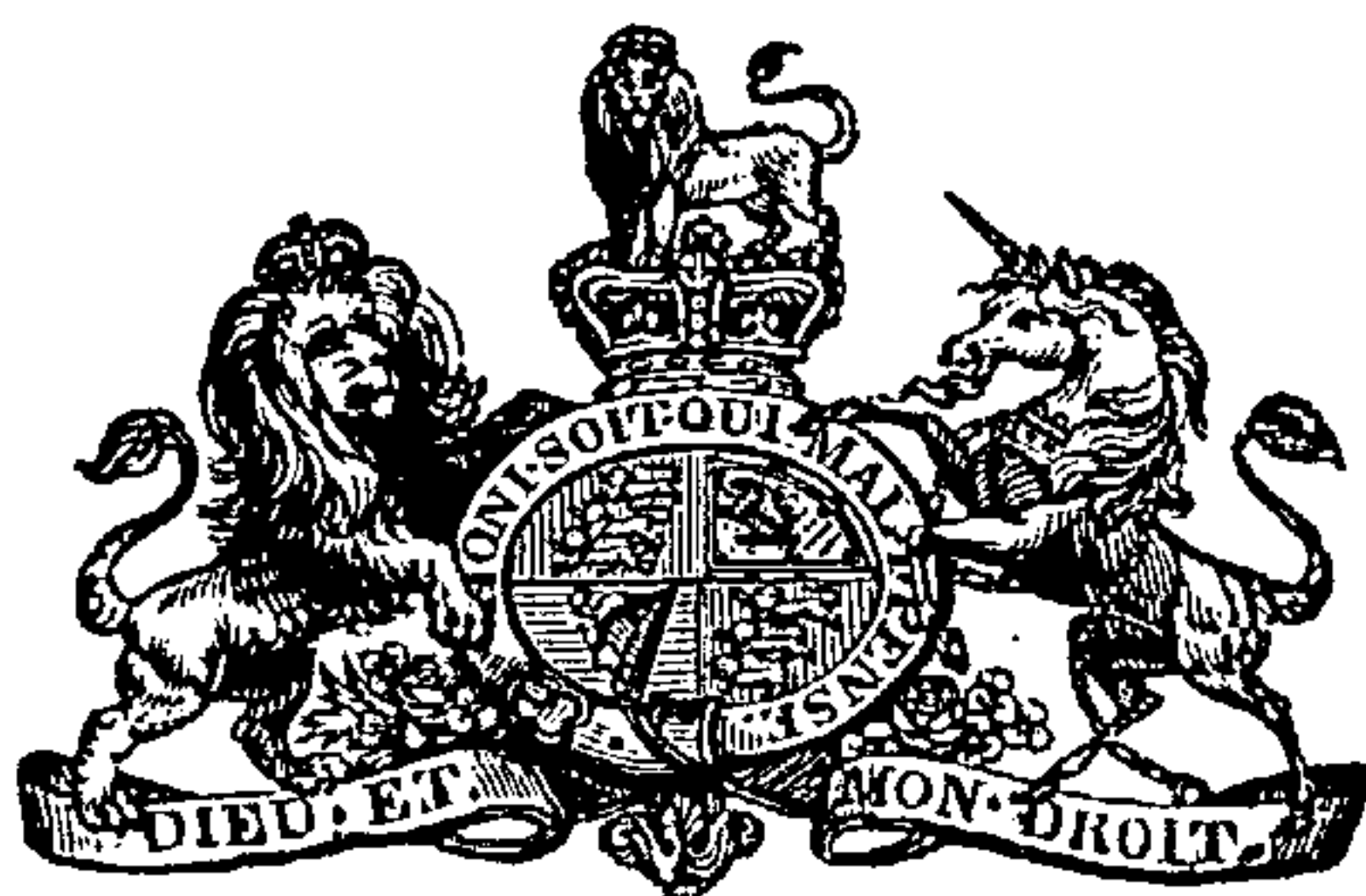

CHAPTER lxxxix.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland relating to Waterworks in the Town of Foynes. A.D. 1890.
[4th July 1890.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland have made the Provisional Order set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, under the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878: 41 & 42 Vict.
c. 52.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Order set out in the Schedule hereto annexed shall be and the same is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. Order in schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board (Ireland) Provisional Order Confirmation (Foynes Waterworks) Act, 1890. Short title.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD FOR IRELAND.

FOYNES WATERWORKS.

PROVISIONAL ORDER.

41 & 42 Vict.

WHEREAS, the Town of Foynes is included within the Rural Sanitary District consisting of the Glin Union, and the Guardians of the Poor of the Glin Union, being the Rural Sanitary Authority of the said Rural Sanitary District, are about to construct Waterworks for the purpose of supplying the said Town with water for drinking and domestic purposes, and have presented a Petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland, in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, praying that they may be empowered to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, for the purpose of the said works :

And whereas the said Petitioners have deposited at the Office of the Local Government Board for Ireland (in Dublin), plans and a book of reference, showing the works intended to be executed, and the lands, easements, lands covered with water, and rights to take and convey water required for the purposes of the said works :

And whereas all advertisements and notices required by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, having been previously published, served and given, the Local Government Board for Ireland have caused a local inquiry to be held as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said Petition, and it appears to the said Board to be proper to assent thereto :

And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland, dated the 7th day of March, 1890, it was declared that the area of charge for the expense to be incurred by the said Rural Sanitary Authority in respect of the said Waterworks should be the Shanagolden Electoral Division of the said Union :

It is ordered by the Local Government Board for Ireland as follows:—

1. From and after the time of the confirmation of this Order by Parliament, the Guardians of the Poor of the Glin Union, acting as the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Rural Sanitary District consisting of the said Union, shall be empowered to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, with reference to the lands, easements, land covered with water, and rights to take and convey water, described and shown in the deposited plans and book of reference.

2. In this Order the expression "The Lands Clauses Acts," means the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, as the same is amended by the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860 ; the Railways Act (Ireland), 1851 ; the Railways Act (Ireland), 1860 ; the Railways Act (Ireland), 1864 ; and the Railways Traverse Act ; and the words, "land" and "lands" in the said Acts shall, for the purposes of this Order, extend to and include messuages, buildings, lands, easements and hereditaments of any kind, and also land covered with water, water, and rights to take and convey water.
3. The powers of compulsory purchase given by this Order shall not be exercised after the expiration of three years from the time of the confirmation of this Order by Parliament. Duration of compulsory powers.
4. All costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the applying for, preparing, obtaining and confirming this Order, and otherwise in relation thereto, and of carrying this Order into effect, shall be paid by the Guardians of the Poor of the Glin Union as special expenses charged upon the area of charge defined by the said Order of the 7th day of March, 1890. Costs and expenses of Order.
5. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as the Foynes Waterworks Provisional Order, 1890. Short title of Order.
