

### CHAPTER xli.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the A.D. 1895. Local Government Board relating to Batley Dronfield Hemsworth Pontefract Sunbury-on-Thames Tonbridge Twickenham Walthamstow and Warrington.

[20th June 1895.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875:

38 & 39 Vict.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be c. 55. confirmed by Parliament and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the Orders same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall in schedule subject to the provisions of this Act have full validity and force.

2. The district councils mentioned in the Orders relating to the Restriction districts of Batley Dronfield Hemsworth Pontefract Sunbury-on- of power to take houses Thames Tonbridge Twickenham and Walthamstow hereby confirmed of labouring shall not purchase or acquire either compulsorily or by agreement class. ten or more houses which on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers or except with the consent of the Local Government Board ten or more houses which were not so occupied on the said fifteenth day of December but have been or shall be subsequently so occupied.

3. The following provisions shall apply to the urban district council of Warrington:—

Special provisions as to War-rington.

- (1.) The district council shall not purchase or acquire either compulsorily or by agreement in their district ten or more houses included in the schedule to the Warrington Order 1895 which after the passing of this Act have been or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers unless and until—
  - (a.) They shall have obtained the approval of the Local Government Board to a scheme for providing new dwellings for such number of persons as were residing in such houses on the fifteenth day of December last or for such number of persons as the Local Government Board shall after inquiry deem necessary having regard to the number of persons on or after that date residing in such houses and working within one mile therefrom and to the amount of vacant suitable accommodation in the immediate neighbourhood of such houses or to the place of employment of such persons and to all the circumstances of the case; and
  - (b.) They shall have given security to the satisfaction of the Local Government Board for the carrying out of the scheme.
- (2.) The approval of the Local Government Board to any scheme under this section may be given either absolutely or conditionally and after the Local Government Board have approved of any such scheme they may from time to time approve either absolutely or conditionally of any modifications in the scheme.
- (3.) Every scheme under this section shall contain provisions prescribing the time within which it shall be carried out and shall require the new dwellings proposed to be provided under the scheme to be completed fit for occupation before the persons residing in the houses in respect of which the scheme is made are displaced:

Provided that the Local Government Board may dispense with the last-mentioned requirement subject to such conditions if any as they may see fit.

- (4.) Any provisions of any scheme under this section or any A.D. 1895. conditions subject to which the Local Government Board may have approved of any scheme or of any modifications of any scheme under this section or subject to which they may have dispensed with the above-mentioned requirement shall be enforceable by writ of mandamus to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of the High Court.
- (5.) If the district council acquire or appropriate any house or houses for the purposes of this Act or of the Warrington Order 1895 in contravention of the foregoing provisions or displace or cause to be displaced the persons residing in any house or houses in contravention of the requirements of the scheme they shall be liable to a penalty of five hundred pounds in respect of every such house which penalty shall be recoverable by the Local Government Board by action in the High Court and shall be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom:

Provided that the Court may if it think fit reduce such penalty.

(6.) Subject to the provisions of this section the district council and the Local Government Board and their inspectors shall have and may exercise for any purpose in connexion with any scheme under this section all or any of the powers vested in them under the Public Health Act 1875 in the same manner in every respect as if the preparation and carrying into effect of such scheme were one of the general purposes of that Act:

Provided that all lands on which any buildings have been erected or provided by the district council in pursuance of any scheme under this section shall for a period of twenty-five years from the date of the scheme be appropriated for the purpose of dwellings and every conveyance demise or lease of such lands and buildings shall be endorsed with notice of this enactment:

Provided also that the Local Government Board may at any time dispense with all or any of the requirements of this subsection subject to such conditions if any as they may see fit.

(7.) The district council shall pay to the Local Government Board a sum to be fixed by that Board in respect of the preparation and issue of any Provisional Order in pursuance of this section and any expenses incurred by that Board in relation to any inquiries under this section including the expenses of any

witnesses summoned by the inspector holding the inquiry and a sum to be fixed by that Board not exceeding three guineas a day for the services of such inspector.

Definition of labouring class.

4. For the purposes of sections two and three of this Act the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics artizans labourers and others working for wages hawkers costermongers persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family and persons other than domestic servants whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

Short title.

5. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act 1895.

Warrington Order.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban District Council for the Borough of Warrington to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Acts.

To the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Warrington; And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Warrington acting by the Council as the Urban District Council for that Borough (herein-after referred to as "the Corporation") require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of widening and improving certain streets in the Borough called Friar's Gate and Bridge Street:

38 & 39 Vict. c, 55. Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other Statutes in that behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect viz.:—

Art. I. The Corporation shall be empowered to put in force with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto and for the purpose aforesaid the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them.

Art. II. This Order may be cited as the Warrington Order 1895.

The Company shall not out of any money by this Act Interest not authorised to be raised pay interest or dividend to any shareholder to be paid on the amount of the calls made in respect of the shares held by paid up. him but nothing in this Act shall prevent the Company from paying to any shareholder such interest on money advanced by him beyond the amount of the calls actually made as is in conformity with the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act 1845.

19. The Company shall not out of any money by this Act Deposits for authorised to be raised pay or deposit any sum which by any future Bills Standing Order of either House of Parliament now or hereafter in paid out force may be required to be deposited in respect of any application of capital. to Parliament for the purpose of obtaining an Act authorising the Company to construct any other railway or to execute any other work or undertaking.

20. Nothing in this Act contained shall exempt the Company or the railway from the provisions of any general Act relating to for general railways or the better and more investigation of the latter and more investigation. railways or the better and more impartial audit of the accounts of Acts. railway companies now in force or which may hereafter pass during this or any future session of Parliament or from any future revision or alteration under the authority of Parliament of the maximum rates of fares and charges or of the rates for small parcels.

21. All costs charges and expenses of and incident to the pre- Costs of Act. paring for obtaining and passing of this Act or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Company.
