



CHAPTER xxix.

An Act for enabling an agreement between the Corporation of Doncaster and Alexander Henry Browne respecting part of the Town Field in Doncaster to be carried into effect. A.D. 1894.
[18th June 1894.]

WHEREAS the borough of Doncaster in the West Riding of the county of York (in this Act called "the borough") is a municipal borough under the government of the mayor aldermen and burgesses of the borough (in this Act called "the Corporation") :

And whereas Alexander Henry Browne of Callaly Castle in the county of Northumberland is the owner or reputed owner of a considerable portion of the lands situate in the borough which are known as "the Town Field" and the Corporation are the owners or reputed owners of other relatively small and scattered portions of the said lands :

And whereas an agreement has been lately made between the Corporation and Alexander Henry Browne for (among other things) the sale by them to him of their portions of the said lands but such agreement is conditional on an Act of Parliament being obtained which shall provide and effectually secure that the portion of the Town Field edged brown on the plan herein-after mentioned shall for ever remain open unenclosed and unbuilt upon unless the Corporation shall otherwise agree in writing :

And whereas it would be for the public benefit of the inhabitants of the borough and it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid be made :

And whereas the objects of this Act cannot be attained without the authority of Parliament :

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and

A.D. 1894. Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Doncaster Corporation Act 1894.

Deposited plans and copy thereof.

2. A plan of the Town Field signed in duplicate by the Right Honorable John William Mellor Chairman of the Committee of the House of Commons to which the Bill for this Act was referred (herein-after referred to as "the deposited plan") shall within three weeks after the passing of this Act be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons and with the town clerk of the borough at his office.

Copies of deposited plan to be evidence.

3. Copies of the deposited plan certified by the town clerk or the surveyor of the borough to be true shall be received in all courts of justice and elsewhere as *primâ facie* evidence of the contents of such plan.

Part of Town Field in Doncaster not to be inclosed or built on.

4. From and after the passing of this Act the portion of the Town Field edged brown on the said plan and being situate to the west of the new roads shown on the said plan as proposed to be made by the Corporation shall for ever remain as the same is at the passing of this Act open unenclosed and unbuilt on (unless the Corporation shall otherwise agree in writing with the said Alexander Henry Browne or his sequels in estate or his or their assigns) except that boundary walls may be erected and maintained of the same height and in the same position as shown on the said plan.

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
