



CHAPTER lxxiv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to Bath (two) Leatherhead Luddenden-Foot New-Windsor Ogmores-and-Garw and West-Ham. A.D. 1897.
[15th July 1897.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875 :

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall subject to the provisions of this Act have full validity and force. Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. The district councils mentioned in the Orders relating to Leatherhead Luddenden-Foot New-Windsor Ogmores-and-Garw and West-Ham hereby confirmed shall not purchase or acquire either compulsorily or by agreement ten or more houses which on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers or except with the consent of the Local Government Board ten or more houses which were not so occupied on the said fifteenth day of December but have been or shall be subsequently so occupied. Restriction of power to take houses of labouring class.

3. The following provisions shall apply to the urban sanitary authority for the city of Bath herein-after referred to as "the authority":—

(1.) The authority shall not under the powers of the Bath Order (No. 1) 1897 hereby confirmed purchase or acquire either compulsorily or by agreement ten or more houses which after the passing of this Act have been or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers unless and until—

(a.) They shall have obtained the approval of the Local Government Board to a scheme for providing new dwellings for such number of persons as were residing in such houses on the fifteenth day of December last or for such number of persons as the Local Government Board shall after inquiry deem necessary having regard to the number of persons on or after that date residing in such houses and working within one mile therefrom and to the amount of vacant suitable accommodation in the immediate neighbourhood of such houses or to the place of employment of such persons and to all the circumstances of the case; and

(b.) They shall have given security to the satisfaction of the Local Government Board for the carrying out of the scheme.

(2.) The approval of the Local Government Board to any scheme under this section may be given either absolutely or conditionally and after the Local Government Board have approved of any such scheme they may from time to time approve either absolutely or conditionally of any modifications in the scheme.

(3.) Every scheme under this section shall contain provisions prescribing the time within which it shall be carried out and shall require the new dwellings proposed to be provided under the scheme to be completed fit for occupation before the persons residing in the houses in respect of which the scheme is made are displaced:

Provided that the Local Government Board may dispense with the last-mentioned requirement subject to such conditions if any as they may see fit.

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(4.) Any provisions of any scheme under this section or any conditions subject to which the Local Government Board may have approved of any scheme or of any modifications of any scheme under this section or subject to which they may have dispensed with the above-mentioned requirement shall be enforceable by a writ of mandamus to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of the High Court. A.D. 1897.

(5.) If the authority acquire or appropriate any house or houses for the purposes of this Act or of the Bath Order (No. 1) 1897 in contravention of the foregoing provisions or displace or cause to be displaced the persons residing in any house or houses in contravention of the requirements of the scheme they shall be liable to a penalty of five hundred pounds in respect of every such house which penalty shall be recoverable by the Local Government Board by action in the High Court and shall be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom :

Provided that the Court may if it think fit reduce such penalty.

(6.) Subject to the provisions of this section the authority and the Local Government Board and their inspectors shall have and may exercise for any purpose in connexion with any scheme under this section all or any of the powers vested in them under the Public Health Act 1875 in the same manner in every respect as if the preparation and carrying into effect of such scheme were one of the general purposes of that Act :

Provided that all lands on which any buildings have been erected or provided by the authority in pursuance of any scheme under this section shall for a period of twenty-five years from the date of the scheme be appropriated for the purpose of dwellings and every conveyance demise or lease of such lands and buildings shall be endorsed with notice of this enactment :

Provided also that the Local Government Board may at any time dispense with all or any of the requirements of this subsection subject to such conditions if any as they may see fit.

(7.) The authority shall pay to the Local Government Board a sum to be fixed by that Board in respect of the preparation and issue of any Provisional Order in pursuance of this section and any expenses incurred by that Board in relation to any inquiries under this section including the expenses of any

a sum to be fixed by that Board not exceeding three guineas a
day for the services of such inspector.

Definition of 4. For the purposes of sections two and three of this Act the
labouring
class. expression "labouring class" includes mechanics artizans labourers
and others working for wages hawkers costermongers persons not
working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without
employing others except members of their own family and persons
other than domestic servants whose income does not exceed an
average of thirty shillings a week and the families of any of such
persons who may be residing with them.

Street and Cornwell Buildings in the City :

Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers
given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other
Statutes in that behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the
Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have
effect viz.,—

Art. 1. The Corporation shall be empowered to put in force with reference to
the lands described in the Schedule hereto subject to the continuance of any
existing public rights of highway and for the purpose aforesaid the powers of the
Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise
than by agreement or any of them.

Art. II. This Order may be cited as the Bath Order (No. 1) 1897.

Provisional Order for altering a Local Act.

Bath Order.
(2.)

To the Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Bath ; --
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the City of Bath (herein-after referred to as "the City") is an Urban Sanitary District of which the Mayor Aldermen and Citizens acting by the Council (herein-after referred to as "the Corporation") are the Urban Sanitary Authority and the provisions of the Bath Act 1879 (herein-after referred to as "the Local Act") as altered by the Provisional Orders herein-after mentioned but which do not affect the subject-matter of this Order are in force in the City ;

And whereas by Section 15 of the Local Act the Corporation were empowered as regards the lands comprised in the first part of the First Schedule to that Act and so much of the lands comprised in the second part of the same schedule as might be laid out for public walks to make byelaws for (inter alia) the following purposes :—

For preventing misconduct therein ;

For regulating the days on and hours at which bands of music or music of any sort are or is to be permitted therein and for prescribing the money to be charged for admission to the portion of the said lands where any musical or other entertainment may take place ;

And whereas by Section 20 of the Local Act it was enacted that if and when the lands comprised in the first part of the Third Schedule to that Act should be acquired by the Corporation the same should be subject to and be deemed to be comprised within (inter alia) the provisions of Section 15 of that Act ;

And whereas by Section 21 of the Local Act the Corporation were empowered to lay out any part of the lands comprised in the second and third parts of the First Schedule to that Act and also (if and when the same should be acquired) any part of the lands comprised in the second and third parts of the Third Schedule to that Act and also to purchase by agreement and lay out any other lands not exceeding five acres as a public park and from time to time to manage maintain or demise the same in the same manner as in the Local Act provided with respect to the lands comprised in the first part of the First Schedule to that Act :

Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other Statutes in that behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Local Act shall be altered so that the following provisions shall take effect viz.,—

Art. I. The Corporation may from time to time out of the city fund or city rate pay or contribute towards the payment of a band of music to perform in any park-public walks or places of public resort and recreation for the time being subject to the provisions of Sections 15 20 and 21 of the Local Act :

Provided that the amount of such payments or contributions shall not in any one year exceed the amount produced by a rate of one halfpenny in the pound on the rateable value of the City.

A.D. 1897. Art. II. Section 15 of the Local Act shall be altered—
Bath Order. (1.) By the omission of the words “ For preventing misconduct therein.”
(2.) (2.) So as to provide that the Corporation may exercise as regards any lands for the time being managed maintained or demised by them under the provisions of the Local Act as a public park or for purposes of public recreation and resort the power to make byelaws under that section and also under Section 164 of the Public Health Act 1875.

Art. III. Each of the Provisional Orders relating to Bath the dates whereof are mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto may be cited by the short title mentioned in column 3 of that Schedule this Order may be cited as the Bath Order (No 2) 1897 and all of the said Orders may be cited together as the Bath Orders 1875 to 1897.
