



## CHAPTER xlix.

An Act to confirm certain Orders of the Local Government Board under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, relating to the Parishes of Avington, Berstead, Brixton, Brook, Calbourne, Easton, Gatcombe, Itchen Abbas, Itchen Stoke, Kingston, Saint Nicholas, Shalfleet, Shorwell, and Thornham. A.D. 1888.

[28th June 1888.]

**W**HEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879 :

And whereas the said Orders have become provisional, and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders as set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing the date of this Act. Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Poor Law) (No. 5) Act, 1888. Short title.

**ALRESFORD AND NEW WINCHESTER UNIONS.**

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Alresford Union, in the County of Southampton;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the New Winchester Union, in the County of Southampton;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Itchen Stoke, in the said Alresford Union;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes of Avington, Easton, and Itchen Abbas, in the said New Winchester Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and detached parts of divided Parishes;

And whereas the said Parish of Itchen Stoke is included in the said Alresford Union, and the said Parishes of Avington, Easton, and Itchen Abbas are included in the said New Winchester Union;

And whereas the said Parishes of Easton, Itchen Abbas, and Itchen Stoke, which are named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order, are divided so that parts thereof, which are described in Column 2, are isolated and detached from the remainder; and a proposal having been made that each of the said isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and be amalgamated with some Parish which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid isolated and detached parts should be separated from the Parishes to which they respectively belong, and should be united, and that the parts so united should be amalgamated with the said Parish of Avington, which they adjoin; and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

Art. I.—The several isolated and detached parts of the said Parishes of Easton, Itchen Abbas, and Itchen Stoke which are described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order shall respectively cease to be parts of those Parishes,

and shall be united, and the said parts so united shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Avington.  
Art. II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

EASTON - -	All that isolated and detached part which is bounded by the Parishes of Avington, Ovington, Itchen Stoke, and Chilcomb, and by isolated and detached parts of the Parishes of Avington, Itchen Stoke, and Itchen Abbas, and which is shown on Sheets XLI. and L. of the Six-Inch Ordnance Plan of the County of Southampton, and described on the said Sheet XLI. as "Easton (Detached)."
ITCHEN ABBAS -	All those four isolated and detached parts which are bounded as follows; namely,— One by the Parish of Avington and by an isolated and detached part of the Parish of Itchen Stoke; One by isolated and detached parts of the Parishes of Easton and Itchen Stoke; One by the Parish of Itchen Stoke and by isolated and detached parts of the Parishes of Itchen Stoke, Avington, and Easton; and One by the Parishes of Avington and Itchen Stoke and by isolated and detached parts of those Parishes; All which parts are shown on the said Sheet XLI. of the said Ordnance Plan, and are respectively described thereon as "Itchen Abbas Parish (Det. No. 1)," "Itchen Abbas (Det <sup>d</sup> . No. 2)," "Itchen Abbas (Det <sup>d</sup> . No. 3)," and "Itchen Abbas (Det <sup>d</sup> . No. 4)."
ITCHEN STOKE -	All that isolated and detached part which is bounded by the Parish of Avington, and by isolated and detached parts of the Parishes of Avington, Easton, and Itchen Abbas, and is shown and described on the said Sheet XLI. of the said Ordnance Plan as "Itchen Stoke (Detached)."

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Berstead, in the said Maidstone Union ; —

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Thornham, in the said Hollingbourn Union ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and detached parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parish of Berstead is included in the said Maidstone Union, and the said Parish of Thornham is included in the said Hollingbourn Union ;

And whereas the said Parish of Berstead is divided so that the under-mentioned parts thereof are isolated and detached from the remainder thereof, namely,—

All that isolated and detached part which includes a portion of Chrishmell Farm, and is bounded by the Parishes of Thornham and Hollingbourn ;

All that isolated and detached part which includes a portion of Milgate Park and adjoins the River Len, and is bounded by the Parishes of Thornham and Leeds ; and

All that isolated and detached part which is commonly known as “ Silver Hill,” and is bounded by the Parishes of Hollingbourn and Thornham ;

And whereas a proposal having been made that the said isolated and detached parts of the said Parish of Berstead should be separated from that Parish and be amalgamated with some adjoining Parish, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid isolated and detached parts of the said Parish of Berstead should be separated therefrom and be amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish of Thornham ; and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Art. I.—All the aforesaid isolated and detached parts of the said Parish of Berstead shall cease to be parts of that Parish, and shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Thornham.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of divided parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Brixton, Brook, Calbourne, Gatcombe, Kingston, Saint Nicholas, Shalfleet, and Shorwell, are included in the said Isle of Wight Union ;

And whereas the several Parishes named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided Parishes within the meaning of the said Acts, certain parts thereof, which are described in Column 2, being isolated and detached or nearly detached from the remainder ; and a proposal having been made that each of the said parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some Parish which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in Column 4 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :

Art. I.—The several parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Parishes named in Column 1 thereof, shall
