



CHAPTER xlviii.

An Act to confirm certain Orders of the Local Government Board under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, relating to the Parishes of Aberffraw, Ceidio, Edeyrn, Llandogged, Llangadwaladr, Llanrhychwyn, Nevin, Trefriew, and Tydweiliog; and to the Townships of Llanrwst and Tre Gwydir. A.D. 1888

[28th June 1888.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879: 39 & 40 Vict.
c. 61.
42 & 43 Vict.
c. 54.

And whereas the said Orders have become Provisional, and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders as set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing the date of this Act. Orders

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's *Provisional Orders Confirmation (Poor Law) (No. 4) Act, 1888.* Short title.

SCHEDULE.

BANGOR AND BEAUMARIS AND HOLYHEAD UNIONS.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Holyhead Union, in the County of Anglesey ;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bangor and Beaumaris Union, in the Counties of Carnarvon and Anglesey ;

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Aberffraw, in the said Holyhead Union ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Llangadwaladr, in the said Bangor and Beaumaris Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and detached parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parish of Aberffraw is included in the said Holyhead Union, and the said Parish of Llangadwaladr is included in the said Bangor and Beaumaris Union ;

And whereas a proposal having been made that a certain part of the said Parish of Aberffraw which is isolated and detached from the remainder, and is bounded on three sides by the said Parish of Llangadwaladr and elsewhere by the sea, should be separated from the said Parish of Aberffraw, and be amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid isolated and detached part of the said Parish of Aberffraw should be separated therefrom, and be amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish of Llangadwaladr, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District ;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Article I.—All the aforesaid isolated and detached part of the said Parish of Aberffraw shall cease to be part of that Parish, and shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Llangadwaladr.

Article II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the

meantime become provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided
Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Llanrwst Union, in the Counties
of Denbigh and Carnarvon ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes
of Llandogged, Llanrhychwyn, and Trefriew, and to the Overseers of
the Poor of the several Townships of Llanrwst and Tre Gwydir, in
the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amend-
ment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the
Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and
detached parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Llandogged, Llanrhychwyn, and Trefriew,
and the said Townships of Llanrwst and Tre Gwydir, are included in the said
Llanrwst Union, and the said Townships are respectively Parishes within the
meaning of the said Acts ;

And whereas the Parishes and the Township named in Column 1 of the
Schedule to this Order are divided so that parts thereof, which are described in
Column 2, are isolated and detached from the remainder ; and a proposal
having been made that each of the said isolated and detached parts should
be separated from the Parish or Township to which it now belongs and be
amalgamated with some adjoining Parish or Township or be otherwise dealt
with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice
duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been
made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid isolated and detached
parts should be separated from the Parish or Township to which it now belongs
and be amalgamated with the Parish or Township named in Column 3 of the
said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Depart-
ment have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act
first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of
any School District :

Article I.—The several isolated and detached parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the Parishes and Township named in Column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of such Parishes and Township, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Parish or Township which is named in Column 3 opposite to the description of such part.

Article II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Ceidio, Edeyrn, Nevin, and Tydweiliog are included in the said Pwllheli Union ;

And whereas the several Parishes named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided so that certain parts thereof which are described in Column 2 are isolated and detached from the remainder, and a proposal having been made that each of the said parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs and should be amalgamated with some adjoining Parish, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in Column 3 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The several isolated and detached parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Parishes named in Column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of those Parishes, and each of such Parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Parish which is named in Column 3 opposite to the description of such part.

Article II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.
