An Act to render valid an Act for better raising and securing the Fund for the Relief of Widows and Children of Burgh and Parochial Schoolmasters in *Scotland*. [28th *July* 1843.]

WHEREAS a Bill, intituled *An Act for better raising and securing the Fund for the Relief of Widows and Children of Burgh and Parochial Schoolmasters in Scotland*, passed the Commons and was sent to the Lords upon the Twenty-fifth Day of *April* last, and was agreed to by the Lords, with certain Amendments: And whereas the said Bill was sent by the Lords to the Commons upon the Second Day of *May* last, with a Message that they had agreed to the same, with Amendments: And whereas the said Bill was by Mistake returned by the Commons to the Lords before such Amendments had been considered or agreed to, and was included amongst the Bills which received the Royal Assent upon *Tuesday* the Ninth Day of the said Month of *May* last: And whereas since the said Bill received the Royal Assent the said Amendments have been approved of by the Commons: Be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of
