An Act for better repairing the Roads from *Warminster* and from *Frome* to the *Bath Road*, and from *Woolverton* to the *Trowbridge Road*, in the Counties of *Wilts* and *Somerset*, and for making certain new Lines of Road branching out of such Roads to and towards *Bath*. [10th *June* 1833.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Fifty-second Year of the Reign of His Majesty King *George* the Third, intituled *An Act for repairing the Roads from Warminster and from Frome to the Bath Road, and from Woolverton to the Trowbridge Road, in the Counties of Wilts and Somerset*: And whereas the Trustees appointed in or by virtue of the said recited Act have proceeded to put the same in execution, and have made considerable Progress in repairing, widening, and otherwise improving the several Roads thereby directed to be repaired, widened, and improved, and have for that Purpose, in pursuance of the Powers to them thereby given, borrowed considerable Sums of Money on the Credit of the Tolls thereby granted, which Sums of Money remain undischarged and cannot be paid off, nor can the said several Roads, nor the new Lines of Road herein-after mentioned, be effectually made, amended, widened, improved, and kept in repair, unless the Term granted by the said recited Act be further continued, and the Powers of the said Act be altered, varied, and enlarged: And whereas the Line of the present Turnpike Road leading from *Warminster* to *Bath* is in many

Parts very steep, hilly, and dangerous, and in other Parts narrow and inconvenient, and it would be of great Utility to the Public if new and additional Lines and Branches of Road were made: And whereas for the Purposes aforesaid it is expedient that the said recited Act should be repealed: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That upon the Day of the Commencement of this Act the said recited Act shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

II. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be put into execution for and during the Term herein-after mentioned, for the Purpose of repairing, amending, widening, making, altering, and improving the several Roads herein-after described; that is to say, the Roads from the Gate of the Churchyard in the Town of *Warminster* in the County of *Wilts*, and from the Boundary Stone of the *Frome* Turnpike Trustees on *North Hill* in *Frome* in the County of *Somerset*, to *Beckington* in the County of *Somerset*, and from thence through *Woolverton*, *Norton Saint Philip*, *Charter-house Hinton*, and *Midford*, to a Place in the Parish of *Southstoke* in the said County of *Somerset* where the Roads to *Bath* and *Bristol* lately divided; and the Road branching out of the same Road round the *Red Lion Inn* in the Parish of *Woolverton*, and leading to *Road Bridge*, and from the said Bridge to the present Turnpike Road which leads from *Trowbridge* by *White Trough* to *Beckington*, in the said County of *Somerset*; and the Road leading from the said Road at *North Hill* Turnpike Gate in the Parish of *Frome* in the County of *Somerset* to *Clink Cross Ways*, and from thence to *Fromefield* in the said Parish, and there joining the said Road; and the Road branching from the said Road near the Canal Bridge in the Parish of *Southstoke* in the said County of *Somerset*, and joining the said Road in a Field called *Great Nibbles*, in the said Parish; being the Roads by the said recited Act directed to be repaired.

New Roads.

III. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Trustees acting in the Execution of this Act, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to make, improve, maintain, and keep in repair, according to the Maps or Plans herein-after mentioned, the new and additional Lines and Branches of Road following; that is to say, One new Line of Road, to commence and branch out of the present Turnpike Road at an old Inclosure called *Willoughby*, in the Parish of *Upton Scudamore* in the County of *Wilts*, near the Second Mile Stone from *Warminster*, in the said Parish of *Upton Scudamore*, and continuing thence through or into the several Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, Tythings, or Places of *Upton Scudamore*, *Short Street*, *Westbury*, *Berkley*, and *Standerwick* in the Counties of *Wilts* and *Somerset*, to and to terminate at or near a Place called or known by the Name of *Calves Bridge*, on *Standerwick Common* in the County of *Somerset*; One new Line of Road, to commence and branch out of the present Turnpike Road at or near the *Red Lion Inn* at *Woolverton* in the County of *Somerset* at the Junction of the Road leading to *Telisford*, and continuing thence through or into the several Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, Tythings, or Places of *Woolverton*, *Telisford*, *Road*, *Norton Saint Philip*, *Hungerford Farleigh*, *Charter-house Hinton*, *Freshford*, *Limpley Stoke*,

Stoke, Bradford, Monckton Combe, Claverton, Bathampton, and Bathwick, in the Counties of Wilts and Somerset, to and to terminate at or near the North-west Corner of Sydney Gardens in the said Parish of Bathwick in the County of Somerset; and One new Branch Road from and out of the present Turnpike Road at Charter-house Hinton aforesaid, in or near the Line of the Highway leading to Hinton Abbey in the said Parish of Charter-house Hinton, to unite with the last-mentioned new Road near Hinton Abbey aforesaid.

IV. V. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Trustees appointed by this Act, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, Power to appoint additional Trustees.

empowered, at any Meeting or Meetings to be held for that Purpose within One Year next after the Commencement of this Act, provided that Notice of the Time and Place of every such Meeting be given by the Clerk to the said Trustees by affixing the same in Writing upon all the Toll Gates or Turnpikes erected upon the said Roads, and by inserting such Notice in Two provincial Papers circulated in the Counties of *Wilts* and *Somerset*, Fourteen Days at least before such Meeting, to elect, nominate, and appoint any Number of fit and proper Persons, not exceeding Six in the whole (of whom Three shall be resident in the County of *Wilts* and Three in the County of *Somerset*), to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, in addition to the Trustees hereby appointed; and such Trustees so elected and appointed shall be and they are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been hereby nominated and appointed a Trustee or Trustees for such Purpose.

First Meeting of Trustees.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold their First Meeting at the *Red Lion* Inn or at some other convenient Place in *Woolverton* aforesaid on the Third *Tuesday* next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Eleven of the Clock in the Forenoon and Two of the Clock in the Afternoon, and shall then and there proceed to put this Act into execution, and shall then and there afterwards adjourn to and meet at such Time or Times and such Place or Places near to the said Roads as the said Trustees or the major Part of them present at any such Meetings shall think proper and appoint.

Power to take Tolls.

VII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Person or Persons appointed or continued or to be appointed Collector or Collectors of the Tolls to be taken by virtue of this Act, and they are hereby authorized, to demand and take, at each and every of the several and respective Toll Gates or Turnpikes or Toll Houses, Side Gates, Side Bars, or Chains, now set up or continued or which shall hereafter be set up upon or across or by the Side of the Roads by this Act authorized or directed to be made, amended, widened, improved, and kept in repair, or the said new Lines of Road, the respective Tolls hereinafter mentioned; (that is to say,)

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Coach, Barouche, Sociable, Berlin, Chariot, Landau, Chaise, Phaeton, Curricule, Gig, Caravan, Cart upon Springs, Hearse, Litter, or any other such like Carriage, any Sum not exceeding Sixpence :

For every Horse, Mule, Ox, Ass, or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage having the Fellies of the Wheels of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards at the Bottoms or Soles thereof, any Sum not exceeding Four-pence Halfpenny :

For every Horse, Mule, Ox, Ass, or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage having the Fellies of the Wheels of the Breadth of Four Inches and a Half and less than Six Inches at the Bottoms or Soles thereof, any Sum not exceeding Sixpence :

For every Horse, Mule, Ox, Ass, or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage having the Fellies of the

Wheels of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half at the Bottoms or Soles thereof, any Sum not exceeding Eight-pence :
 For every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, any Sum not exceeding Two-pence :
 For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, any Sum not exceeding Ten-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :
 For every Drove of Calves, Swine, Sheep, or Lambs, any Sum not exceeding Five-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :
 For every Carriage impelled or drawn by Machinery or Steam, and not by any Animal or Animals, any Sum not exceeding Two Shillings :
 And for every Carriage attached to and drawn by a Machinery or Steam Carriage, any Sum not exceeding Two Shillings :

And in all Cases where there shall be a fractional Part of a Halfpenny in the Calculation or gross Amount of the Tolls hereby granted or authorized to be taken, or in the Apportionment of such Tolls or any of them, the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be demanded and taken in lieu of such fractional Part ; and all the Tolls and Money to be collected or levied by virtue of this Act or the said recited Acts shall be and are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and shall be applied for the Purposes of this Act in manner herein-after mentioned.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That in case the Tolls hereby authorized to be taken shall have been paid for the passing of any Horse, Beast, or Cattle through any one of such Toll Gates or Turnpikes, Side Gates, Side Bars, or Chains, such Horse, Beast, or Cattle shall, upon a Ticket being produced denoting the Payment thereof on the same Day (to be computed from Twelve of the Clock in one Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next succeeding Night) be permitted to pass Toll-free through the same Toll Gate, Turnpike, Side Gate, Side Bar, or Chain, and also through such other Toll Gate, Turnpike, Side Gate, Side Bar, or Chain (if any) as the Ticket for such Payment shall denote to be free, at any Time or Times during the same Day, to be computed as aforesaid.

IX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That there shall not be demanded and taken on the same Day, for or in respect of the same Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage, between the Towns of *Warminster* and *Frome* respectively and the Place where the Roads to *Bath* and *Bristol* lately divided in the said Parish of *Southstoke*, more than Three Tolls, nor between the same Towns of *Warminster* and *Frome* respectively and the said City of *Bath*, by the new Lines of Road, more than Four Tolls, nor on the Road leading from the *Red Lion* Inn in the said Parish of *Woolverton* by the Village of *Road*, to the *Trowbridge* Turnpike Road, more than One Toll ; nor shall any Person having paid such Toll for any Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage at any Gate on the said Road be liable to pay Toll again on the same Day for the same Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage at any other Gate on the same Road which shall be less than Three Miles distant from the Gate at which such Payment was made.

X. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby imposed shall be paid for and in respect of all Horses or Beasts drawing any Stage Coach, Waggon, or other Stage Carriage employed in carrying Passengers or Goods for more than One Person for Payment, Hire, or Reward, for every Time of passing and repassing through all or any of the Toll Gates or Turnpikes continued or erected by virtue of this Act : Provided always, that no further or additional Toll shall be payable in respect only of the Horses or Beasts drawing any such Stage Coach, Waggon, or other Stage Carriage having been changed.

XI. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby imposed shall be paid for and in respect of the Horses or other Beasts let out to Hire, and drawing any Post Chaise or other such Carriage, every Time such Post Chaise or other such Carriage shall pass along the said Roads whenever a new Hiring thereof shall take place.

XII. And be it further enacted, That all Horses or other Beasts drawing Carts, Waggon, and other such Carriages laden with Stone (not being a single Block) Gravel, or Sand from any of the Quarries within any of the Parishes in which any of the said Roads are situate, or in any adjoining Parishes, or laden with Timber (not being a single Tree or Log), shall be allowed to pass with their Load, and to repass twice through the same Toll Gate, Turnpike, Side Gate, Side Bar, or Chain, on Payment of One full Toll only ; but that the same Horses or other Beasts drawing every such Waggon, Cart, or other such Carriage so laden, and afterwards passing through the same Toll Gate, Turnpike, Side Gate, Side Bar, or Chain, shall be subject and liable to the Payment of One Half of the Toll imposed by this Act on the same Horses or other Beasts drawing such Waggon, Cart, or other such Carriage, and no more, during the same Day.

XIII. And whereas it frequently happens that Carts drawn by One Horse passing along the said Roads carry a greater Weight than is allowed by Law for Carts drawn by Two or more Horses ; be it therefore further enacted, That all Carts passing along the said Roads drawn by One Horse only shall and may be weighed at any Weighing Engine now erected or to be erected on the said Roads, and the like additional Tolls demanded, received, and recovered for the Overweight thereof as is by Law payable in respect of the Overweight of Carts drawn by Two or more Horses ; and all the Powers, Regulations, and Penalties now in force relating to the weighing of Waggon, Carts, and other such Carriages drawn by more than One Horse shall be applicable to Carts passing on the said Roads drawn by One Horse only, and to the Drivers, Masters, and Owners thereof.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That out of the Monies already received by virtue of the said recited Act hereby repealed on account of the Roads thereby directed to be made and repaired, and now remaining unappropriated or undisposed of, or out of the first Money which shall arise and be produced by or from the Tolls by this Act granted and made payable, or otherwise, the said Trustees shall, in the first place, pay and discharge all the Costs, Charges, and Expences which have been incurred in or about applying for, preparing, obtaining, and passing this Act, and otherwise

otherwise relating thereto; and the Remainder of all such Monies shall (after Payment of the necessary Expences of erecting or repairing Toll Gates, Toll Houses, Side Gates, Bars, or Chains, Milestones, Posts, and Fences, and for Books, Advertisements, Salaries of Officers, and other Expences incidental to the Execution of this Act,) be applied in keeping down the Interest of the Principal Monies advanced or borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the said Roads by virtue of the said Act hereby repealed, in preference to the Interest of any Monies to be borrowed on the Credit of this Act; and in the next place in keeping down the Interest of the Principal Monies which may hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of this Act; and afterwards in making, repairing, and keeping in repair, amending, widening, altering, or improving, the said several Roads by this Act directed to be made, repaired, and kept in repair, amended, widened, altered, or improved, and otherwise putting this Act into execution; and then in repaying the Principal Monies already borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the said Roads by virtue of the said Act hereby repealed, and to be borrowed on the Credit of this Act, and to or for no other Use or Purpose whatsoever.

XV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Part of the Money received by virtue of the said recited Act, or to be received by virtue of this Act, shall be applied in or towards the Repair of any Branch Road comprised in this Act, unless some Toll Gate, Toll Bar, or Turnpike shall be erected and continued upon such Branch Road, nor unless the said Tolls shall be demanded and taken, pursuant to the Provisions of this Act: Provided also, that no more Money shall be expended by the said Trustees in or towards the Repairs of any such Branch Road than shall be collected on such Branch Road, or borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls taken thereon.

XVI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to apply, expend, or appropriate any of the Tolls hereby granted, or any of the Monies raised by virtue of the said recited Act hereby repealed, or to be raised by virtue of this Act, in repairing, paving, lighting, cleansing, or otherwise improving any Street, Road, or Highway in any Town through or into which the said Roads pass, except for the Purpose of purchasing and taking and pulling down the several Houses, Buildings, Yards, inclosed Grounds, Hereditaments, and Premises comprised in the Schedule to this Act annexed.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees and they are hereby fully authorized and empowered to set out, make, and complete the said several new Lines of Road and the said Branch Road herein-before particularly mentioned and described, and every Part thereof, and to make the same respectively in such Manner and Form and of such Width as the said Trustees may think proper, not exceeding the Width of Sixty Feet; and from and after the making and executing thereof the same shall respectively be and be deemed to be a public Highway or Highways to all Intents and Purposes; and for which several Purposes, as well as for the Purpose of widening the existing Roads, the said Trustees are hereby authorized and empowered to make the same respectively in, upon, through, over, or along any Lands, Grounds, Tenements, and Hereditaments described in the Map or Plan, Maps or Plans, and

and Book or Books of Reference herein-after mentioned, together with such Footpaths, Causeways, Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Ditches, Drains, and Fences, as they shall think necessary or expedient, and to pull down and remove or take and use any Dwelling Houses, Outhouses, Edifices, Buildings, Curtilages, Courts, Yards, Gardens, Orchards, Paddocks, Lawns, Shrubberies, planted Walks, or Avenues to any House, Nurseries, or any inclosed Ground planted and set apart as a Nursery for Trees, or other Hereditaments mentioned and set forth in the Schedule to this Act annexed, with their Appurtenances, and upon making Satisfaction for the same to the Owners of the said Hereditaments and Premises and other Persons interested therein, or for the Damage which such Owners or other Persons may respectively sustain thereby; and also it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and for their Surveyor or Surveyors, Officers, and Workmen, from Time to Time to enter upon the said several Lands and Premises, and to stake and mark out the same for the Purposes of this Act, at such Time or Times and in such Manner as the said Trustees shall think necessary or expedient, without such Trustees, Surveyor or Surveyors, Officers, or Workmen being deemed Trespassers or a Trespasser for or by reason of such Entry, or being subject or liable to any Fine, Penalty, or Punishment for or by reason of such Entry; and if any Person shall displace, remove, or take away or destroy any Stake or Stakes, Mark or Marks used in such staking or marking as aforesaid, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds.

The Plan deposited with the Clerk of the Peace, to remain there, and be open to Inspection.

Restricting Deviation from Plan.

XVIII. And whereas a Map or Plan, Maps or Plans, describing the several new and additional Lines and Branches of Road and other Improvements, and the Lands, Hereditaments, and other Premises in, upon, through, over, or along which the same are respectively intended to be made and carried, together with a Book or Books of Reference to such Map or Plan, Maps or Plans, containing a List of the Names of the Owners or reputed Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Hereditaments, and other Premises, have been deposited at the Offices of the Clerks of the Peace for the Counties of *Wilts* and *Somerset*; be it therefore enacted, That the said Map or Maps, Plan or Plans, and Book or Books of Reference, shall remain in the Custody of the said Clerks of the Peace respectively, to the end that all Persons may at all reasonable Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and to take Copies or Extracts thereof, at their Will and Pleasure, paying to the said Clerks of the Peace respectively the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts; and the said Trustees, in making such new additional Lines and Branches of Road and other Improvements, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Lines described in the said Map or Plan, Maps or Plans, without the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, in, upon, through, or over whose Lands and Premises the said new and additional Lines and Branches of Road and other Improvements shall respectively be made.

XIX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Trustees to make the said several new and additional Lines and Branches of Road and other Improvements in, upon, through, over, or along the Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises set out and described

in

in the said Map or Maps, Plan or Plans, or Book or Books of Reference, although such Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises, or the Name or Names of the Owner or Owners, or reputed Owner or Owners or Occupiers of such Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises, or of the Parish or Parishes, County or Counties in which such Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises are mentioned to be situate, or the Parish or Parishes, County or Counties from, through, or into which such new and additional Lines and Branches of Road and other Improvements, or any or either of them, shall commence, pass, run, or determine, shall or may be erroneously mentioned, described, omitted, or mis-stated in the said Map or Maps, Plan or Plans, or Book or Books of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace of the County wherein such Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises shall be situate, and to be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Omission, Misnomer, or inaccurate Description proceeded from Mistake only.

XX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Powers and Authorities by this Act given for making, repairing, and keeping in repair, amending, widening, altering, or improving, the said Roads comprised in this Act, and making such new and additional Lines and Branches of Road, shall not extend or be construed to extend to authorize or empower the said Trustees to take or pull down, injure or damage, any Dwelling House or other Building, or to take in or make use of any Curtilage, Orchard, Garden, Yard, Park, Paddock, Lawn, Shrubby, planted Walk, or Avenue to a House, Plantation, or any Part thereof respectively, without the Consent in Writing of the Owner and Occupier thereof first had and obtained, except such as are mentioned and specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed, with their Appurtenances.

Dwelling Houses, &c. not to be taken, except those mentioned in Schedule, without Consent.

XXI. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees from Time to Time to treat, contract, and agree with the Parties or Persons who shall be Owners of or interested in any Lands, Buildings, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises to be taken or made use of in the Execution of this Act, or which shall or may be required for the Purpose of a Toll House or Toll Houses, with Outhouses and other Conveniences thereto, and suitable Garden Plots for each of such Toll Houses not exceeding One Eighth Part of a Statute Acre to each Toll House, or who shall sustain any Loss or Damage by means thereof, for the Purchase of such Lands, Buildings, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Premises, and for the Value, Consideration, Compensation, or Satisfaction to be made for the same, or for such Loss or Damage as aforesaid; and it shall be lawful for all Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, Tenants for Life or in Tail, Husbands, Guardians, Trustees, Feoffees in Trust, Committees, Executors, Administrators, and all other Persons whomsoever, not only for and on behalf of themselves, their Heirs and Successors, but also for and on behalf of the Person or Persons entitled in Reversion, Remainder, or Expectancy after them, and for and on behalf of their Cestuique Trusts, whether Femmes Covert, Wards, Infants, or Issue unborn, Lunatics, Idiots, Persons of unsound Mind, Memory, and Understanding, or other Person or Persons whomsoever, and for all Femmes Covert who are or shall be seised or interested in their own Right, or entitled to Dower, and for all and every Person and Persons whomsoever

soever who are or shall be seised or possessed of or interested in such Lands, Buildings, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises, to give their Consent in Writing to the said Trustees for the taking and using any such Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises, or who shall sustain any Damage as aforesaid to give their Consent in Writing to the said Trustees for the taking and using any such Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Premises, and the pulling down of any Dwelling House or any other Building, and to treat, contract, and agree with the said Trustees for executing this Act for the Value, Consideration, Compensation, or Satisfaction to be made for such Property or Interest, or for any Loss or Damage as aforesaid, and by Conveyance, Lease, and Release, or Bargain and Sale, to sell and convey unto the said Trustees any such Lands, Buildings, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises, or any Part thereof, for the Purposes of this Act; and all Contracts, Agreements, Sales, and Conveyances which shall be so made shall be good, valid, and effectual to all Intents and Purposes without Fine or Recovery, and shall be a complete Bar to all Estates Tail, and other Estates, Rights, Titles, Trusts, and Interests whatsoever, any Law, Statute, Usage, or other Matter whatsoever to the contrary notwithstanding; and all such Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, Tenants for Life or in Tail, Husbands, Guardians, Trustees, Feoffees, Committees, Executors, and Administrators, and all other Persons, shall be and are hereby indemnified for what they shall do by virtue or in pursuance of this Act; and if any such Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, Tenants for Life or in Tail, Husbands, Guardians, Trustees, Feoffees, Committees, Executors, or Administrators, or any other Person or Persons as aforesaid, upon Notice to him, her, or them given or left in Writing at the Dwelling House or Houses, Place or Places of Abode of such Person or Persons, or of the principal Officer or Officers of such Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, Tenants for Life or in Tail, or at the House of the Tenants in possession of any such Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises, shall for the Space of Thirty Days next after such Notice given or left as aforesaid neglect or refuse to treat or shall not agree in the Premises, or by reason of Absence shall be prevented from treating, then and in every such Case the said Trustees shall cause such Value, Consideration, Compensation, Satisfaction, or Damages to be inquired into and ascertained by a Jury in the Manner prescribed by an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled *An Act to amend the General Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England*, or any other Act or Acts relating thereto, in Cases where any Damages, Value, or Recompence for Premises thereby authorized to be taken and used for widening, diverting, altering, and improving any Turnpike Road are directed to be inquired into and ascertained, subject to all the Regulations and Provisions of the said Act or Acts relative to the summoning and impannelling and finding the Jury, the summoning of Witnesses, the fining of the Sheriff, his Deputy, Bailiff, or Agent, and fining the Witnesses, and to the Payment of the Expences of summoning and maintaining the Jury and Witnesses.

XXII. And be it further enacted, That if the said Trustees shall not, within the Space of Three Years from and after the passing of this Act,
agree

agree for or cause to be valued the Houses and other Property mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, then and from thenceforth the Powers granted to them for such Purpose only shall cease, determine, and be utterly void and of no effect, save and except with the Consent in Writing of the Owners or reputed Owners and Occupiers of such Houses and other Property, any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XXIII. XXIV. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, from Time to Time and at all Times during the Continuance of this Act, at any Meeting or Meetings to be held for that Purpose, of which Twenty-one Days Notice shall be given in Two Newspapers to be circulated in the Counties of *Wilts* and *Somerset*, by any Writing or Writings under their Hands and Seals, according to the Form and in Manner prescribed by the Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Fourth, intituled *An Act to amend the General Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England*, to borrow and take up at Interest, upon the Credit of the Tolls arising by virtue of this Act, such further Sum or Sums of Money as they shall think fit, so as the Monies which are now due and the total Amount of the Monies which may be so borrowed shall not exceed in the whole the Sum of Thirty thousand Pounds: Provided always, that after the said Trustees shall have borrowed and taken up at Interest such Sum or Sums of Money as with the Monies now due shall amount to the said Sum of Thirty thousand Pounds, they shall not borrow or take up at Interest any further or other Sum until the entire Debt due on the Security of the said Tolls shall be reduced to the Sum of Twelve thousand Pounds at the least; and then, and not before, it shall be lawful for them, or any Five or more of them, from Time to Time and at all Times during the Continuance

Continuance of this Act, at any Meeting or Meetings to be held for that Purpose, of which the like Notice as before mentioned shall have been given, to borrow and take up at Interest in like Manner such further Sum or Sums of Money as they shall think fit, so as the Monies which may be then due and the total Amount of the Monies which may be so from Time to Time borrowed as last mentioned shall not then exceed in the whole the Sum of Fifteen thousand Pounds.

XXV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees or any Number of them to give, execute, or deliver to any Person or Persons any Mortgage under the Authority of this Act for a greater or less Principal Sum than One hundred Pounds, notwithstanding the said Trustees shall borrow and take up at Interest of the same Person or Persons, at one and the same Time, a greater Sum of Money than One hundred Pounds, and notwithstanding they shall be required to exchange and give a new Mortgage or Mortgages in lieu of any Security or Securities, now standing out and remaining unsatisfied, which were granted by virtue of the said recited Act, but that the Monies to be advanced or secured as aforesaid shall be secured by separate Mortgages for One hundred Pounds each, to be respectively and progressively numbered.

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized, directed, and required, from and after the Year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, at their General Annual Meeting yearly and every Year during the Continuance of this Act, to deduct and retain, from and out of the Tolls arising or to arise and to be received by virtue of this Act, the Sum of Ten Pounds *per Centum* upon the net Receipt of the said Tolls, to be applied for the Purpose of redeeming or reducing the Debt already incurred or hereafter to be incurred by the said Trustees on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the said Roads, or so much and such Part thereof as the Powers herein contained shall enable them to do, and to pay and apply the same towards discharging the Principal Monies so due and owing rateably amongst all the Creditors, or to determine by Lot to which of such Creditors the Whole or any Portion thereof shall be so paid, and to pay the same to such Creditor or Creditors only, or to any of the Creditors, with the Consent of all the other Creditors.

XXVII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Trustees to apply any further Sum or Sums of Money arising from the said Tolls, or from the lawful Gift, Grant, Lease, or Subscription of any Person or Persons for that Purpose, in order for the more speedy Discharge of the Debt due and to become due on the Security of the said Tolls in manner aforesaid.

Penalty for exercising Three Horses abreast, or hanging Linen near the Roads, &c.

XXVIII. And be it further enacted, That if any Person shall exercise Three Horses at the same Time upon any Part of the said Roads by riding one of them and leading the others abreast; or if any Person shall hang out any Yarn, Thread, Cloth, Linen, or Clothes within Fifteen Feet of either Side of the said Roads or any of them; or if any Founder or other Person occupying a Foundry, or any Person using a Forge for forging or heating Metal, situate near or adjoining any of the said

said Roads, and having a Window or Windows fronting the said Roads, shall not, by good and close Shutters, every Evening after it becomes Twilight, bar and prevent the Light from such Foundry, Forge, or Metal shining into or upon the said Roads; or if any Wheelwright or Person employed in the tiring of Wheels near any of the said Roads shall, after Twilight, permit the Light or Fire from the Fire or Wheel to shine into or upon the said Roads; every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings.

XXIX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.

XXX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect upon the Third *Tuesday* next after the passing thereof, and shall thenceforth continue and be in force for and during the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
