



CHAPTER xcvi.

An Act to repeal the Act two and three Edward the Sixth, chapter fifty-four (local), for the keeping of the Sessions and County Days of the Isle of Anglesey in Beaumaris. A.D. 1890.
[4th July 1890.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
