



CHAPTER cxcv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Accrington and Church Outfall Sewerage District and to Acton Chester (Rural) Reigate Weymouth (Rural) and Wigan (Rural). A.D. 1900.
[6th August 1900.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875 :

c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The Orders as altered and set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall subject to the provisions of this Act have full validity and force. Orders in

2. The authorities mentioned in the Orders hereby confirmed shall not under the powers of those Orders purchase or acquire either compulsorily or by agreement ten or more houses which on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers or except with the consent of the Local Government Board ten or more houses which were not so occupied on the said fifteenth day of December but have been or shall be subsequently so occupied. 3. For the purposes of this section the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics artizans labourers and others working for wages hawkers costermongers persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family and persons other than domestic servants whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other Statutes in that behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect viz.,— 38 & 39 Vict .

Art. I. The Sewerage Board shall be empowered to put in force with reference to the lands described in the schedule hereto subject to the continuance of existing public rights of highway (if any) and for the purpose aforesaid the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them :

Provided that the lands described in the schedule hereto shall be used only for the reception treatment and disposal of storm water (consisting of not more than one part of sewage to three parts of water) and of sewage effluent (after previous efficient filtration) from the sewerage and sewage disposal works of the Sewerage Board.

Art. II. This Order may be cited as the Accrington and Church Order 1900.

Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other Statutes in that behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect viz.,—

Art. I. The Rural District Council shall be empowered to put in force with reference to the lands described in the schedule hereto subject to the continuance of existing public rights of highway (if any) and for the purposes aforesaid the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them.

Art. II. The following provisions shall unless otherwise agreed in writing between the Roburite Explosives Company Limited (in this Article called "the Company") and the Rural District Council apply and have effect (that is to say) :

For the protection of the Roburite Explosives Company Limited.

(1.) If the Rural District Council shall in execution of the powers of this Order acquire the lands No. 68 and No. 69 shown on the deposited plans and described in the Schedule hereto or any part thereof they shall not use the said lands for any purpose or cause or permit any act or thing to be done thereon such as would determine or might in anywise affect the continuance of the whole or any part of the Factory License registered at the Home Office as Amending License (Factory) No. X. 13,862 and dated the 25th day of May 1897 granted to the Company by Her Majesty's Secretary of State under the provisions of the Explosives Act 1875 for their explosive works adjoining the said lands.

(2.) If the Rural District Council shall at any time use the lands aforesaid or cause or permit any act or thing to be done thereon contrary to the provisions of subdivision (1) of this Article they shall become liable for all damage or injury thereby caused to the Company or the business or works thereof and the Company may recover the same from the Rural District Council in any court of competent jurisdiction.
