



CHAPTER clii.

An Act to authorise the Corporation of Glasgow to make and maintain River Walls or Embankments on the River Clyde and for other purposes. A.D. 1890.
[4th August 1890.]

WHEREAS in some places within the jurisdiction of the lord provost magistrates and council of the city and Royal burgh of Glasgow as a municipal corporation (hereinafter called the Corporation) the banks of the River Clyde are being greatly injured by the action of that river and it is expedient to construct and maintain the river walls or embankments in this Act mentioned for the protection and preservation of those banks :

And whereas plans and sections showing the lines and levels of the works authorised by this Act and also a book of reference containing the names of the owners and lessees or reputed owners and lessees and of the occupiers of the lands required or which may be taken for the purposes or under the powers of this Act were duly deposited with the principal sheriff clerk for the county of Lanark and are hereinafter respectively referred to as the deposited plans sections and book of reference :

And whereas the purposes of this Act cannot be effected without the authority of Parliament :

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say) :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Glasgow Corporation Act 1890. Short title.

2. The Lands Clauses Acts the sections of the Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847 with respect to byelaws and the provisions of the Railways Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act 1845 with respect to the temporary occupation of lands are (except where expressly varied by or inconsistent with this Act) incorporated with and form part of this Act and the expressions "the Incorporation of Acts.

A.D. 1890. — company ” and “ the railway ” in those Acts mean respectively the Corporation and the river walls or embankments hereinafter authorised.

Interpreta-
tion.

3. In this Act the several words and expressions to which meanings are assigned by the Acts wholly or partially incorporated herewith have the same respective meanings unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction :

In this Act—

“ City ” means the city and Royal burgh of Glasgow ;

“ Sheriff ” means the sheriff of the county of Lanark and includes sheriffs substitute.

Power to
execute
works and
take lands.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Act the Corporation may make and maintain in the lines and according to the levels shown on the deposited plans and sections the works hereinafter described with all proper approaches works and conveniences connected therewith and may enter upon take and use such of the lands delineated on the said plans and described in the deposited book of reference as may be required for that purpose The works hereinbefore referred to and authorised by this Act are—

(1.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the city parish of Glasgow commencing at a point on the right bank of the River Clyde at or near the eastern abutment of Saint Andrew’s Suspension Bridge thence extending in an easterly direction along the said right bank and terminating at a point thereon at the intersection of the boundary of the city parish by the boundary of the barony parish of Glasgow ;

(2.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the barony parish of Glasgow commencing at a point on the right bank of the River Clyde at the termination of the river wall or embankment No. 1 above described thence extending in a south-easterly direction along the said right bank and terminating at a point thereon 39 yards or thereabouts measuring in a westerly direction from the west parapet of Rutherglen Bridge ;

(3.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the barony parish of Glasgow commencing at a point on the right bank of the River Clyde 43 yards or thereabouts measuring in an easterly direction from the east parapet of Rutherglen Bridge thence extending in a south-easterly direction along the said right bank and terminating at a point thereon 243 yards or thereabouts from the said point of commencement ;

(4.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the barony parish of Glasgow commencing at the termination of the river wall

or embankment No. 3 above described thence extending in a southerly direction along the said right bank and terminating at a point thereon 515 yards or thereabouts from the said point of commencement;

- (5.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the barony parish of Glasgow commencing at a point on the right bank of the River Clyde at or near the eastern pier which supports the viaduct of the Caledonian Railway (Dalmarnock branch) thence extending in a north-easterly direction along the said right bank and terminating at a point thereon adjoining the western parapet of Dalmarnock Bridge at or near the northern end thereof distant 440 yards or thereabouts from the said point of commencement;
- (6.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the barony parish of Glasgow commencing at a point on the right bank of the River Clyde 676 yards or thereabouts measured in a north-easterly direction from the east side of the service bridge at Dalmarnock thence extending in a northerly direction along the said right bank and terminating at the western end of the river wall or embankment constructed in front of the grounds of Belvidere Hospital distant 765 yards or thereabouts from the said point of commencement;
- (7.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the parish of Govan commencing at a point on the left bank of the River Clyde at or near the eastern abutment of Albert Bridge thence extending in an easterly direction along the said left bank and terminating at a point thereon at or near the western abutment of Saint Andrew's Suspension Bridge;
- (8.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the parish of Govan commencing at a point on the left bank of the River Clyde at or near the eastern abutment of Saint Andrew's Suspension Bridge thence extending in a south-easterly direction along the said left bank and terminating at a point thereon opposite and 13 yards distant from the south side of Govan Street at the east end thereof;
- (9.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the parish of Govan commencing at the termination of the river wall or embankment No. 8 above described thence extending in a southerly direction along the said left bank and terminating at a point thereon at or near the landing-place of Oatlands Ferry;
- (10.) A river wall or embankment wholly within the parish of Govan commencing at a point on the left bank of the River Clyde immediately to the east of the pumping station of

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William Dixon (Limited) thence extending in an easterly direction along the said left bank and terminating at a point thereon at or near the intersection of the boundary of the parish of Govan by the boundary of the parish of Rutherglen.

Maintenance
of certain
river walls
or embank-
ments.

Subject to the provisions of this Act the Corporation may also from time to time repair and maintain—

- (A.) The river wall or embankment wholly within the city parish of Glasgow constructed on the right bank of the River Clyde between the eastern abutment of Albert Bridge and the western abutment of Saint Andrew's Suspension Bridge;
- (B.) The river wall or embankment wholly within the barony parish of Glasgow constructed on the right bank of the River Clyde between the point described as the termination of river wall or embankment No. 4. above described and the western pier which supports the viaduct of the Caledonian Railway (Dalmarnock branch);
- (C.) The river wall or embankment wholly within the barony parish of Glasgow constructed on the right bank of the River Clyde between the point described as the termination of river wall or embankment No. 6 above described and the point where the said right bank is intersected by the parliamentary and municipal boundary of the city; and
- (D.) The river wall or embankment wholly within the parish of Govan constructed on the left bank of the River Clyde between the point described as the termination of river wall or embankment No. 9 above described and the commencement of river wall or embankment No. 10 above described.

The Corporation may from time to time make and maintain all such other works as may be necessary for the protection of the banks of the river within the limits before mentioned and may form footpaths thereon and plant trees and do any other acts requisite or desirable for the amenity thereof.

Power to
excavate
dredge &c.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Act the Corporation may with the consent of the Board of Trade in writing excavate dredge or deepen the foreshore of the River Clyde in front of or adjoining the said river walls or embankments respectively.

Power to
deviate.

6. Subject to the provisions of this Act the Corporation in constructing the works by this Act authorised may with the consent of the Board of Trade in writing deviate laterally from the lines thereof delineated on the deposited plans to any extent not exceeding the limits of deviation defined on those plans but so that no such deviation shall encroach upon or interfere with any street or road shown on those plans to a greater extent than ten feet on the river

side of such street or road and they may with the like consent deviate vertically from the levels of the said works as defined on the deposited sections to any extent not exceeding five feet. A.D. 1890.

7. Persons empowered by the Lands Clauses Acts to sell and convey or release land may if they think fit subject to the provisions of those Acts and of this Act grant to the Corporation any easement servitude right or privilege (not being an easement of water) required for the purposes of this Act in over or affecting any such land and the provisions of the said Acts with respect to lands and feu duties or ground annuals as far as the same are applicable in this behalf shall extend and apply to such grants and to such easements servitudes rights and privileges as aforesaid respectively. Power to take easements by agreement.

8. Subject to the provisions of this Act the Corporation may for the purpose of constructing repairing and maintaining and if need be re-constructing the river walls or embankments and other works authorised by this Act from time to time temporarily appropriate and use without price or consideration any land shown on the deposited plans and described in the deposited book of reference and specified in the schedule to this Act and subject to the obligation on the Corporation to make due restoration thereof may break up remove alter or interfere with all drains or sewers and all water gas and other pipes therein or thereunder providing or causing to be provided a proper substitute before interrupting the flow of sewage water or gas in any of the premises and in the exercise of such powers the Corporation shall do as little damage as may be and shall make full compensation to all parties entitled thereto for any damage by them sustained by reason of the exercise of such powers the amount thereof failing agreement to be determined on the application either of the Corporation or of the party entitled thereto by the sheriff whose decision shall be final and the Corporation may during the construction repairing maintenance and if need be re-construction of such river walls embankments and other works cross alter stop up or divert streets roads roadways lanes courts squares passages footpaths and places or any of them Provided always that nothing in this Act shall enable the Corporation to remove alter or in any way interfere with the telegraphs of the Postmaster-General except in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the Telegraph Act 1878. Power to appropriate lands streets &c.

9. Subject to the provisions of this Act the powers by this Act conferred on the Corporation to construct repair maintain and if need be re-construct the river walls or embankments and other works authorised by this Act shall not deprive the owners of the land adjoining such river walls or embankments and other works Owners not to be deprived of certain rights.

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of any right of property they now possess in over or upon the river banks and land ex adverso thereto or of any right to draw water from and to drain their land into the River Clyde either by drains or pipes at present existing or by others hereafter to be laid. Provided that such owners shall from time to time make good any damage which may be caused to the said river walls or embankments in laying or constructing such additional drains or pipes and that the Corporation shall so construct the said river walls or embankments as to afford to such owners means of access to their pipes and drains for the purpose of repairing the same.

Owners not
to interfere
with or use
works.

10. In the event of the owner of any land appropriated and used by the Corporation under the powers of this Act desiring to interfere with or use the works by this Act authorised on such land or along the boundary thereof for any purpose other than the exercise of any right he may possess to draw water from or to drain his land into the River Clyde such owner shall three months previous to such interference or use intimate his intention to the Corporation who shall if they be of opinion that the proposed operations will have the effect of causing structural damage to such works be entitled to claim from such owner and he shall be bound to repay to the Corporation the cost of the works so interfered with or used as the same may be agreed on or failing agreement may be on the application of either party determined by the sheriff. Provided always that such owner shall carry out his operations so as not to affect the efficiency and stability of the adjoining river walls or embankments and other works authorised by this Act.

11. In the event of any land so temporarily appropriated and used by the Corporation being hereafter used or acquired by the Corporation or any other person for the purpose of docks quays wharves or any other purpose the owner of such land his heirs or assigns shall be entitled to claim and receive from the Corporation or any other person so using or acquiring the same such price or compensation as may be agreed on or failing agreement may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts.

12. No person shall without the consent in writing of the Corporation dredge or remove sand gravel or other materials from the bed of the River Clyde ex adverso of the works by this Act authorised except for the purpose of clearing the inlet or outflow of any water or drain pipes from silt.

Byelaws.

13. The Corporation may from time to time make byelaws for the regulation of boats barges and vessels using any portion of the river and the banks thereof ex adverso of the works by this Act authorised or for the protection and regulation of the user of such

works and the footpaths fences and trees thereon Provided that such byelaws shall before coming into operation be confirmed by the Secretary for Scotland after such notice thereof as he shall direct and after hearing any person objecting thereto Such byelaws shall be so framed as to allow the magistrates before whom any penalty imposed thereby is sought to be recovered to order the whole or part only of such penalty to be paid or to remit the whole penalty. A.D. 1890.

14. The Corporation may make and carry into effect contracts agreements and arrangements with any owner of land adjoining the works by this Act authorised or whose lands will be benefited or otherwise affected thereby or by the exercise of the powers vested in the Corporation by this Act with respect to the construction maintenance and cost of such works respectively or any of them. Power to make agreements.

15. For the purposes of this Act the Corporation may from time to time impose levy and recover an assessment not exceeding one halfpenny per pound on all lands and heritages within the city liable to be assessed under the provisions of the Glasgow Corporation and Police Act 1882 with reference to the Prison Payment Assessment and in the way and manner prescribed by that Act. Assessments.

16. For the purposes of this Act to which capital is properly applicable the Corporation may from time to time borrow any moneys not exceeding in the whole fifty thousand pounds and they may from time to time re-borrow any moneys which have been repaid by them otherwise than by means of the sinking fund hereinafter referred to Provided that the moneys so borrowed shall as regards the keeping of separate accounts and the audit thereof be subject to the provisions of the Glasgow Corporation and Police Act 1882. Power to Corporation to borrow.

17. The Corporation shall after the first day of June one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three annually set apart a sum not less than one pound ten shillings per centum on the amount for the time borrowed by them under the authority of this Act and they shall carry the same into the loans fund provided by section 15 of the Glasgow Corporation Loans Act 1883 (hereinafter called the Loans Act) and shall apply the same as a sinking fund in paying off the principal sum so borrowed. Provision as to sinking fund.

18. For the purpose of the Loans Act the power to borrow by this Act granted to the Corporation shall be deemed a borrowing power within the meaning of section 7 of the Loans Act and to have been transferred to and vested in and to apply to and be exerciseable by the Corporation as if that borrowing power had been Provisions of Glasgow Corporation Loans Act 1883 to apply.

A.D. 1890. a borrowing power of the Corporation at the commencement of the Loans Act and the provisions of that Act shall be applicable and shall apply to the borrowing powers by this Act granted to the Corporation.

Provision as to contract for composition of stamp duty. Restriction on taking houses of labouring class.

19. Any contract or agreement for composition for the payment of stamp duty shall be made in accordance with the provisions of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act 1887.

20. The Corporation shall not under the powers of this Act without the consent of the Secretary for Scotland take ten or more houses which after the passing of this Act have been or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers :

For the purposes of this section the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics artisans labourers and others working for wages hawkers costermongers persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family and persons other than domestic servants whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week and the families of any such persons who may be residing with them.

Saving rights of Crown under Crown Lands Act.

21. Nothing contained in this Act or to be done under the authority thereof shall in any manner affect the title to any of the subjects or any rights powers or authorities mentioned in or reserved by sections twenty-one and twenty-two of the Crown Lands Act 1866 and belonging to or exerciseable on behalf of Her Majesty Her heirs or successors.

Works below high-water mark not to be commenced without consent of Board of Trade.

22. The Corporation shall not construct on the shore of the sea or of any creek bay arm of the sea or navigable river communicating therewith where and so far up the same as the tide flows and reflows any work without the previous consent of the Board of Trade to be signified in writing under the hand of one of the secretaries or assistant secretaries of the Board of Trade and then only according to such plan and under such restrictions and regulations as the Board of Trade may approve of such approval being signified as last aforesaid and where any such work may have been constructed the Corporation shall not at any time alter or extend the same without obtaining previously to making any such alteration or extension the like consents or approvals If any such work be commenced or completed contrary to the provisions of this Act the Board of Trade may abate and remove the same and restore the site thereof to its former condition at the cost and charge of the Corporation and the amount of such costs and charges shall be

a debt due from the Corporation to the Crown and shall be recoverable accordingly with costs. A.D. 1890.

23. The Corporation shall on or near the works below high-water mark hereby authorised during the whole time of the constructing altering or extending the same exhibit and keep burning at their own expense every night from sunset to sunrise such lights (if any) as the Board of Trade from time to time require or approve. Lights on works.

If the Corporation fail to comply in any respect with the provisions of this section they shall for each night in which they so fail be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

24. Nothing contained in this Act shall authorise the Corporation to take use or in any manner interfere with any portion of the shore or bed of the sea or of any river channel creek bay or estuary or any right in respect thereof belonging to the Queen's most Excellent Majesty in right of Her Crown and under the management of the Board of Trade without the previous consent in writing of the Board of Trade on behalf of Her Majesty (which consent the Board of Trade may give) neither shall anything in this Act contained extend to take away prejudice diminish or alter any of the estates rights privileges powers or authorities vested in or enjoyed or exerciseable by the Queen's Majesty Her heirs or successors. Saving rights of the Crown in the fore-shore.

25. All costs charges and expenses of and incident to the preparing for obtaining and passing of this Act or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid out of the moneys to be borrowed or raised under the powers of this Act. Expenses of Act.
