An Act to amend an Act for more effectually repairing and improving the Road from *Wendover* to the Town of *Buckingham* in the County of *Buckingham*. [2d August 1831.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Fourth, intituled *An Act for more effectually repairing and improving the Road from Wendover to the Town of Buckingham in the County of Buckingham*: And whereas the Trustees appointed in and by virtue of the said recited Act have proceeded in the Execution thereof, but have found that some of the Provisions contained in the said Act are defective and insufficient to answer the Purposes thereby intended: And whereas a considerable Sum of Money borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said recited Act still remains undischarged, and cannot be paid off, nor can the said Road be effectually amended, improved, and kept in repair, unless the said Act is amended, and the Tolls thereby granted increased: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of

of the same, That the said recited Act, and all the Powers, Provisions, Pains, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things therein contained, shall (except so far as the same are altered, varied, or repealed,) extend to this Act, and shall be construed therewith in as full and ample a Manner, to all Intents and Purposes, as if the same had been inserted in this Act and made Part thereof.

First Meeting of Trustees.

II. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall meet together at the *White Hart* Inn, or at some other convenient House in the Town of *Aylesbury* in the said County of *Buckingham*, on the Second *Monday* next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Eleven in the Forenoon and Three in the Afternoon, and proceed to carry this Act into execution.

Tolls authorized by the recited Act repealed.

III. And be it further enacted, That the several and respective Tolls authorized by the said recited Act of the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King *George* the Fourth to be demanded and taken at the several Turnpikes, Toll Gates, and Side Gates upon the said Turnpike Road, shall upon and from the Second *Monday* after the passing of this Act be and the same are hereby repealed.

Tolls to be taken.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the respective Tolls following shall (subject to the Provisions, Restrictions, and Exemptions in this Act and the said recited Act, and the General Acts now in force respecting Turnpike Roads in *England*;) be demanded and taken at each and every Turnpike, Toll Gate, and Side-Gate which is now or which shall hereafter be set up or continued upon, across, or by the Sides of the Road by the said recited Act directed to be maintained and kept in repair, by each and every Person who shall be authorized or continued by the said Trustees to receive the same, before any Horse, Mule, Ass, Beast, or other Cattle, or any Carriage, shall be permitted to pass through any such Turnpike, Toll Gate, or Side Gate; (that is to say,)

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Beast of Burden, laden or unladen, and not drawing, a Sum not exceeding Two-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Chaise Marine, Coach, Landau, Berlin, Barouche, Phaeton, Sociable, Chariot, Calash, Hearse, Break, Chaise, Waggon, Cart, Wain, or other Carriage, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence:

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, a Sum not exceeding Ten-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number:

For every Drove of Calves, Hogs, Sheep, or Lambs, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number.

Repeal of Provision as to taking Tolls in *Aylesbury*.

V. And be it further enacted, That so much of the said recited Act of the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Fourth as enacts, that it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to collect any Tolls, or to expend any Money arising by virtue

virtue of this Act in repairing, lighting, or maintaining any of the Streets or public Places within the Limits of the Borough of *Aylesbury*, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

VI. And be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to collect any Tolls by virtue of this Act, nor to expend any Money arising by virtue of this Act in repairing, lighting, or maintaining any of the Streets or public Places in *Aylesbury* between the present Turnpike or Toll House near *Court Farm* in *Walton* and the Junction of the said Road with the *Aylesbury* and *Bicester* Road.

VII. And be it further enacted, That the Costs, Charges, and Expences incident to and attending the obtaining and passing this Act shall be defrayed out of any Monies which may have arisen or out of the first Monies which shall arise by virtue of the said Act and this Act.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

Public Act.

IX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence upon and have Continuance from the said Second *Monday* after the passing of this Act, for and during the Term granted by the said-recited Act.
