



CHAPTER clxv.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State under the Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890 relating to Lands in Green Street in the Parish of St. George the Martyr Southwark. [6th August 1897.]

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley Baronet one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State has made the Provisional Order set out in the schedule hereunto annexed under the Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890:

SCHEDULE.

Order to enable the London County Council to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement for the purposes of Part III. of the Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890.

To the London County Council and all others whom it may concern :

WHEREAS the London County Council require to purchase and take the lands described in the schedule hereto for the purposes of Part III. of the Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890 :

Now I the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley Baronet one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State in pursuance of the power given to me by sections 175 and 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 as applied by section 57 of the Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890 do hereby order that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the London County Council shall be empowered to put in force for the purposes of Part III. of the Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890 the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement with respect to the lands described in the schedule hereto.
