



CHAPTER xxxii.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State for modifying the Metropolis (Whitechapel and Limehouse) Improvement Scheme, 1876. A.D. 1888.
[28th June 1888.]

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, under the Artizans and Labourers Dwellings Improvement Acts, 1875-1885, for modifying the Metropolis (Whitechapel and Limehouse) Improvement Scheme, 1876, authorised by the Metropolis (Whitechapel and Limehouse) Improvement Scheme Confirmation Act, 1876: 39 & 40 Vict. ch. cc.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Order set out in the schedule hereunto annexed is hereby confirmed. Order in schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Metropolis (Whitechapel and Limehouse) Provisional Order Confirmation Act, 1888. Short title.

PROVISIONAL ORDER.

IN pursuance of the power vested in me by the Artizans and Labourers Dwellings Improvement Act, 1875, I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby permit the Metropolitan Board of Works, being the local authority with respect to the scheme authorised by the Metropolis (Whitechapel and Limehouse) Improvement Scheme Confirmation Act, 1876, to modify the said scheme by purchasing by agreement for the sum of two thousand six hundred pounds the public house known as "the Crown," which premises are delineated on the plan annexed to a copy of this Order and sealed with the official seal of this office and here deposited, and which are coloured yellow thereon.

The land shall be added to the improvement area to which the said scheme relates, and shall be appropriated to the erection of dwellings for the accommodation of persons of the working class, or shall be otherwise dealt with by the Board as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State shall approve.
