



CHAPTER xlii.

An Act to confirm certain Orders of the Local Government Board under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, relating to the Townships of Foston, Heslerton West, Ideridgehay-and-Alton, Ireton Wood, Kirk Ireton, Scamston, Thornton-le-Clay, Thorp Bassett, and Yeddingham. A.D. 1888.

[28th June 1888.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879 : 39 & 40 Vict.
c. 61.
42 & 43 Vict.
c. 54.

And whereas the said Orders have become provisional, and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing the date of this Act. Orders in

ASHBOURNE AND BELPER UNIONS.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Belper Union, in the County of Derby ;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Ashbourne Union, in the Counties of Derby and Stafford ;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships of Ireton Wood and Ideridgehay and Alton, in the said Belper Union ;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the Township of Kirk Ireton, in the said Ashbourne Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of divided Parishes, and in certain cases to deal with areas for Highway purposes ;

And whereas the said Townships of Ireton Wood and Ideridgehay and Alton are included in the said Belper Union, and the said Township of Ireton is included in the said Ashbourne Union ; and the said Townships are Parishes within the meaning of the said Acts ;

And whereas the said Township of Ireton Wood is divided into two parts which are isolated and detached from each other, namely,—

(a.) All that isolated and detached part which is known as the Hamlet of Blackwall, and is bounded by the Townships of Kirk Ireton and Biggin and the Parish of Hognaston ;

(b.) All that part which forms the main part of the Township, and is bounded by the Townships of Ideridgehay and Alton, Biggin, and Kirk Ireton ;

And whereas a proposal having been made that each of the said parts of the said Township of Ireton Wood should be amalgamated with some adjoining Parish or Township, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that the part of the said Township of Ireton Wood described in paragraph (a.) above should be amalgamated with the said adjoining Township of Kirk Ireton, and that the remaining part of the said Township of Ireton Wood described in paragraph (b.) above should be amalgamated with the said adjoining Township of Ideridgehay and Alton ; and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangements may affect the constitution of any School District ;

And whereas the said parts of the said Township of Ireton Wood do not form one Highway Parish, the part of that Township described in paragraph (b.) above being the separate Highway Parish of Ireton Wood ; the said Township of Kirk Ireton is a separate Highway Parish ; and the said Township of Ideridgehay

and Alton is for highway purposes divided into two separate Highway Parishes, A.D. 1888.
one of which is the Highway Parish of Ideridgehay :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :

Article I.—The said part of the said Township of Ireton Wood described in paragraph (a.) above shall be amalgamated with the said Township of Kirk Ireton, and shall for highway purposes be amalgamated with the said Highway Parish of Kirk Ireton.

Article II.—All the remaining part of the said Township of Ireton Wood described in paragraph (b.) above shall be amalgamated with the said Township of Ideridgehay and Alton, and shall cease to be a Highway Parish, and shall for highway purposes be amalgamated with the said Highway Parish of Ideridgehay.

Article III.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

MALTON UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Malton Union, in the North and East Ridings of the County of York ;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships of Foston, Heslerton West, Scamston, Thornton-le-Clay, Thorp Bassett, and Yeddingham in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and detached parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Townships of Foston, Heslerton West, Scamston, Thornton-le-Clay, Thorp Bassett, and Yeddingham are included in the said Malton Union ; and the said Townships are respectively Parishes within the meaning of the said Acts ;

And whereas the several Townships named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided so that parts thereof, which are described in Column 2, are isolated and detached from the remainder ; and a proposal having been made that each of the said isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Township to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some Township which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Township to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Township named in Column 3 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :

Article I.—The several isolated and detached parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Townships named in Column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of those Townships, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Township which is named in Column 3 opposite to the description of such part.

Article II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.
