An Act to amend an Act of His late Majesty King *George* the Fourth, for repairing the several Roads leading to and from the City of *Exeter*, and for making certain new Lines of Road to communicate with the same, and for keeping in repair *Exe Bridge* and *Countess Wear Bridge*; and to make and maintain other Roads communicating with the said Roads. [23d August 1831.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, intituled *An Act for repairing, widening, and improving the several Roads leading to and from the City of Exeter, and for making certain new Lines of Road to communicate with the same, and for keeping in repair Exe Bridge and Countess Wear Bridge*: And whereas it is expedient that the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Fourth should be amended, for the Purpose of making and maintaining the Lines of Road and Deviations from the present Lines of Road herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) a Road from *Belmont Lodge* to *Longbrook Street*, another Road from the *Red Cow Turnpike Gate* to *Exe Bridge*, and a Branch Road, commencing in the *Hilly Field* above the *Head Wear*, and terminating in the Field next adjoining the County Gaol, to connect the same Two Roads,

Roads, all in the County of the City of *Exeter* or in the County of *Devon*; and also a Road from *Barnstaple Cross* to the *White Hart* Inn in the Parish of *Crediton* in the said County of *Devon*; also a Road from *Dunchideock* to *Lower Shillingford* in the Parishes of *Dunchideock*, *Shillingford*, and *Exminster*, in the said County of *Devon*; also several Deviations from the Road between the Five Mile Stone and *New Cross* Turnpike Gate House in the Parish of *Kings-teignton* in the said County of *Devon*, on the Turnpike Road leading from *Exeter* to *Newton Bushell*; also a Deviation near the Twelve Mile Stone in the *Drayford* Road, through *Kennerleigh Wood*, in the Parishes of *Kennerleigh* and *Sandford* in the County of *Devon*; also a Deviation from near *Heavitree Bridge*, in the Road from *Honiton* to *Exeter*, to the One Mile Stone from *Exeter* in the Parish of *Heavitree* in the said County of *Devon*; also to make Turnpike the Highway from *Beggar's Bush-on-Haldon* to *Chudleigh* in the Parish of *Chudleigh*; also Deviations in the Road leading through *Exwick* to *Exeter* in the Parish of *Saint Thomas the Apostle* in the County of *Devon*: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said recited Act, and all the Powers, Provisions, Tolls, Pains, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things therein contained, shall, save and except where the same are hereby altered, varied, or repealed, be extended to this Act, and be construed therewith in as full and ample a Manner to all Intents and Purposes as if the same had been repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this Act, and made Part hereof.

Power to
make Roads.

II. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Trustees acting under the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Fourth, and their Successors, and they are hereby fully authorized and empowered, to set out, make, and complete, and henceforth maintain and keep in repair, the said several new Lines and Deviations of Road herein-before described and referred to in the Plans and Books of Reference herein-after mentioned, in such Manner and within the Limits herein-after mentioned, as they shall think proper for the Convenience and Benefit of the Public.

III. And whereas Maps or Plans describing the said several new Lines of Road and Deviations of Road, and the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through or over which the same are respectively intended to be made or carried, together with Books of Reference containing the Names of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, have been deposited with the respective Clerks of the Peace for the County of *Devon* and for the City and County of the City of *Exeter*; be it therefore further enacted, That the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said respective Clerks of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may at all reasonable Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and take Copies thereof or Extracts therefrom, at their Will and Pleasure, paying to the respective Clerks of the Peace

One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts: Provided always, that the said Trustees, in making the said several new Lines of Road and Deviations of Road, or any Part or Parts thereof, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Line described in the said Map or Plan, without the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands or Grounds such Deviation shall be made.

Restriction as to Deviations from Plan.

IV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to make the said several new Lines of Road and Deviations of Road through, across, or over the Lands of any Person or Persons who is or are or may be Owner or Owners of the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through or over which the same are respectively set out and described in the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference, although such Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or the Name or Names of such Person or Persons, may be erroneously described, omitted, or mis-stated in the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two Justices of the Peace for the County in which the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments shall be situate, and be certified in Writing under their Hands, that such Omission or Mis statement happened by Mistake.

Lands marked in the Plan may be used notwithstanding Errors in Book of Reference.

V. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Powers and Authorities hereby given for widening and altering the said Roads shall not extend or be construed to extend to empower or authorize the said Trustees to take or pull down any Dwelling House or other Building, or take in or make use of any Garden, Yard, Paddock, Park, planted Walk, or Avenue to a House, or any inclosed Ground planted as Ornament or Shelter to a House, or planted and set apart as a Nursery for Trees, or any Part thereof respectively, without the Consent in Writing of the Owner or Proprietor thereof first had and obtained, other than and except so much and such Part of such Dwelling Houses or other Buildings, Gardens, Yards, Paddocks, Park, planted Walk, Avenues, Nursery for Trees, Woods, and Plantations, as are described in the Schedule to this Act annexed.

Trustees restrained from taking Houses, &c. not inserted in the Schedule.

VI. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That in case the said Trustees shall not purchase or contract to purchase the Lands or Premises specified in the said Schedule within the Space of Three Years from the passing of this Act, all the Powers hereby or by the said recited Act granted for purchasing the same shall thenceforth cease and determine and be utterly void, except with the Consent of the Owners or Proprietors thereof.

Power of Purchase to cease in Three Years.

VII. And be it further enacted, That from and after the making and completing the new Roads and Deviations of Road specified in this Act, the said Trustees shall from thenceforth be discharged from and shall not afterwards expend any Monies in the future Repairs of the Parts of the old Road in lieu whereof such new Road and Deviations shall be made, save and except the present Road situate between the *Red Cow Turnpike Gate* aforesaid and the Termination of the Road,

Trustees discharged from the Repairs of old Roads after new Roads are completed.

Road, now under the Care of the said Trustees, leading towards the City of *Exeter*, which shall continue Turnpike, and be repaired and maintained as such by the said Trustees.

Trustees of Totnes Road discharged from Repair of the Road herein described ;

VIII. And whereas the said intended new Road and Deviations of Road between the Five Mile Stone and *New Cross* Turnpike Gate House in the Parish of *Kingsteignton* aforesaid pass over, upon, or across a Piece or Parcel of Road of or belonging to the Trustees of the *Totnes* Trust, and it is expedient that from and after the making and completing the said last-mentioned new Road or Deviations of Road that the said *Totnes* Trust should be discharged from the Repair thereof; be it therefore enacted, That from and after the said new Road or Deviations of Road between the said Five Mile Stone and *New Cross* Turnpike Gate aforesaid shall be completed, the same and every Part thereof shall be thenceforth repaired, upheld, and maintained by and out of the Monies to arise by this Act or the said recited Act, and the said Trustees of the *Totnes* Trust, now liable and charged with the Repair thereof, shall be thenceforth wholly discharged therefrom.

IX. And whereas it is inexpedient any longer to continue to keep and maintain as Turnpike Road a certain Road leading from the *Exeter* and *Honiton* Turnpike Road, near to *Rockbeare Court*, to the *Lyme* Turnpike Road, on *Aylesbear Hill*; be it further enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act the said Trustees shall be discharged from the future Repairs of the said Road in the said recited Act mentioned, leading from the *Honiton* Turnpike Road, near to *Rockbeare Court*, to the *Lyme* Turnpike Road on *Aylesbear Hill*.

So much of recited Act as directs certain Tolls to be taken repealed.

X. And whereas it is expedient that the Tolls authorized to be taken and levied in and by the said recited Act should in some respects be altered, be it therefore enacted, That so much of the said recited Act as enacts that there shall be paid for every Horse or other Beast drawing any Coach, Barouche, Sociable, Berlin, Chariot, Chair, Phaeton, Caravan, Taxed Cart, Hearse, Litter, or other such like Carriage, (except Stage Coaches,) a Sum not exceeding the Sum of Eight-pence; and for every Horse or other Beast drawing any Van, Caravan, or other such Carriage, used for the Conveyance of Goods for Hire, Pay, or Reward, a Sum not exceeding the Sum of Eight-pence; and for every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, or other such Carriage, where the same shall be drawn by not more than One Horse or other Beast, a Sum not exceeding the Sum of Sixpence, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Tolls to be taken.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the respective Tolls following shall (subject to the Provisions, Restrictions, and Exemptions in the said recited Act contained, except where the same are altered or repealed by this Act,) be demanded and taken at each and every Turnpike, Toll Gate, and Side Gate now set up and continued, or that shall hereafter be set up, upon, across, or by the Sides of the said Roads by this Act or by the said recited Act directed to be made, amended, improved, and kept in repair, by each and every such Person

Person and Persons as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time appoint to receive the same, before any Horse, Mule, Ass, Beast, or other Cattle shall be permitted to pass through any such Turnpike, Toll Gate, or Side Gate ; (that is to say,)

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Gig or Chair, or such like Carriage, with a single Seat only, and with Two Wheels only, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Eight-pence :

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Car or Chair, or other such like Carriage, with double Seats, Phaeton, Caravan, or Taxed Cart, or any Four-wheel light Carriage, where the same shall be drawn by no more than One Horse, any Sum not exceeding Nine-pence :

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Coach, Barouche, Sociable, Berlin, Chariot, Car, Chair, Phaeton, Caravan, Taxed Cart, Hearse, Litter, or such like Carriage, (except Stage Coaches,) where drawn by Two or more Horses or other Beasts, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Eight-pence :

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Van, Caravan, or such like Carriage, used for the Conveyance of Goods for Hire, Pay, or Reward, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Nine-pence :

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon or such like Carriage upon Four Wheels, where the same shall be drawn by not more than One Horse or other Beast, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Nine-pence ; and where the same shall be drawn by Two or any greater Number of Horses, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Sixpence for every such Horse :

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Wain, Dray, Cart, or other such Carriage, upon Two Wheels only, and where the same shall be drawn by not more than One Horse or other Beast, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Eight-pence ; and where the same shall be drawn by Two or any greater Number of Horses, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Sixpence for every such Horse.

XII. And whereas it is by the said recited Act enacted, that no Payment of Toll at any of the Gates erected or to be erected on the Eastern or Northern Side of the River *Exe* should authorize the free Passage of any Horse, Cattle, or Carriage through any Gate erected or to be erected on the Western Side of the said River, or through the Gate erected without the late North Gate of the said City of *Exeter*, (which Gate should be deemed as erected on the Western Side of the said River,) nor should any such Payment at any Gate on the Western Side of the said River, or at the Gate erected without the late North Gate aforesaid, authorize the free Passage of any Horses, Cattle, or Carriages through any of the Gates erected or to be erected on the Eastern or Northern Side of the River *Exe* : And whereas the said Provision has been found inconvenient ; be it therefore enacted, That the said Provision shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

XIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, if they shall think proper so to do, to demand, receive, and take the several Tolls in the said recited Act and this Act mentioned

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and

and set forth at each and every of the Gates erected or to be erected on the Eastern and Western Side of the River *Exe* in or near to the City of *Exeter*; nor shall any Ticket or Tickets taken at any or either of the said Gates aforesaid authorize the free Passage of any Horses, Cattle, or Carriages through any other of the said Gates erected or to be erected in or near to the said City, unless the said Trustees shall so order and direct; any thing in the said recited Act contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

Tolls collected at any new Gate on the Road between Exeter and Honiton not to be expended in Repairs of other Roads.

XIV. Provided always, and it is hereby further enacted, That no Part of the Money which may be collected or received at any new Toll Gate or Toll Gates which may be erected or set up by the said Trustees for the Purpose of collecting any separate or distinct Toll or Tolls upon any Part of any or either of the Roads of the said Trust situated on the Eastern Side of the City of *Exeter*, or diverging from the said City in an Eastern Direction, shall be applied for the Purpose of making and executing any of the several Roads or Deviations of Road which the said Trustees are hereby empowered to make, other than and except any Monies which may be required for and expended in making and executing the aforesaid Deviation upon the said *Honiton* and *Exeter* Road, between *Heavitree Bridge* and the One Mile Stone from *Exeter* in the Parish of *Heavitree* aforesaid.

No more than One Toll to be taken in the same Day on the Lines of Road herein described.

XV. And whereas Doubts are entertained whether, under and by virtue of the herein-before recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Fourth, Power is given to demand and take more than One full Toll on each of the several Lines of Road in the said Act mentioned, leading from *Exeter* aforesaid to a Place called *Straightway Head*, and from the late Gallows to a Place called *Aylesbeare Hill*, and from *Exeter* aforesaid, by *Clist Bridge*, to the Top of *Woodbury Hill* in the Parish of *Woodbury*: And whereas it is expedient to remove and put an End to such Doubts; be it declared and enacted, That no more than One full Toll shall be demanded and taken in any One Day (to be computed as in the said recited Act is mentioned) for the same Horses, Cattle, and Carriage passing and repassing on either of the said several Lines of Road, or any Branch or Side Road leading to and from the same respectively, by virtue of the said recited Act, any thing in the said recited Act contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

Power to make Footpaths.

XVI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to make Causeways or Footpaths, for the Distance of Three Miles from the City of *Exeter*, upon all or any of the principal Roads leading from the said City and belonging to the said Trust, by the Sides of the said Roads; and the same Causeways and Footways shall be kept in repair out of the Tolls directed to be taken or received under and by virtue of the said recited Act or this Act, or Money to be raised on the Credit thereof.

Tolls may be increased in certain Cases.

XVII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if at any Time or Times hereafter, the cutting down of any Hill, or the further Deviation

Deviation required for the Purpose of avoiding any Hill upon any of the several Lines of Road of or belonging to the *Exeter* Turnpike Trust, other than the Alterations and Deviations hereby authorized to be made, shall be deemed necessary, the Costs whereof shall be more in Amount than the Sum of One hundred Pounds, then and in every such Case it shall be lawful for the said Trustees and they are hereby required to increase all and every the Tolls on the Roads in the several and respective Lines of Road upon which any such Expenditure shall be ordered, to any Sum not exceeding One Half more in Amount than the several Tolls imposed by the said recited Act and this Act, or to erect a separate and distinct Toll House and Gate, and to collect Tolls thereat to the said Amount, on the specific Line within which such Improvement or Alteration shall have been made and such Expenditure incurred, and to continue such increased Toll upon such respective Lines of Road until the Money expended in such Improvement respectively be reimbursed and repaid to the said Trustees by means of such increased Toll.

XVIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That for every Carriage or Vehicle of any Description passing along the said Roads in this Act or in the said recited Act mentioned, or any of them, propelled by Steam or other Machinery, the Sum of Sixpence for every Wheel on which the same shall run, if weighing with the Lading (if any) not exceeding One Ton; and if weighing more than One Ton, the further Sum of Sixpence *per* Wheel; and the further Sum of Sixpence *per* Wheel for every Excess of any further Ton Weight.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls and all other Monies to be received by virtue of the said recited Act and of this Act, as also all the Monies which, at the Time of the passing of this Act, shall have been raised or produced under the said recited Act, and shall be then undisposed of, shall be applied as herein-after mentioned; (that is to say), in the first place, in paying and defraying all the Costs, Charges, and Expences incident to and attending the obtaining and passing of this Act, together with lawful Interest for Money advanced by any Person or Persons for that Purpose; in the next place, in paying the Interest of the Money already due on the Security of the said Tolls, and of the Money to be borrowed for the Purpose of making the said several Roads, and in making and maintaining the said Roads, and otherwise in the Manner directed by the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of King *George the Fourth*.

XX. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall and they are hereby required to continue or erect upon each of the Branch Roads comprised in the said recited Act or this Act One or more Toll Gate or Toll Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, and to demand and take thereat the Tolls by the said Acts granted, subject to the Provisions of this Act and the said recited Act; and no Money arising from any of the Tolls by the said Act or this Act authorized to be collected and taken shall be applied in or towards the Repairs of any Branch

Branch Road upon which there shall not be a Toll Gate or Turnpike continued or erected under the Authority of the Trustees for carrying the said Act into execution: Provided also, that no more Money shall be laid out or expended in or towards the Repairs of the said Branch Roads, or be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising or payable upon any such Branch Roads, than shall be actually raised or received upon or in respect of such Branch Road; any thing in the said recited Act or this Act contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

XXI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Trustees to agree with the Trustees for the Time being acting in the Execution of an Act passed in the Fifty-third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled *An Act for making and maintaining a Carriage Road from Padbrooke Bridge in the Parish of Cullompton to Hazel Stone in the Parish of Broadclist in the County of Devon*, for the repairing and keeping in repair the said Road from *Padbrooke Bridge to Hazel Stone* aforesaid, in such and the same Manner as if the same had been originally a Part of the *Exeter* Turnpike Trust; and that it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees of the *Exeter* Trust to take upon themselves; and at their Expence, the Repair of such particular Road, and thereupon to be discharged from the Repair of the present Road from the Way Post on *Stoke Hill* aforesaid to the late *Crab Tree* Alehouse in the Road from *Exeter* through *Bradninch*, and from the Six Mile Stone beyond *Broadclist* to the same Place, and from thence to its Junction with the aforesaid new Road near to the Town of *Cullompton*; and the last-mentioned Roads shall from thenceforth cease to be a Part of the *Exeter* Turnpike Trust; and the aforesaid new Roads towards *Cullompton* shall be considered as a Part thereof, in lieu of the other Roads so hereby meant to be discontinued as aforesaid; but nothing herein contained shall subject the Trustees of the *Exeter* Turnpike Trust to the Payment of any Principal Debt, Interest, or other Monies due from the Trustees of the *Cullompton* Turnpike Trust upon the Credit of the Toll now placed on the said Road, nor to give to the said Trustees of the *Exeter* Turnpike Trust Power or Authority to interfere with any of the Provisoes, Remedies, Powers, or Authorities of any Act relating thereto, save only and except as to the Repairs of such Road as aforesaid; and that the Toll Gate thereon erected or to be erected thereon by the Trustees of the *Cullompton* Turnpike Trust shall remain and be subject to the Provisoes and Powers of the Act relating to such Tolls, and the Payment of the Principal Debt and Monies due thereon, and from Time to Time due thereon and be let and managed, received, paid, and applied, by the Trustees of the *Cullompton* Turnpike Trust as heretofore: Provided always, that the Roads so to be discontinued as Turnpike as aforesaid shall, before the same are discontinued, be put into good and sufficient Repair, be adjudged and determined by the Certificate in Writing of Two Justices of the Peace of the County of *Devon*, and transmitted to the respective Clerks of the said Trusts, and their Adjudication thereon shall be final and conclusive.

XXII. And whereas by an Act passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled *An Act for improving several Roads, and making certain new Roads, in the Counties of Devon and Somerset, leading to and from the Town of Tiverton, and for amending an Act of His present Majesty, for repairing several Roads leading from and through the Town of Wiveliscombe*, the Trustees of the said Road were empowered to contract and agree with the Trustees of the *Exeter* Trust acting in the Execution of the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, for the Transfer to them of the Care and Management of such Parts of the Roads comprised in the said recited Act of the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty as might be more conveniently maintained and repaired by the said Trustees of the *Exeter* Trust, and that such Transfers shall be made for a Sum or Sums of Money in gross, to be paid to the said Trustees under an Act of the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty by the Trustees of the *Exeter* Trust, or on such other Terms and Conditions as might be deemed expedient: And whereas such Roads might be more conveniently repaired, and it would be advantageous to the Public if the Trustees for executing this Act were empowered to agree with the Trustees of the said last-recited Act for the Transfer to the *Exeter* Trust of the Care and Maintenance of such Parts of the said Roads as may be so more conveniently repaired by the said Trustees of the *Exeter* Roads; be it therefore enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Trustees acting in the Execution of this Act to contract and agree with the Trustees for executing the said last-recited Act of the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty for the Transfer to the Trustees of this Act of the Care and Management of such Parts of the Roads comprised in the said last-recited Act as may be so more conveniently maintained in repair, either for a Sum or Sums in gross to be paid by the Trustees of the *Exeter* Roads, or on such other Terms as may be deemed expedient; and such Roads, when so transferred, shall be subject to the same Powers and Directions as the other Roads belonging to the said *Exeter* Trust.

Power to agree with Trustees of the adjoining Trust for the Transfer of Part of the Tiverton Road.

XXIII. And be it further enacted, That so much of the said recited Act as enacts, that the Drawbridge across the Cut called the *Haven* or *Hayne* should be repaired, maintained, and kept in repair by the Trustees thereby appointed for the Care and Management of the said *Countess Wear Bridge* and Roads, out of the Tolls arising and to arise and to be collected and taken at and upon the said Bridge and Roads, and that in case the Mayor, Bailiffs, and Commonalty of the said City of *Exeter* should refuse or neglect to pay to the said last-mentioned Trustees yearly and every Year the Sum of Ten Pounds theretofore and now payable to the said Trustees for the Purpose of indemnifying and saving harmless the said Mayor, Bailiffs, and Commonalty from the Repairs of the said Drawbridge, shall be and the same is hereby repealed; and the said Drawbridge shall hereafter be repaired and kept in repair by the Person or Persons subject and liable to the Repairs thereof.

XXIV. And be it further enacted, That every Person opening the said Drawbridge, or any other Swivel or Draw Bridge hereafter to be made at or near the Scite of the present Drawbridge, shall and he is hereby required and directed, so soon as any Ship, Vessel, or Craft shall have passed any such Bridge, to close, shut, or let down and fasten the same so as not to obstruct the Passage over the same; and every Person neglecting so to do, or permitting the same to remain open for any longer Time than shall be necessary for the Passage of any such Ship, Vessel, or Craft, shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence a Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds; and in case any such Bridge shall be left open longer than necessary for the Passage of any Ship or Vessel, or if through the Neglect or Carelessness of any Person belonging to such Ship or Vessel than the Master or Owner of such Ship or Vessel shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence a Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds; and if any Person or Persons shall wilfully open or cause to be opened such Swivel or Draw Bridge when the same is not required for the Passage of any Ship, Vessel, or Craft through the same, such Person or Persons shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay a Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds; and it shall and may be lawful for the Toll Gatherer, or such other Person as may be employed by the said Trustees, to shut, let down, and fasten the said Drawbridge, as often as there shall be Occasion for that Purpose, upon Neglect in that Behalf of any Person belonging to any Ship, Vessel, or Craft, or in the Employ of the said Mayor, Bailiffs, and Commonalty.

XXV. And whereas by the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Fourth, the said Trustees were authorized to make a new Road from *Cowley Bridge* to the *Exeter* Turnpike Road near *Stoke Bridge*: And whereas the said Road has been made from *Cowley Bridge* so far as the Point of Junction of the same Road with the *Tiverton* Turnpike Road near *Swafford Lake* in the Parish of *Stoke Canon*, where the said Roads join the Highway leading from the said Point of Junction to *Stoke Bridge*; and Doubts might arise whether a certain Part of the said Road is under the Care and Management of the Trustees of the said recited Act; be it therefore enacted, That the Piece of Road leading from the said Point of Junction to *Stoke Bridge* shall not be deemed and taken to be Part of the Roads to be repaired by virtue of this Act or the said recited Act, but shall be deemed and taken to be a common Highway.

Public Act.

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

Term of Act.

XXVII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence upon the passing thereof, and shall continue and be in force for and during the Remainder of the Term granted by the said recited Act.
