CHAPTER cxc.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade in pursuance of the Salmon Fishery Act, 1873, relating to the Tees Fishery District.

[24th August 1893.]

HEREAS the Board of Trade have, under the provisions of the Salmon Fishery Act, 1873, and the Salmon and Fresh- 36 & 37 Vict. water Fisheries Act, 1886, made the Provisional Order set forth in 49 & 50 Viet. the schedule hereto annexed relating to the fishery district of the c. 39. River Tees:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Order set out in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be Order in and the same is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof schedule shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force.

2. The Board of Conservators of the Fishery District of the Special pro-River Tees mentioned in the said Order shall not, under the powers visions as to houses of of this Act, or of the said Order, purchase or acquire in any city, labouring borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or part class. of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses which on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers, or, except with the consent of the Local Government Board, ten or more houses which were not so occupied on the said fifteenth day of December, but have been or shall be subsequently so occupied.

For the purposes of this section the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artisans, labourers, and others working for wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family, and persons, other than domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

TEES FISHERY DISTRICT.

Provisional Order to empower the Board of Conservators of the Fishery District of the River Tees to put in force the provisions of the "Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts" relating to purchase otherwise than by agreement in respect of Dinsdale Dam.

Whereas the Board of Conservators of the Fishery District of the River Tees presented a petition to the Board of Trade alleging that a certain weir or dam or fishing mill dam situate in the River Tees and known by the name of Dinsdale Dam was prejudicial to the salmon fisheries of their district, and that, in consequence of the said weir or dam or fishing mill dam being so prejudicial as aforesaid, the said Board of Conservators were desirous of purchasing the same from the owners thereof, in order that the same might be removed in whole or in part, but that the said owners were unable or unwilling to treat, or the said Board of Conservators could not agree to the terms of purchase thereof, and praying that the said Board of Conservators might, with reference to the said Dinsdale Dam and the premises used in connexion therewith, be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement:

And whereas the said Dinsdale Dam is not a weir constructed under any Act of Parliament for the purpose of improving the navigation of any river or of supplying any town with water:

And whereas, on due proof of notice having been given to the owners and occupiers of the said Dinsdale Dam and premises used in connexion therewith and herein-after specifically described, the Board of Trade, after being satisfied that the said Board of Conservators are provided with funds for the purchase thereof, directed an inspector under the Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries Acts, 1861 to 1886, to hold an inquiry, in the district in which the said Dinsdale Dam is situate, into the propriety of the Board of Trade assenting to the prayer of such petition:

And whereas such inquiry is completed, and the inspector has in his report on the said inquiry recommended that the prayer of the said petition should be assented to:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Salmon Fishery Act, 1873, and the Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries Act, 1886, and otherwise, do by this order empower the Board of Conservators of the Fishery District of the River Tees, from and after the date of the passing of the Act of Parliament confirming this order, to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement with reference to the said Dinsdale Dam and such premises used in connexion therewith as are specified in the schedule hereto.
