such list accordingly and the Local Board shall pay to him for every such list the sum of sixpence and after the rate of sixpence for every twenty-five names contained therein but no such payment shall exceed three shillings and every person who shall wilfully or knowingly offend against this enactment shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Medical officer of health may inspect dairies &c. without district in certain cases.

(2.) In case the medical officer of health shall have reasonable cause to believe that any person in the district is suffering from infectious disease attributable to milk supplied within the district from any farmhouse dairy cowshed milk store milk shop or place situate beyond the district or that the consumption of milk from such farmhouse dairy cowshed milk store milk shop or place is likely to cause infectious disease to any person residing in the district the medical officer of health shall if authorised in that behalf by an order of a justice having jurisdiction where such farmhouse dairy cowshed milk store milk shop or place is situate have power to inspect such farmhouse dairy cowshed milk store milk shop or place and if on such inspection he shall be of opinion that infectious disease is caused or is likely to arise from consumption of the milk supplied therefrom he shall report thereon to the Local Board who may thereupon give notice to the occupier of such farmhouse dairy cowshed milk store milk shop or place not to supply any milk therefrom within the district until such notice has been withdrawn by the Local Board and the Local Board shall forthwith give notice of the facts to the local authority acting in execution of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts 1878 to 1886 of the district in which such farmhouse dairy cowshed milk store milk shop or place is situate in order that such further measures may be adopted in relation thereto as may be considered proper and as may be within the province of such last-mentioned authority. Any person refusing to permit the medical officer of health on production of such order as aforesaid to inspect any such farmhouse dairy cowshed milk store milk shop or place or after any such notice not to supply milk as aforesaid has been given supplying any milk therefrom in contravention of such notice or selling it for consumption in the district until such notice has been withdrawn as aforesaid shall on summary conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for such offence and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings: Provided always that proceedings for the recovery of any penalty under this enactment shall be taken before the justices of the peace

having jurisdiction where the said farmhouse dairy cowshed milk A.D. 1888. store milk shop or place is situate.

(3.) Nothing in or done under sub-sections (1) and (2) of this section shall interfere with the operation or effect of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts 1878 to 1886 or of any order license or animals &c. act of Her Majesty's Privy Council or the Local Government Board made granted or done or to be made granted or done thereunder or of any order regulation license or act of a local authority made granted or done or to be made granted or done under any such order of the Privy Council or the Local Government Board or exempt the dairies milk stores or milk shops to which this Act relates or any building or thing whatsoever or any person from the provisions of any general Act relating to dairies milk or animals already passed or to be passed in this or any future session of Parliament.

Saving for Acts relating to dairies

40. Whenever it shall be certified to the Local Board by the Persons medical officer of health that it is desirable with a view to prevent engaged in the spread of infectious disease that he should be furnished with a list of the customers of any person earning a livelihood or deriving clothes to gain by the washing or mangling of clothes the Local Board may of owners of require such person to furnish to them a full and complete list of clothes in the names and addresses of the owners of clothes for whom such certain cases. person washes or mangles or has washed or mangled during the past six weeks and such person shall furnish such list accordingly and the Local Board shall pay to him or her for every such list the sum of sixpence and after the rate of sixpence for every twentyfive names contained therein but no such payment shall exceed three shillings and every person who shall wilfully or knowingly offend against this enactment shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

washing or mangling furnish lists

41. Where the Local Board are of opinion on the certificate of Further their medical officer of health or of any other registered medical powers in practitioner that the cleansing and disinfecting of any house or disinfection part thereof and of any articles therein likely to communicate any of premises. infectious disease or to retain infection would tend to prevent or to check infectious disease and that such cleansing and disinfection could more effectually be carried out by the Local Board than by the owner or occupier of such house or part thereof the Local Board without requiring such owner or occupier to carry out such cleansing and disinfection as aforesaid may if they think fit but at their own cost themselves cleanse and disinfect such house or part thereof and articles and may for that purpose remove any such articles and shall

make compensation to such owners or occupiers for all property or articles destroyed or injured by the exercise of the provisions of this section. Any person who shall obstruct any duly authorised officer of the Local Board in carrying out this enactment shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Penalty on persons ceasing to occupy houses without previous disinfection or giving notice to owner or making false answers.

42. Every person who shall cease to occupy any house room or part of a house in which any person has within six weeks previously been suffering from any infectious disease without having such house room or part of a house and all articles therein liable to retain infection disinfected to the satisfaction of a registered medical practitioner as testified by a certificate signed by him or without first giving to the owner of such house room or part of a house notice of the previous existence of such disease and every person ceasing to occupy any house room or part of a house and who on any question by the owner thereof or by any person negotiating for the hire of such house room or part of a house as to the fact of there having within six weeks previously been therein any person suffering from any infectious disease knowingly makes a false answer shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Prohibiting the retention of dead bodies in

43. No person shall without the sanction in writing of the medical officer of health or other registered medical practitioner retain unburied elsewhere than in a mortuary for more than fortycertain cases. eight hours the dead body of any person who has died from any infectious disease and any person offending against this enactment shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Bodies of persons dying in hospital &c. of infectious diseases to be removed only for burial.

44. If any person shall die from any infectious disease in any hospital or place of temporary accommodation and the medical officer of health or any other registered medical practitioner certifies that in his opinion it is desirable in order to prevent the risk of communicating any infectious disease or of spreading infection that the dead body shall not be removed from such hospital or place except for the purpose of being forthwith buried it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to remove such dead body from such hospital or place except for the last-mentioned purpose and when the dead body is taken out of such hospital or place for that purpose it shall be forthwith carried or taken directly to some cemetery or place of burial and shall be forthwith there buried and any person wilfully offending against this enactment shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds: But nothing in this enactment shall prevent the removal of any dead body from any such

hospital or place of temporary accommodation to any mortuary and A.D. 1888. such mortuary shall for the purposes of this section be deemed to be part of such hospital or place of temporary accommodation.

45. Where the body of any person who has died from any Justices may infectious disease remains unburied elsewhere than in a mortuary for in certain more than forty-eight hours after death without the sanction of the dead bodies medical officer of health or other registered medical practitioner to be buried. or is retained in a room in which persons live or sleep or where the dead body of any person is retained in any house or building so as to endanger the health of the inmates of such house or building or of any adjoining or neighbouring house or building any justice may on the application of the medical officer of health order the body to be removed at the cost of the Local Board to any mortuary provided by the Local Board and may direct the same to be buried within a time to be limited in the order or such justice may in the case of the body of any person who has died from any infectious disease or in any case in which he shall consider immediate burial necessary direct such body to be so buried without requiring the same to be removed to a mortuary and unless the friends or relatives of the deceased undertake to bury and do bury the body within the time limited by such order it shall be the duty of the relieving officer to bury such body at the expense of the poor rate but any expense so incurred may be recovered by the relieving officer in a summary manner from any person legally liable to pay the expense of such burial. Any person obstructing the execution of an order made by a justice under this enactment shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

46. Any person who hires or uses a public conveyance other Corpses not than a hearse for the conveyance of the corpse of a person who has to be carried in public died from any infectious disease without previously notifying to the conveyances owner or driver of such public conveyance that the person whose without corpse is or is intended to be so conveyed has died from infectious disease and any owner or driver of a public conveyance other than a hearse which has been used for conveying the corpse of a person who has died from infectious disease who shall not immediately afterwards provide for the disinfection of such conveyance shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

47. Any keeper of a common lodging house in the district Penalty for who fails to give the notice required by section eighty-four of the Public Health Act 1875 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Health Act. forty shillings and to a daily penalty not exceeding five shillings.

offences under Public

48. The Local Board shall from time to time provide temporary Temporary shelter or house accommodation for the members of any family shelter

nursing &c.

A.D. 1888. in which any infectious disease has appeared and who have been compelled to leave their dwelling for the purpose of enabling such dwelling to be disinfected and the Local Board shall also provide or contract with some person or persons to provide nurses for attendance upon persons suffering from any infectious disease within the district or upon children who may have been compelled to leave their dwelling as aforesaid and shall be enabled to charge a reasonable sum for the service of any nurse provided by them.

PART V.—SANITARY.

For preventing the fouling of the waterworks of the Local Board by animals.

49. If any dog or other animal shall by default of the owner or person in charge enter any stream reservoir or aqueduct or other waterworks belonging to the Local Board such owner or person in charge shall be liable to the penalties provided by the sixty-first section of the Waterworks Clauses Act 1847: Provided always that this section shall not apply to cattle grazing in or upon any land adjoining to or abutting upon any such stream reservoir aqueduct or waterworks.

Provision for destruction of filth and rubbish.

50. For the purpose of destroying night soil dung ashes and other filth and rubbish the Local Board may provide furnaces convertors destructors destroyers and other things for similar purposes but nothing in this section shall authorise the Local Board to create a nuisance and the purposes of this section shall be deemed to be purposes of the Public Health Act 1875 and purposes for which the Local Board may exercise the powers of borrowing conferred by that Act.

Ground not to be filled up or embanked with offensive matter.

51. It shall not be lawful to raise fill or embank any ground with any offensive or unwholesome matter and every person who shall do or cause to be done any act in contravention of this section shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Placing matters in sewers so as to affect run of water.

52. It shall not be lawful for any person to throw or to suffer or permit to be thrown or to pass into any drain or sewer any matter or substance which would interfere with the free flow of the sewage or surface or storm water or which would be injurious to the construction of the drains or sewers and every person offending against this enactment shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Steam not to be turned into sewers.

53. It shall be unlawful for any person to turn or knowingly permit to enter into any sewer of the Local Board or into any drain communicating with any such sewer any waste steam or heated water from any boiler or other receptacle used with any steam

- engine or for any manufacturing or trade purpose (such water being of a higher temperature than one hundred and ten degrees of Fahrenheit) and every person who having had notice in writing of the provisions of this section given to him by the Local Board shall at any time after the expiration of seven days from the service upon him of such notice turn or knowingly permit to enter into any such sewer or drain any such waste steam or heated water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings. Any officer of the Local Board shall at any time if he so desire be admitted into or upon any premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this section are being contravened and if such admission shall be refused any justice on complaint thereof on oath by any officer of the Local Board (made after reasonable notice in writing of such intended complaint shall have been given by the Local Board to the occupier of such premises) may by order under his hand require the occupier of such premises to admit any officer of the Local Board into or upon such premises and such order shall continue in force until the offence shall have ceased or any works necessary to prevent the recurrence thereof shall have been executed. Every person who shall obstruct any officer of the Local Board in the execution of any such order shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
- 54. When any building whether built before or after the passing Power to of this Act shall be provided with sufficient and suitable pan-closet require privies &c. or watercloset or earth-closet or ashtub or other like accommoda- to be filled tion to the satisfaction of the Local Board they may give notice in up. writing to the owner or occupier of such building requiring him within a reasonable time to be specified in such notice to fill up any existing privy or ashpit and if such owner or occupier shall make default in complying with such requirement to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the time specified in such notice he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings and to a daily penalty not exceeding twenty shillings and in case of default the Local Board may if they think fit execute the works necessary for carrying out such requirement and the expenses incurred by them in so doing shall be repaid to them by such owner or occupier and shall be recoverable as a penalty under this Act is recoverable.
- 55. If any privy pan-closet watercloset earth-closet ashpit ashtub Penalty for or urinal used in common by the occupiers of two or more buildings not cleansing closet &c. or of separate parts of the same building or the approaches to or the walls floors seats or fittings of any such privy pan-closet watercloset earth-closet ashpit ashtub or urinal or any of them

A.D. 1888. shall be in such a state or condition as to be a nuisance for want of the proper cleansing thereof then any one of the persons who shall have the use thereof in common as aforesaid and who shall be in default or in the absence of proof satisfactory to the justices as to which of them shall be in default each of the persons who shall have the use thereof in common as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings and to a daily penalty not exceeding five shillings.

Penalty for injuring a privy.

56. If any person shall injure or improperly foul any privy pan-closet watercloset earth-closet ashpit ashtub or urinal which shall be used in common by the occupiers of two or more buildings or of separate parts of the same building he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings.

Water supply to closets.

57. Every watercloset shall have a good supply of water laid on and an efficient flushing apparatus attached thereto and shall have an opening communicating directly with the external air or shall be otherwise furnished with sufficient means of ventilation and the pipes which shall immediately supply water to a watercloset and to the flushing apparatus attached thereto shall be so arranged that water for any other purpose than flushing the closet cannot be drawn therefrom.

Any owner of any building whether built before or after the passing of this Act who shall after the expiration of six months from the passing of this Act fail to provide and maintain efficient flushing apparatus or means of ventilation for any watercloset in or connected with such building in accordance with the provisions of this section and any occupier of any such building who shall after the expiration of the like period fail to keep a good supply of water to any such watercloset in accordance with the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings. Notice in writing of the provisions of this section shall be served by the Local Board upon an owner at least two months before any proceedings under this section shall be taken against him.

Prevention of lock-up shops and other places of business being improperly used for purposes of habitation.

58.—(1.) Where on the plan of any building whether built before or after the passing of this Act as deposited with and approved by the Local Board a part of such building is described or shown as or appears to be intended to be separated from the remainder of such building for the purpose of being used as a lock-up shop workshop shed or place of business and not a dwellinghouse the use of such part of such building for the purposes of human habitation shall be an offence and every person who shall wilfully so use or knowingly suffer to be so used such part of such

building shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not A.D. 1888. exceeding forty shillings and to a daily penalty not exceeding twenty shillings.

- (2.) Provided that if such part of such building has in the rear thereof and adjoining and exclusively belonging thereto such an open space as is required by any Act or byelaw for the time being in force with respect to buildings intended to be used as dwellinghouses and if such part of such building has undergone the structural alterations (if any) necessary in the opinion of the Local Board for converting it into a dwelling-house the Local Board may on the application of the owner thereof authorise the same to be used as a dwelling-house.
- (3.) Any justice of the peace by warrant under his hand may authorise any officer of the Local Board at any time to enter upon and examine any building suspected of being used in contravention of this section.
- (4.) Every person who shall prevent or obstruct any such officer so authorised from or in making such inspection shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings and to a daily penalty not exceeding the like sum.
- 59. The Local Board may from time to time give notice in Urinals for writing to the owner or occupier of any inn public-house or beer- inns publicshop whether built before or after the passing of this Act requiring him within a reasonable time to be specified in such notice to provide and maintain upon or adjoining such premises a urinal or urinals and if such owner or occupier shall make default in complying with such requirement to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the time specified in such notice he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings and to a daily penalty not exceeding twenty shillings.

- 60.—(1.) No person shall after the passing of this Act make Urinals not or provide any urinal or similar convenience in any street or public place without the consent in writing of the Local Board.
- (2.) The Local Board may from time to time give notice in out consent writing to the owner or occupier of any building or land requiring of Location Board. him within a reasonable time to be specified in such notice to remove any urinal or similar convenience belonging thereto or thereon which shall in the opinion of the Local Board be so situated or constructed as to be a nuisance or offensive to public decency and if such owner or occupier shall make default in complying with such requirement within the time specified in such notice the Local Board may if they think fit remove such urinal or similar convenience and the expenses incurred by them in so doing shall be

to be placed in public places withof Local

A.D. 1888. repaid to them by such owner or occupier and shall be recoverable as a penalty under this Act is recoverable.

(3.) Provided that nothing in this section contained shall extend or apply to any urinal or similar convenience now or hereafter to be erected by any railway company at or within any railway station or station yard.

Local Board may make communications between private drains and their sewers on payment &c.

61. If the owner or occupier of any premises shall desire that the sewer or drain from such premises shall be made to communicate with any sewer of the Local Board such communication shall be made by the Local Board upon the cost or estimated cost of making the communication being paid to the Local Board or the payment thereof to them being secured to their satisfaction and the Local Board may execute all works necessary for that purpose.

Local Board may agree to make drains at expense of owner.

62. The Local Board may agree with the owner or occupier of any premises that any sewer or drain required to be made altered or enlarged by such owner or occupier or any part of such sewer or drain shall as to so much thereof as shall be in a street be constructed made altered and enlarged by the Local Board and the cost price of making altering or enlarging such sewer or drain and also the cost of preparing the requisite plans and sections for and superintending the execution of the works as estimated or certified by the surveyor shall be paid in advance to the Local Board by the owner or occupier so agreeing.

Extension of section 41 of the Public Health Act 1875.

63. In cases where two or more houses are connected with a single private drain which conveys their drainage into a public sewer the Local Board shall have all powers conferred by the forty-first section of the Public Health Act 1875 and any expense incurred by them in executing any works under the powers conferred upon them by this section shall be repaid to them by the owners in such proportions as shall be settled by the surveyor or (in case of dispute) by arbitration under the Public Health Act 1875 and shall be recoverable as penalties under this Act are recoverable or shall be deemed private improvement expenses and be recoverable accordingly.

Pipes from slopstones to be disconnected from sewers.

64. Every pipe from any slopstone in a building whether built before or after the passing of this Act shall where practicable be carried through the external wall of such building and be constructed so as to discharge in the open air on the outside of such building over a channel leading to a gully-grating at a suitable distance and every gulley-grating or other inlet to the drains shall be properly trapped: Provided always that with respect to a building built before the passing of this Act any penalty for an offence against the provisions of this section shall not be enforced

unless default has been made for twenty-eight days in complying with a notice in writing given by the Local Board the surveyor or the inspector of nuisances requiring the owner or occupier of such building to comply with the provisions of this section.

65. In addition to all other powers vested in the Local Board Summary the Local Board if it shall appear to them on the report of the surveyor or inspector of nuisances that any building whether built and drains before or after the passing of this Act is not provided with a proper for dwellingsink or drain or other necessary appliances for carrying off refuse water from such building may give notice in writing to the owner or occupier of such building requiring him in the manner and within the time to be specified in such notice to provide such sink drain or other appliances and if such owner or occupier shall make default in complying with such requirement to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the time specified in such notice he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings and in case of default the Local Board may if they think fit themselves provide such sink drain or other appliances and the expenses incurred by them in so doing shall be repaid to them by such owner or occupier and shall be recoverable as a penalty under this Act is recoverable.

66. The provisions contained in the one hundred and sixteenth Extension of to the one hundred and nineteenth sections (both inclusive) of the sections 116 Public Health Act 1875 shall extend and apply to all articles inclusive of intended for the food of man sold or exposed for sale or deposited Health Act in any place for the purpose of sale or of preparation for sale within 1875. the district.

67. The one hundred and seventeenth section of the Public Extending Health Act 1875 shall extend and apply to every diseased unsound powers as to unwholesome article intended for the food of man sold or exposed food. for sale or deposited in any place for the purpose of sale or of preparation for sale whether such article be or be not seized and carried away to be dealt with by any justice or ordered by any justice to be destroyed or disposed of as mentioned in such section: Provided that the justice before whom any complaint with respect to such article of food is made be satisfied on the evidence laid before him that such article of food was diseased or unsound or unwholesome or unfit for the food of man.

Part VI.—Streets Buildings &c.

68. The Local Board may by order from time to time determine Power to and declare the points or limits at or within which any street is to define streets. be taken as beginning and ending.

Back streets to be laid out.

69. Every new street intended as the principal or front access to a continuous line of dwelling-houses shall unless the Local Board otherwise allow have provided and set out in connexion with it one or more back streets fifteen feet wide in such manner as to afford access for carts to the back of every house in such continuous line of dwelling-houses in the new street and such back streets shall be kept free from any obstruction and uncovered.

Power to vary line of new streets.

70. The Local Board may vary or alter the intended position or direction of any intended new street for the purpose of causing it to communicate in a direct line with any other street adjoining or leading thereto. In cases where the Local Board put in force this enactment they shall be liable to pay to any person prejudicially affected thereby compensation recoverable as compensation is recoverable under the Public Health Act 1875.

Formation construction &c. of new streets before building.

71. It shall not be lawful for any person except with the consent in writing of the Local Board to erect or to begin to erect any new building abutting upon any new street unless plans and sections of such new street shall have been previously approved by the Local Board nor until the carriageway and footways of such new street shall have been formed to the levels and of the widths shown on the approved plans and sections thereof and constructed and sewered to the satisfaction of the Local Board in accordance with the one hundred and fiftieth section of the Public Health Act 1875 and any person who shall offend against this enactment shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings: Provided always that if a new street shall have been formed to the levels and of the widths shown on the approved plans and sections thereof and the carriageway and footways of such new street and the sewer thereof from a junction (if any) of such new street with an existing street or if there be no such junction from one end of such new street to a point one hundred feet beyond such new building shall have been formed and constructed as aforesaid then the penalties in this section mentioned shall not be recoverable.

Amendment of section 156 of the Public Health Act 1875.

From and after the passing of this Act the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of the Public Health Act 1875 shall for the purposes of its application in respect of any house or building being a new building be read and have effect as if that section had been enacted in the words following (that is to say):—

If the footway or kerbs of any street belonging to or under Recovery of the management of the Local Board shall be injured by or in conse- caused to quence of any excavation or other work on lands adjoining to such footways by footway or kerbs the Local Board may repair or replace the footway or kerbs injured and all damages and expenses of or arising from such injury and repair or replacement shall be paid to the Local Board by the occupier or the owner of the lands on which such excavation or other work shall have been made who shall have caused the damage and shall be recoverable as penalties under this Act are recoverable.

74. All bridges (other than bridges which the inhabitants of the county of Carmarthen or of any hundred therein are by law liable to maintain and repair and other than bridges authorised to be erected altered or enlarged or maintained by any railway company) after the passing of this Act erected either as carriageways or footways shall be built substantially to the satisfaction of the Local Board and shall be of such width as the Local Board may approve.

Certain bridges to be built to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

75. The Local Board in cases where temporary repairs only are As to temporequired to any street not being a highway repairable by the rary repairs inhabitants at large nor any street or approach road carriageway or streets. pathway belonging to any railway company may from time to time give notice in writing to the owners of the lands or buildings adjoining to or abutting on any such street requiring them to execute within a time to be specified in such notice such temporary repairs in and upon such street as shall be specified in such notice and if any owner shall make default in complying with such requirement to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the time specified in such notice the Local Board may if they think fit execute such repairs and the expenses thereof shall be deemed private improvement expenses and be recoverable from the person or persons in default.

76. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause the Height of level of the lowest floor of every building of which there shall be no basement floor or cellar or underground room to be at least twelve inches above the level of the kerbstone immediately in front of such building and shall cause the habitable rooms and attics of every new building to be of the following height:—

Every habitable room (not being an attic) shall be not less than nine feet in height at least from the floor to the ceiling thereof; Every attic shall be eight feet in height at least above one fourth of the area of the floor and the perpendicular walls of every attic shall at least be five feet in height.

Every person who shall offend against this enactment shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Hearths to chimney openings.

77. Every fireplace opening or chimney opening in a new building shall have a sufficient hearth or horizontal slab of durable and incombustible material at the level of the floor extending throughout the length and depth of such opening and to a distance of at least eighteen inches beyond the face of the chimney breast and at least six inches beyond each side of the opening of the chimney-piece. Every such hearth shall be laid upon a bed of cement concrete brick or other compact or incombustible material having a depth of at least seven inches below the upper surface of the hearth and in no case shall the hearth be supported or rest on wood or timber.

Power to prohibit cellars in parts of district liable to floods.

78. The Local Board may from time to time prohibit in any part of the district liable to be flooded from any stream watercourse or sewer or abutting upon any stream or watercourse the construction of any cellar or basement storey in any new building being a dwelling-house and may regulate the level of the ground floor of any new building in such part of the district.

Back yards to be paved &c.

79. The back yards of all houses which shall be built after the passing of this Act shall be formed with such fall and shall for the space of at least one hundred and fifty square feet be flagged or asphalted or paved with such materials as shall be satisfactory to the Local Board for the purpose of carrying off the surface water to the drains of such houses and if the back yard of any house erected before or after the passing of this Act shall not be so formed flagged asphalted or paved so as to allow of the surface water being carried off as aforesaid the Local Board may give to the owner or occupier of such house notice in writing requiring him within seven days after such notice shall have been so given to proceed to form and to flag asphalte or pave such back yard so as to allow of the surface water being carried off to the drain of such house and within twenty-one days after such notice shall have been so given to complete such several works to the satisfaction of the Local Board and if such owner or occupier shall make default in complying with any of such requirements to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the respective times aforesaid the Local Board may if

they think fit execute the works necessary for carrying out such A.D. 1888. requirements and the expenses incurred by them in so doing shall be paid to the Local Board by such owner or occupier and shall be recoverable as a penalty under this Act is recoverable or shall be deemed private improvement expenses and be recoverable accordingly.

80. Whenever any opening is left or any steps or other projections are placed in any garden forecourt area or space left in forecourts front of any building whether erected before or after the passing of fenced off this Act the owner of such garden forecourt area or space shall well from streets. and sufficiently fence the same off from the footpath or street by a railing or parapet or dwarf wall and palisades or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Local Board but whenever any garden forecourt area or space left in front of any building is free from any opening or steps or other projections the owner may without constructing any fence define if he desire so to do the extent of such garden forecourt area or space or such portion thereof as he may not wish to give to the street by a line of stone or other suitable material three inches or thereabouts wide by twelve inches or thereabouts deep laid flush with the surface of the footpath the object of this enactment being that at the same time footpaths shall be freed from objectionable obstructions and inconvenient differences of level and owners of buildings secured in their full rights over any lands they may wish to retain in front of their buildings.

Gardens &c. to be

81. The entrance to any street or court shall not after the Entrance to passing of this Act be closed or narrowed or built over or the height courts &c. or headway thereof lowered without in each case the consent of the interfered Local Board in writing.

not to be with.

82. If at any time it shall appear to the Local Board on the report of the surveyor that any vault arch cellar or other excavation is ruinous decayed or dangerous the Local Board may give notice in writing to the owner thereof requiring him forthwith sufficiently to fence stay shore or protect the same and also within a time to be specified in such notice to reconstruct or sufficiently repair the same: And if such owner shall make default in complying with such requirement to the satisfaction of the Local Board within the time specified in such notice such owner shall and if any person shall after the passing of this Act build construct or make any vault arch cellar or other excavation in contravention of any of the provisions of this section such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Buildings under streets.

83. No coal-shoot area or cellar grating or opening shall after Coal-shoots the passing of this Act be placed in the footway or carriageway of &c.

any street without the consent in writing of the Local Board and then only if formed of the materials and size in the manner in such position and with such protection as may be specified by the Local Board in each particular case and such coal-shoot area or cellar grating or opening shall afterwards be kept in repair by the owner.

Certificate
that houses
fulfil certain
requirements.

84. No building which was not at the passing of this Act occupied as a dwelling-house shall be so occupied until the drainage thereof shall have been made and completed and a proper water supply shall have been laid on thereto nor until a certificate shall have been granted by the surveyor to the owner that such house is in every respect in accordance with the requirements for the time being in force: Provided that if the surveyor shall fail to give such certificate within twenty-one days after a written application for it shall have been made to him by the owner of such building and shall not in the meantime have specified to the owner which of the aforesaid requirements have not been complied with with respect to such building then such building shall be thenceforth deemed to be in every respect in accordance with the aforesaid requirements and may be occupied as a dwelling-house and if any building shall be occupied contrary to the provisions of this section the owner of such building if he shall occupy or shall allow to be occupied and every person who shall wilfully and knowingly occupy such building as a dwelling-house shall be deemed to have committed an offence against the provisions of this section and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every day during which such offence shall continue.

Fencing in of vacant land &c.

85.—(1.) The Local Board may from time to time give notice in writing to the owner or occupier of—

Any land in which any pond or sheet of water is situate or which in the opinion of the Local Board may be a source of danger to the public;

requiring him to cause such land to be fenced in with a fence sufficient to prevent the public having access to such land except by a gate or entrance under the control of such owner or occupier.

(2.) Any person who shall neglect or refuse for the space of twenty-eight days after service upon him of any notice under this section to comply with the requirements of such notice shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings and to a daily penalty not exceeding ten shillings.

Means of ingress to and egress from places of public resort.

86. Every building which had not been before or at the passing of this Act used as a place of public resort but which shall after the passing of this Act be so used shall to the satisfaction of the Local Board be substantially constructed and supplied with ample safe and convenient means of ingress and egress for the use of

the public regard being had to the purposes for which such building is intended to be used and to the number of persons likely to be assembled at any one time therein and no such building shall at any time be used as a place of public resort unless the provisions of this section shall have been complied with and the means of ingress and egress to and from such building shall be during the whole time that such building shall be so used as available and unobstructed as the Local Board shall require and whenever any building shall be used as a place of public resort contrary to the provisions of this section the occupier or person in charge thereof and where such place is let for any period less than one year the owner thereof as well shall be deemed to have committed an offence against the provisions of this section. Every person who shall offend against the provisions of this section shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

87. The owner of any oven to be used by any baker for the Ovens and first time after the passing of this Act and of any furnace to be have protectused by any tradesman or artificer for the first time after the passing ing walls. of this Act shall construct a wall of not less than nine inches in thickness between the fire of the oven or furnace and the wall of the building in which such oven or furnace shall be and such wall shall be constructed above below and around the oven or furnace to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

88. With respect to the height of chimneys the following Height of provisions shall have effect (that is to say):---

chimneys.

- (1.) In every case except with the consent of the Local Board signed by the clerk every new chimney of whatever material intended to be used in connexion with the furnace of a fixed steam-engine or boiler or bakehouse or in connexion with any trade or business (save as herein-after excepted) shall not be less than thirty feet high;
- (2.) No portable steam-engine shall after the passing of this Act be erected or used within ninety feet of any occupied dwelling-house unless connected with a chimney of such height not less than thirty feet as the Local Board may in each case prescribe but it shall not be permissible for the Local Board in any such case to prescribe a greater height than one hundred feet;
- (3.) All steam ejected from any fixed steam-engine or the boiler thereof and all steam arising or produced in any trade or business shall be discharged in such manner as not to be an annoyance to the public;
- (4.) The foregoing provisions of this section shall not apply to locomotives used upon any railway or tramway or to portable

- steam-engines in use for agricultural purposes or to steam rollers or fire-engines or to steam-engines driving mortar mills in cases where the Local Board see fit to allow mortar mills to be so driven for periods of time limited by them;
- (5.) Any person who shall offend against any provision of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding twenty shillings.

Undertakings &c. to bind successive owners.

89. Every undertaking or agreement in writing given by or to the Local Board to or by or on behalf of any owner of property on the passing of plans or for the removal of obstructions or otherwise in connexion with the property of such owner shall be binding upon the owner of the property for the time being and upon his successors in title and upon the Local Board and may be enforced by either party by penalty in any court of summary jurisdiction such penalty not exceeding five pounds for each breach of such undertaking or agreement and twenty shillings for each day during which such breach continues and such owner shall be entitled to require from the Local Board a copy of such undertaking or agreement.

Exemption of buildings of railway companies.

90. There shall be exempted from so much of the provisions of this Act as relates to buildings and structures and sanitary purposes every building (not being a building used solely as a dwelling-house) structure chimney or work in the possession of and used or intended to be used for the purpose of any railway company under the provisions of any Act of Parliament.

PART VII.—PRIVATE STREET WORKS.

Interpretation of "paving flagging."

91. In this part of this Act and in the one hundred and fiftieth and one hundred and fifty-second sections of the Public Health Act metalling and 1875 the expression "paving metalling and flagging" shall include macadamising asphalting gravelling kerbing and every method of making a carriageway or footway and words referring to paving metalling and flagging shall be construed accordingly.

Private street works.

92.—(1.) Where any street (not being a highway wholly repairable by the inhabitants at large or a street belonging to or repairable by a railway company) or the carriageway or footway or any other part of such street is not sewered levelled paved metalled flagged kerbed channelled made good and lighted to the satisfaction of the Local Board the Local Board may from time to time resolve with respect to such street or part of a street to do any one or more of the following works (in this Act called "private street works") that is to say to sewer level pave metal flag kerb channel or make

good or to provide proper means for lighting such street or part of A.D. 1888. a street and the expenses incurred by the Local Board in executing private street works shall be apportioned (subject as in this Act mentioned) on the premises fronting adjoining or abutting on such street or part of a street. Any such resolution may include several streets or parts of streets or may be limited to any part or parts of a street.

- (2.) The surveyor shall prepare as respects each street or part of a street—
 - (A.) A specification of the private street works referred to in the resolution with plans and sections (if applicable);
 - (B.) An estimate of the probable expenses of the works;
 - (c.) A provisional apportionment of the estimated expenses among the premises liable to be charged therewith under this Act:

Such specifications plans and sections estimates and provisional apportionments shall comprise the particulars prescribed in the first part of the Fourth Schedule to this Act and shall be submitted to the Local Board who may by resolution approve the same respectively with or without modification or addition as they think fit.

- (3.) The resolution approving the specifications plans and sections (if any) estimates and provisional apportionments shall be published in the manner prescribed in the second part of the Fourth Schedule to this Act and copies thereof shall be served on the owners of the premises shown as liable to be charged in the provisional apportionment. During one mouth from the date of the first publication the approved specifications plans and sections (if any) estimates and provisional apportionments (or copies thereof certified by the surveyor) shall be kept deposited at the office of the Local Board and shall be open to inspection at all reasonable times.
- 93. During the said month any owner of any premises shown in a Objections provisional apportionment as liable to be charged with any part of to proposed the expenses of executing the works may by written notice served works. on the Local Board object to the proposals of the Local Board on any of the following grounds (that is to say):—

- (A.) That an alleged street or part of a street is not or does not form part of a street within the meaning of this Act;
- (B.) That a street or part of a street is (in whole or in part) a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large;
- (c.) That there has been some material informality defect or error in or in respect of the resolution notice plans sections or estimate;

- (D.) That the proposed works are insufficient or unreasonable or that the estimated expenses are excessive;
- (E.) That any premises ought to be excluded from or inserted in the provisional apportionment;
- (F.) That the provisional apportionment is incorrect in respect of some matter of fact to be specified in the objection or (where the provisional apportionment is made with regard to other considerations than frontage) in respect of the degree of benefit to be derived by any persons or the amount or value of any work already done by the owner or occupier of any premises:

For the purposes of this Act joint tenants or tenants in common may object through one of their number authorised in writing under the hands of the majority of such joint tenants or tenants in common.

Hearing and determination of objections.

94.—(1.) The Local Board at any time after the expiration of the said month may apply to a court of summary jurisdiction to appoint a time for determining the matter of all objections made as in this Act mentioned and shall publish a notice of the time and place appointed and copies of such notice shall be served upon the objectors and at the time and place so appointed any such court may proceed to hear and determine the matter of all such objections in the same manner as nearly as may be and with the same powers and subject to the same provisions with respect to stating a case as if the Local Board were proceeding summarily against the objectors to enforce payment of a sum of money summarily recoverable. The court may quash in whole or in part or may amend the resolution plans sections estimates and provisional apportionments or any of them on the application either of any objector or of the Local Board. The court may also if it thinks fit adjourn the hearing and direct any further notices to be given.

(2.) No objection which could be made under this part of this Act shall be otherwise made or allowed in any court proceeding or manner whatsoever.

(3.) The costs of any proceedings before a court of summary jurisdiction in relation to objections under this Act shall be in the discretion of the court and the court shall have power if it thinks fit to direct that the whole or any part of such costs ordered to be paid by an objector or objectors shall be paid in the first instance by the Local Board and charged as part of the expenses of the works on the premises of the objector or objectors in such proportions as may appear just.

Incidental works.

95.—(1.) The Local Board may include in any works to be done under this part of this Act with respect to any street or part

of a street (not being a street belonging to or repairable by A.D. 1888. a railway company) any works which they think necessary for bringing the street or part of a street as regards sewerage drainage level or other matters into conformity with any other streets (whether repairable or not by the inhabitants at large) including the provision of separate sewers for the reception of sewage or polluted water and of surface or unpolluted water respectively.

(2.) The Local Board in any estimate of the expenses of private street works may include a commission not exceeding five per centum (in addition to the estimated actual cost) in respect of surveys and superintendence.

96. In a provisional apportionment of expenses of private street Apportionworks the apportionment of expenses against the premises fronting expenses. adjoining or abutting on the street or part of a street in respect of which the expenses are to be incurred shall unless the Local Board otherwise resolve be apportioned according to the frontage of the respective premises but the Local Board may if they think just resolve that in settling the apportionment regard shall be had to the following considerations (namely):—

- (A.) The greater or less degree of benefit to be derived by any premises from such works;
- (B.) The amount and value of any work already done by the owners or occupiers of any such premises:

They may also if they think just include any premises which do not front adjoin or abut on the street or part of a street but which in their opinion will be benefited by the works and may fix the sum or proportion to be charged against any such premises accordingly.

97. The Local Board may from time to time amend the specifi- Amendment cations plans and sections (if any) estimates and provisional of plans &c. apportionments for any private street works but if the total amount of the estimate in respect of any street or part of a street is increased such estimate and the provisional apportionment shall be published in manner prescribed in the second part of the Fourth Schedule to this Act and shall be open to inspection at the office of the Local Board at all reasonable times and copies thereof shall be served on the owners of the premises affected thereby and objections may be made to the increase and apportionment and if made shall be dealt with and determined in like manner as objections to the original estimate and apportionment.

98.—(1.) When any private street works have been completed Final apporand the actual expenses thereof ascertained the surveyor shall tionment and recovery of make a final apportionment by dividing the actual expenses and expenses.

- the commission aforesaid in the same proportions in which the estimated expenses were divided in the original or amended provisional apportionment as the case may be and such final apportionment shall be conclusive for all purposes and notice of such final apportionment shall be published in the manner prescribed in the second part of the Fourth Schedule to this Act and the sums apportioned thereby shall be recoverable in manner provided by this Act or in the same manner as private improvement expenses are recoverable under the Public Health Act 1875 including the power to declare any such expenses to be payable by instalments.
- (2.) Within one month after such notice the owner of any premises charged with any expenses under such apportionment may by a written notice to the Local Board object to such final apportionment on the following grounds or any of them:—
 - (A.) That the actual expenses have without sufficient reason exceeded the estimated expenses by more than fifteen per centum;
 - (B.) That the final apportionment has not been made in accordance with this section;
 - (c.) That there has been an unreasonable departure from the specification plans and sections;
 - (b.) That the interest has been increased by unreasonable delay in ascertaining the expenses or making the apportionment.
- (3.) Objections under this section shall be determined in the same manner as objections to the original apportionment.

Charge on premises.

- 99.—(1.) Any premises included in the final apportionment and all estates and interests from time to time therein shall stand and remain charged (to the like extent and effect as under the two hundred and fifty-seventh section of the Public Health Act 1875) with the sum finally apportioned on them or if objection has been made against the final apportionment with the sum determined to be due as from the date of the final apportionment with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum and the Local Board shall for the recovery of such sum and interest have all the same powers and remedies under the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act 1881 and otherwise as if they were mortgagees having powers of sale and lease and of appointing a receiver.
- (2.) The Local Board shall keep a register of charges under this part of this Act and of the payments made in satisfaction thereof and the register shall be open to inspection to all persons at all reasonable times on payment of not exceeding one shilling in respect of each name or property searched for and the Local Board shall furnish copies of any part of such register to any person

applying for the same on payment of such reasonable sum as may A.D. 1888. be fixed by the Local Board.

100. The Local Board may if they think fit from time to time Recovery of (in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy) recover summarily in a court of summary jurisdiction or as a simple contract debt by action in any court of competent jurisdiction from the owner for the time being of any premises in respect of which any sum is due for expenses of private street works the whole or any portion of such sum together with interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum from the date of the final apportionment till payment thereof: Provided that any proceeding in a court of summary jurisdiction or county court under this section may be commenced at any time within twelve months and not afterwards of the time when the matter of such proceedings arose.

expenses summarily or by action.

101. The Local Board if they think fit may at any time resolve Contribution to contribute the whole or a portion of the expenses of any private street works and may pay the same out of the district fund or expenses. general district rate.

by Local Board to

102. Whenever all or any of the private street works in this Adoption of part of this Act mentioned have been executed in a street or part of private. a street by the Local Board and the Local Board are of opinion that such street or part of a street ought to become a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large they may by notice to be fixed up in such street or part of a street declare the whole of such street or part of a street to be a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large and thereupon such street or part of a street as defined in the notice shall become a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large:

Provided that no such street or part of a street shall become a highway so repairable if within one month after such notice has been put up the owner or the majority in number or value of owners of such street or part of a street by notice in writing to the Local Board object thereto and in ascertaining such majority owners being joint tenants or tenants in common shall be reckoned as one owner.

103. If any street is now or shall hereafter be sewered levelled On street paved metalled flagged kerbed channelled and made good (all such works being done to the satisfaction of the Local Board) then on the application in writing of the greater part in value of the owners of the houses and land in such street the Local Board shall within three months from the time of such application declare in writing under their common seal the same to be a highway repairable by

the inhabitants at large and thereupon the said street shall become a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large.

Separate accounts of expenses of works.

104. The Local Board shall keep separate accounts of all moneys expended and recovered by them in the execution of the provisions of this part of this Act relating to private street works.

Power for limited owners to borrow for expenses.

105. All owners of buildings or lands being persons who under the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act 1845 are empowered to sell and convey or release lands may charge such buildings or lands with such sum as may be necessary to defray the whole or any part of any expenses which the owners of or any persons in respect of such buildings or lands for the time being are liable to pay under this part of this Act and the expenses of making such charge and for securing the repayment of such sum with interest may mortgage such buildings or lands to any person advancing such sum but so that the principal due on any such mortgage shall be repaid by equal yearly or half-yearly payments within thirty years.

Power to apply district fund in executing works for private owners.

106. Whenever the Local Board are by this Act or any byelaw for the time being in force authorised to execute re-execute or alter any work act or thing in default of the owner occupier or other person required to do the same and whenever the Local Board execute any works upon the application of or by agreement with the owner of the lands houses or other property for or in respect of which the same are to be executed the Local Board may apply the district fund in or towards the executing re-executing or altering of such work act or thing but this section shall not affect the liability of any such owner occupier or other person to repay the moneys expended by the Local Board.

No incumbent of any church &c. liable to expenses for draining and paving.

107. No incumbent minister or trustee of any church chapel or place appropriated to public religious worship which is now by law exempt from rates for the relief of the poor shall be liable to any expenses under this Act of sewering levelling paving metalling flagging kerbing channelling or making good any street as the owner or occupier of such church chapel or place or of any churchyard or burial-ground attached thereto situate within any street nor shall any such expenses be deemed to be a charge on such church chapel or other place or on such churchyard or burial-ground or to subject the same to distress execution or other legal process and the Local Board shall undertake any works from the expenses of which any such incumbent minister or trustee is hereby exempted and shall defray the expenses thereof out of the general district rates.

Railways &c. abutting on but not communicating

108. No railway or canal company shall be deemed to be an owner or occupier for the purposes of this part of this Act in respect-

of any land of such company upon which any such street as is in this part of this Act mentioned shall wholly or partially front or abut and which shall at the time of the laying out of such street be used by such company solely as a part of their line of railway or canal or railway or canal sidings or dock and shall have no direct communication with such street and the expenses incurred by the this part of Local Board under the powers of this part of this Act which but for this Act. this provision such company would be liable to pay shall be repaid to the Local Board by the other owners having frontages abutting on such street and in such proportion as shall be settled by the surveyor: And in the event of such company subsequently making a communication with such street they shall notwithstanding such repayment as last aforesaid pay to the Local Board the expenses which but for the foregoing provision such company would in the first instance have been liable to pay and the Local Board shall divide among the other owners for the time being having frontages abutting on such street the amount so paid by such company to the Local Board less the costs and expenses attendant upon such division in such proportion as shall be settled by the surveyor whose decision shall be final and conclusive: But this section shall not apply to any street existing at the date of the passing of this Act.

PART VIII.—POLICE AND STREET TRAFFIC.

109. Any householder personally or by his servant or by any constable may require any street musician or singer to depart from depart when the neighbourhood of the house of such householder and every person who shall sound or play upon any musical instrument or sing in any street near or within hearing of such house after being so required to depart shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Street required to do so.

110. Any three or more persons assembled in any part of any street for the purpose of betting shall be deemed to be obstructing the street and each of such persons shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Prohibition of persons assembling in streets for purposes of betting.

111. Every person delivering coal or coke not exceeding in Control of quantity two hundredweight to any one purchaser shall carry with the vehicle employed by him in such delivery proper and sufficient weights and scales or some efficient instrument whereby the purchaser may have his coals or coke weighed and the coal or coke shall on the request of the purchaser be weighed accordingly by the person delivering the same.

coal dealers.

Any person delivering coal or coke as aforesaid and not provided with weights and scales or any instrument for weighing or not weighing the coal or coke when requested by the purchaser so to do

or failing to give just weight or using his weights and scales or instrument for weighing in other than a proper state to weigh accurately shall be liable to a penalty for every such offence not exceeding forty shillings.

Penalty on persons obstructing footway.

112. If two or more persons shall be assembled together in any street at any time of the day or night for the purpose of assaulting insulting or annoying foot passengers or in such a manner as to insult or annoy any foot passenger and if any such person shall not comply with the direction or request of any constable to move away so as to leave the footway clear and unobstructed or shall assault insult or annoy any foot passenger he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Penalty on pulling down notice boards of Local Board.

113. If any person destroys pulls down injures or defaces any boards or conveniences for the reception of advertisements of the Local Board or any advertisement placard or bill affixed thereto or any placard or notice issued and put up by or under the direction of the Local Board or any notice of the position of a fireplug or hydrant or any board provided by the Local Board on which any byelaw or part of a byelaw of the Local Board is painted or placed such boards placards or notices being affixed in places where the Local Board are legally entitled to affix the same he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Prohibition of obscene bills &c.

114. If any person affixes or causes to be affixed to any house building wall board lamp-post tree post gate public seat fence railing or convenience or delivers or exhibits to any inhabitant or passenger in or near to any street any bill or printed or written paper (whether enclosed in a sealed or other envelope or not) of an obscene or indecent nature or referring to any disease of a loathsome or secret kind or to any cure for any such disease he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings or in the discretion of the justice before whom he is convicted to imprisonment for any term not exceeding one month with or without hard labour.

Regulation of shows caravans &c. during fair time.

115. The Local Board may from time to time make and when made may from time to time alter and repeal byelaws for prescribing hours within which during any fair or at any other time any show booth caravan circus or exhibition may be kept open and for preventing such places being open on Sundays and for preserving order therein.

Public drinking fountains.

116. The Local Board may from time to time when and as they think it expedient put up and continue and from time to time remove or discontinue drinking fountains and cattle troughs with proper conveniences for the gratuitous supply of water for drinking

and for watering of cattle and horses at such fountains or troughs A.D. 1888. respectively and may furnish or discontinue such gratuitous supply (but for such drinking and watering only) in such public places as the Local Board may think fit but not against or in the immediate proximity of any private dwelling-house warehouse counting-house shop or other building or the fence or wall of any garden or pleasure ground except with the consent of the owner and occupier thereof and every person who shall wilfully use any water so gratuitously supplied elsewhere or otherwise than as herein-before mentioned shall forfeit to the Local Board for every such offence a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

117. The captain or superintendent of the fire brigade of the Captain of Local Board or other officer of such fire brigade for the time being Local Board in charge of the engine or other apparatus for extinguishing fires to have attending at any fire shall from the time of his arrival and during control of his presence thereat have the sole charge and control of all operations at fires. operations for the putting out of such fire whether by the Local Board fire brigade or by any other including the fixing of the positions of the fire engines and apparatus the attaching of hose to any water pipes or water supply and the selection of the parts of the building on fire or of adjoining buildings against which the water is to be directed. Any person who shall wilfully disobey any reasonable order of any such officer of the fire brigade of the Local Board made for the purpose of giving effect to this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

fire brigade

118. The Local Board may by resolution from time to time fix Provisions as and determine and alter the hours during which bathing may take to bathing. place from those parts of the sea-beach in front of the district which are not comprised in any public bathing place or any stand for bathing machines:

And any person who shall undress on the sea-beach or bathe in the sea in front of the district except from a bathing machine or from a public bathing place or from a boat distant from the shore not less than two hundred yards and from any stand for ladies bathing machines not less than four hundred yards at any other time than between the hours so appointed and any person above the age of ten years who does any indecent act or bathes so as to indecently expose himself within the district or within a distance of four hundred yards from any part of the district being on or in the immediate neighbourhood of the sea-beach shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings:

And the Local Board may from time to time make and when made may from time to time alter and repeal byelaws for the preservation of decency and order at public bathing stations and

A.D. 1888. with respect to the hours during which bathing may take place therefrom and may by such byelaws prescribe the use of decent and sufficient bathing garments.

PART IX.—TELEGRAPH WIRES.

Byelaws for prevention of danger from telegraph wires &c.

- 119.—(1.) The Local Board may from time to time make and when made may from time to time alter and repeal byelaws for prevention of danger or obstruction to the public from posts wires tubes or any other appliances or apparatus stretched or placed over above along or across any street (whether before or after the passing of this Act) for the purpose of any telegraph or telephone or other purpose.
- (2.) By such byelaws provision may be made for the inspection and examination by the Local Board of any such posts wires tubes or other appliances or apparatus and for the prohibition of any such posts wires tubes or other appliances or apparatus being or continuing to be stretched or placed as aforesaid in such manner as to be dangerous or to cause obstruction to the public.
- (3.) Offenders against such byelaws shall be liable to such reasonable penalties as may be thereby prescribed not exceeding five pounds for each offence and a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings and in addition to awarding any penalty the court of summary jurisdiction may order the removal of any post wire tube or other appliance which shall be adjudged to be stretched or placed as aforesaid in contravention of any byelaw made by the Local Board under this section.
- (4.) Byelaws made under this section and any alteration or repeal of any such byelaws shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Trade which Board is hereby empowered to allow or disallow or to modify or amend the same as it may think proper and such reasonable notice of the intended submission of any such byelaw or of any alteration or repeal thereof for confirmation shall be given by the Local Board by advertisement in one or more local newspapers circulating in the district and by circular letter to any company or person owning or leasing any post wire tube or other appliance or apparatus to which such byelaw shall apply and such company or person shall be entitled to appear before the Board of Trade and object to the confirmation alteration or repeal of any byelaw and all costs incurred by any parties in reference to the application for or objection to the confirmation alteration or repeal of any such byelaw shall be in the discretion of the Board of Trade.
- (5.) The Board of Trade may exempt from the operation of any such byelaw for such period as they think proper not exceeding five

years from the confirmation thereof any post wire tube or other A.D. 1888. appliance or apparatus which shall have been stretched or placed as aforesaid before such confirmation (herein-after referred to as "an existing work"): And the Board of Trade may exempt from any alteration or repeal of any such byelaw for such period as they think proper not exceeding five years from the confirmation of such alteration or repeal any post wire tube or other appliance or apparatus which shall have been stretched or placed as aforesaid prior to such alteration or repeal in accordance with the byelaw proposed to be altered or repealed as originally framed.

- (6.) Nothing in such byelaws shall extend to any posts wires tubes or other property belonging to Her Majesty's Postmaster-General nor to any railway or dock company nor to any appliances or apparatus used by Her Majesty's Postmaster-General or any such company in connexion with their business and which now are or hereafter shall pass under their railway or be fixed upon posts or supports placed upon the property of any railway or dock company.
- (7.) Nothing in such byelaws shall extend to any works of any undertakers within the meaning of the Electric Lighting Act 1882 to which the provisions of the said Act apply.
- 120. If during the said period of five years any of the existing As to works to which the last section is applicable is in the opinion of the existing telegraph surveyor in such a state or position that immediate danger to any wires &c. person is to be apprehended he may give information to any justice who may thereupon summon the owner or lessee thereof or other person interested therein forthwith to appear before a court of summary jurisdiction and the court may make an order requiring such owner lessee or other person or all or any of them to remove the source of danger or authorising the surveyor to do so at the expense of such owner lessee or other person or of all or any of them or such other order as may appear to the court under all the circumstances of the case to be necessary and proper.

121. It shall not be lawful for any person to fix or place any rope line cord post wire tube or other similar apparatus (other than wires &c. wires tubes or other apparatus for telegraphic telephonic or any other than electrical or railway signalling purpose) above ground over across telegraph wires &c. or along any street without the consent in writing of the Local Board which consent may contain such terms and conditions as the Local Board think fit. Any person acting in contravention of the provisions of this section or of the terms and conditions (if any) of such consent shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding twenty shillings:

Restrictions over under or across or along streets.

Provided that nothing in this section shall extend to any works of any undertakers within the meaning of the Electric Lighting Act 1882 to which the provisions of the said Act apply.

Saving for posts wires &c. of Postmaster-General.

122. Nothing in this part of this Act shall extend to any posts wires tubes or other property of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General.

PART X.—MARKETS FAIRS AND SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

Definition.

- 123. In this part of this Act unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Market premises" includes any booth shed lair pen stall standing-place fixtures or convenience in any market;
 - "Toll" and "tolls" include all tolls stallages rents and charges payable to the Local Board in respect of any market or market premises or weighing house or machine;
 - "Articles" includes all commodities and things in respect of which the Local Board are authorised to levy tolls.

Power to take possession of stalls &c. for non-payment of rent &c.

124. If any tenant shall on demand thereof after the same shall have become due and payable make default in the payment of any toll for any market premises the Local Board may enter upon and take possession of such premises and re-let the same without prejudice to any other remedy for the recovery of such toll.

Forfeiture of articles left in markets.

125. Every animal or article which shall be brought into or upon any market premises and left therein or thereon after the hour of closing (except such as may be left in charge of the superintendent or inspector of the market) may be taken possession of by the superintendent or inspector and if the same being of a perishable nature shall not be claimed within one hour after the closing or not being of a perishable nature shall not be claimed within seven days thereafter then and in every such case the same may be sold by the Local Board who shall return the surplus proceeds of such sale after deducting any unpaid toll due in respect thereof and the expenses of detention and sale to the owner on demand if demand shall be made within one month after the sale but if demand shall not be so made the proceeds of the sale shall be forfeited to the Local Board.

Slaughtering prohibited except in slaughter-houses provided or licensed by the Local Board.

126. No person shall except with the consent of the Local Board slaughter any cattle or dress for sale the carcase of any cattle in any place other than a slaughter-house provided registered or licensed by the Local Board and every person who shall act in contravention of this enactment shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

127. Any instrument or document (including any notice order

Any instrument so served by

128. Except where otherwise expressed to the contrary any notice to or demand on the Local Board under this Act may be served on the Local Board by being delivered to the clerk or by being sent through the post in a registered letter directed to the clerk in which latter case service shall be deemed to have been effected on the Local Board on the day on which such letter would be delivered in the ordinary course of post.

charges in case of dispute to be settled by justices.

Damages and 129. Where any damages expenses or charges are directed or authorised to be paid or recovered in addition to any penalty for any offence in this Act mentioned the amount of such damages expenses or charges in case of dispute respecting the same may be settled and determined by the justices before whom any offender shall be convicted and may if the justices so order be levied by distress.

Compensation how to be determined.

130. When any compensation costs damages or expenses is or are by this Act directed to be paid and the method for determining the amount thereof is not otherwise provided for such amount shall in case of dispute be ascertained in the manner provided for by the Public Health Acts.

Penalty on occupiers refusing execution of Act.

- 131.—(1.) In case the occupier of any house or part of a house shall prevent the owner thereof from carrying into effect in respect thereof any notice given by the Local Board under this Act or under any byelaw made under the powers of this Act then after notice of this provision shall have been given by the owner to the occupier any justice upon proof thereof may make an order in writing requiring the occupier to permit the owner to execute the works required by the first-mentioned notice to be done and if after the expiration of seven days from the service of such order the occupier shall continue to refuse to permit the owner to execute the said works he shall for every day during which he shall so continue to refuse be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and during the continuance of such refusal the owner shall be discharged from any penalties to which he might otherwise have become liable by reason of his default in executing such works.
- (2.) If the occupier of any premises when requested by or on behalf of the Local Board to state the name of the owner of the premises occupied by him shall refuse or wilfully omit to disclose or wilfully misstate the same he shall (unless he shall show a cause to the satisfaction of the court for his refusal) be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

General provisions as to byelaws.

132. All the provisions with respect to byelaws contained in the one hundred and eighty-second to the one hundred and eighty-sixth 56

sections (both inclusive) of the Public Health Act 1875 except so much thereof as relates to byelaws of a rural sanitary authority shall apply to all byelaws or regulations from time to time made by the Local Board under the powers of this Act: Provided that all byelaws or regulations may be partly in print and partly in writing (including lithograph).

Exemption of buildings vested in the Crown.

141. Every building structure or work vested in or in the occupation of Her Majesty Her heirs and successors either beneficially or as part of the hereditary revenues of the Crown or in trust for the public service or for public purposes also any building structure or work vested in or in the occupation of any department of Her Majesty's Government for public purposes or for the public service shall be exempted from the provisions of this Act.

Saving rights of the Crown (Commissioners of Woods).

142. Nothing contained in this Act shall authorise the Local Board to take use or in any manner interfere with any land or hereditaments or any rights of whatsoever description belonging to the Queen's most Excellent Majesty in right of Her Crown and under the management of the Commissioners of Woods without the consent in writing of the Commissioners of Woods on behalf of Her Majesty first had and obtained for that purpose (which consent such Commissioners are hereby authorised to give) neither shall anything in this Act contained extend to take away prejudice diminish or alter any of the estates rights privileges powers or authorities vested in or enjoyed or exerciseable by the Queen's Majesty Her heirs or successors.

143. Nothing contained in this Act shall authorise the Local A.D. 1888. 145. If any such work be commenced or completed contrary to the provisions of this Act the Board of Trade may abate and remove the same and restore the site thereof to its former condition at the cost and charge of the Local Board and the amount of such costs and charges shall be a debt due from the Local Board to the Crown and shall be recoverable accordingly with costs.

Part I.

Particulars to be stated in Specifications Plans and Sections Estimates and Provisional Apportionments.

Specifications.—These shall describe generally the works and things to be done and in the case of structural works shall specify as far as may be the foundation form material and dimensions thereof.

Plans and Sections.—These shall show the constructive character of the works and the connexions (if any) with existing streets sewers or other works and the lines and levels of the works subject to such limits of deviation (if any) as shall be indicated on the plans and sections respectively.

Estimates.—These shall show the particulars of the probable cost of the whole works including the commission provided for by this Act.

Provisional Apportionments.—These shall state the amounts charged on the respective premises and the names of the respective owners or reputed owners and shall also state whether the apportionment is made according to the frontage of the respective premises or not and the measurements of the frontages and the other considerations (if any) on which the apportionment is based.

Part II.

Any resolution notice or other document required by this Act to be published in the manner prescribed by this schedule shall be published once in each of two successive weeks in some local newspaper circulating within the district and shall be publicly posted in or near the street to which it relates once at least in each of three successive weeks.
