



CHAPTER xxxix.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the City of Coventry, the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Cockermouth and Shardlow Unions, and the City of Worcester. [28th June 1888.] A.D. 1888.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875:

c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the dates therein respectively mentioned, have full validity and force. The Orders in Schedule confirmed.

2. The Sanitary Authorities mentioned in the said Orders shall not under the powers of this Act or of those Orders, without the consent of the Local Government Board, purchase or acquire in any city, borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or part of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses which after the passing of this Act have been, or on the fifteenth day of December last were, occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers. Special provision as to houses of labouring class.

For the purposes of this section, the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artisans, labourers, and others working for

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A.D. 1888. wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages, but
— working at some trade or handicraft without employing others
except members of their own family, and persons, other than
domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of
thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who
may be residing with them.

Short title. **3.** This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's
Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1888.
