An Act to repeal an Act of the Forty-ninth Year of King *George* the Third, for the more easy and speedy Recovery of Small Debts within the Parish of *Merthyr Tidfil* and other Places therein mentioned in the Counties of *Glamorgan, Brecon,* and *Monmouth.* [16th June 1834.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Third, intituled *An Act for the more easy and speedy Recovery of Small Debts within the Parish of Merthyr Tidfil and other Places therein mentioned in the Counties of Glamorgan, Brecon, and Monmouth:* And whereas the said recited Act has not been found to operate beneficially, and the Court established thereby has not been found to answer the Purposes for which the same was intended, but on the contrary thereof has been found inconvenient: And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be repealed: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the First Day of *January* One thousand eight hundred and thirty-five no Action shall be heard and determined within the

said Court; and from and after the First Day of *January* One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven the said recited Act shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Public Act. II. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.
