An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the A.D. 1897.
Local Government Board relating to Ashby-de-la-Zouch
Biggleswade (Rural) Bredbury-and-Romiley Carlisle
(Rural) Cheadle - and - Gatley Cricklade - and - Wootton-
Bassett (Rural) Exmouth Heston-and-Isleworth Liver-
pool Mallong (Rural) and Settle (Rural).

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the
Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under
the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be
confirmed by Parliament and that the provision herein contained
should be enacted with reference thereto:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty
by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and
Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled
and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the
same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall have
full validity and force. Orders

2. The urban sanitary authority for the City of Liverpool and
the district councils mentioned in the Orders hereby confirmed
shall not under the powers of those Orders purchase or acquire
either compulsorily or by agreement ten or more houses which on
the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or
partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or
lodgers or except with the consent of the Local Government Board
ten or more houses which were not so occupied on the said fifteenth
day of December but have been or shall be subsequently so occupied.

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Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act, 1897.

who may be residing with them.
