



## CHAPTER xliii.

An Act to confirm certain Orders of the Local Government Board under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, relating to the Parishes of Barnston, Bowers Gifford, Corringham, Downham, Dunton, Fobbing, Great Bardfield, Great Dunmow, High Easter, High Roothing, Laindon (two), Langdon Hills, Lee Chapel, Little Bardfield, Little Warley, Nevedon, Pitsea, Ramsden Bell House, and Vange. A.D. 1888.

**W**HEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879: 39 & 40 Vict.

42 & 43 Vict.  
c. 54.

And whereas the said Orders have become provisional, and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing the date of this Act. Orders in

BILLERICAY UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Billericay Union, in the County of Essex ; —

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of Bowers-Gifford, Downham, Laindon, Nevendon, Pitsea, Ramsden Bell-House, and Vange, in the said Union ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and detached parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Bowers-Gifford, Downham, Laindon, Nevendon, Pitsea, Ramsden Bell-House, and Vange are included in the said Billericay Union ;

And whereas the several Parishes named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided so that parts thereof, which are described in Column 2, are isolated and detached from the remainder ; and a proposal having been made that each of the said isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some Parish which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in Column 4 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Art. I. The several isolated and detached parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Parishes named in Column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of such Parishes, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Parish which is named in Column 4 opposite to the description of such part.

Art. II. This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of Corringham, Fobbing, and Langdon-Hills, in the said Orsett Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and detached parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Dunton, Laindon, Lee Chapel, and Little Warley are included in the said Billericay Union, and the said Parishes of Corringham, Fobbing, and Langdon-Hills are included in the said Orsett Union ;

And whereas the several Parishes named in Column 1 of the Schedules A. and B. to this Order are divided so that certain parts thereof, which are described in Column 2, are isolated and detached from the remainder ; and a proposal having been made that each of the said parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some Parish which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the said isolated and detached parts described in Column 2 of the said Schedule A. should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in Column 3 of that Schedule opposite to the description of such part ; and that the said isolated and detached parts described in Column 2 of the said Schedule B. should be separated from the Parishes to which they respectively belong, and should be united, and that the parts so united should be added to the adjoining Parish named in Column 3 of that Schedule ; and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangements may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Art. I. The several isolated and detached parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule A. to this Order, being parts of the several Parishes named in
