## GULELMI IV. REGIS.

## Cap. civ.

An Act to rectify a Mistake in an Act passe din the present Session of Parliament, for more effectually repairing the Road from the Exeter Turnpike Road to Biddaford, and certain Roads leading from Bridgetown Pomeroy and Totnes, and other Roads communicating therewith, and for repairing Totnes Bridge, and erecting Bridges over the Stover Canal, the Rivers Teign and Lemon, and the Mill Leat, all in the County of Devon.

[21st August 1835.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled An Act for more effectually repairing the Road 5 W. 4. c. 26. from the Exeter Turnpike Road to Biddaford, and certain Roads leading from Bridgetown Pomeroy and Totnes, and other Roads communicating therewith, and for repairing Totnes Bridge, and erecting Bridges over the Stover Canal, the Rivers Teign and Lemon, and the Mill Leat, all in the County of Devon: And whereas the several Roads herein-after described, (that is to say,) the Road from the Hollow Way on the West Side of Lord Clifford's Park Gate in the Parish of Ideford to Biddaford in the Parish of Ugborough; from the East End of Chudleigh Bridge in the Parish of Chudleigh to a Place called New Cross, in the Parish of Kingsteignton; from the Borough of Bridgetown Pomeroy to the Village of Berry Pomeroy; and from the said Borough of Bridgetown Pomeroy to [Local.]

a Place called Batterways Bridge, in the Parish of Paington; from the said Borough of Bridgetown Pomeroy to a Place called Wrinkle Horn, in the said Parish of Berry Pomeroy; from the Village of Collaton in the Parish of Paington to the Turnpike Road leading from Brixham Quay to Exeter; and from the Town and Borough of Totnes to a Place about Four hundred and seventy Yards South of a Farm-house called Farmstone, in the Parish of Halwell, all in the County of Devon, were by virtue of an Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth placed under the Care and Management of the Trustees therein named: And whereas the said Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth hath been repealed by the said recited Act passed in the present Session of Parliament; and the said Trustees have been discharged from the Repairs of the Road from the Hollow Way on the West Side of Lord Clifford's Park Gate in the Parish of *Ideford* to or near the Entrance of a certain Lane called Strap Lane, in the Parish of Kingsteignton, and in lieu thereof certain other Roads described in the said Act have been placed under their Care and Management: And whereas it is in and by the said recited Act enacted, that the said Act shall commence and take effect and be put in execution, for and during the Term therein-after mentioned, for the Purpose of more effectually amending, widening, altering, and from Time to Time repairing and otherwise improving the several Roads following; (that is to say,) the Road from the East End of Chudleigh Bridge in the Parish of Chudleigh to New Cross in the Parish of Kingsteignton; from the Borough of Bridgetown Pomeroy to the Village of Berry Pomeroy; and from the said Borough of Bridgetown Pomeroy to a Place called Batterways Bridge, in the Parish of Paington; from the said Borough of Bridgetown Pomeroy to Wrinkle Horn in the said Parish of Berry Pomeroy; from the Village of Collaton in the Parish of Paington to the Turnpike Road leading from Brixham Quay to Exeter; and from the Town and Borough of Totnes to a Place about Four hundred and 'seventy Yards South of a Farmhouse called Farmstone, in the Parish of Halwell, all in the said County of Devon; and for maintaining and keeping in repair the Bridge called Totnes Bridge; and also for making, amending, widening, altering, repairing, and improving the several new Roads therein described; (that is to say,) the Road from the Termination of the new Line of Road then making by the Trustees of the Exeter Turnpike Roads at or near a Place called Strap Lane, in the Parish of Kingsteignton, to the Village of Kingsteignton, and from thence to the Townships of Newton Bushell and Newton Abbott, or one of them, in the several Parishes of Highwick and Wolborough; the Road from the said Village of Kingsteignton to New Cross in the said Parish of Kingsteignton; the Road from the said Village of Kingsteignton to Teign Bridge in the Parishes of Kingsteignton and Teigngrace, or one of them; from a Bridge called Gatcombe Bridge, in the Parish of Littlehempston, to a Bridge called Littlehempston Bridge, in or near the Village of Littlehempston; the Road from the Village of True Street in the Parish of Berry Pomeroy to a certain Road leading from the Village of Weston to Weston House in the said Parish; and also a Road from Venn Cross in the Parish of Ugborough to communicate with the present Turnpike Road leading from Ashburton to Plymouth at or near a Place called Higher Cross, leading to the Village of Wrangaton in the said Parish, all in the said County of Devon; and also for erecting and maintaining several Bridges over the Stover Canal, the Rivers Teign and Lemon,

and the Mill Leat, therein-before described: And whereas the old Line of Road from the present Termination of the old Exeter Turnpike Road at or near the Entrance of a certain Lane called Strap Lane, in the Parish of Kingsteignton, to a Place called Biddaford, in the Parish of Ugborough, being Part of the Roads comprised in the said Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His aid late Majesty, and intended to be comprised in the said recited Act, has by Mistake been omitted to be described therein, and it is expedient that the said Mistake should be rectified; but the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Road omitted said Line of Road from the present Termination of the old Exeter Turn- by Mistake to pike Road at or near the Entrance of a certain Lane called Strap Lane, be described in recited Act in the Parish of Kingsteignton, to a Place called Biddaford, in the Parish to be repaired of Ugborough, so by Mistake omitted to be described in the said recited by virtue of Act, shall be and the same is hereby declared to be a Part of the Road this Act. intended to be repaired and maintained by virtue of the said recited Act.

II. And be it further enacted, That the said recited Act, and all and Powers of every the Tolls, Clauses, Powers, and Provisions therein contained, shall extend, and be construed, deemed, and taken to extend to the said Road this Act. so by Mistake omitted in the said Act, in as full, ample, and complete a Manner, to all Intents and Purposes, as if the same Road had been fully and particularly set out and described therein.

III. And be it further enacted, That the Trustees acting under and by Indemnifying virtue of the said recited Act, their Treasurer, Clerk, and Surveyor, and the Trustees, all and every Person or Persons acting under their Authority, and all &c. Renters of Tolls, and his, her, and their Servants or Agents, and all other Persons who by virtue of the said recited Act have received or collected from any Person or Persons whomsoever at any Turnpike or Toll Gate now standing on or across or by the Sides of the said Roads so by Mistake omitted as aforesaid, any Sum or Sums of Money by way of Toll, shall be, and they, he, and she are hereby indemnified from any Action or Suit which can or may be brought against them, him, or her, in consequence of their, his, or her receiving such Sum or Sums of Money at any Toll Gate on the said Road so by Mistake omitted as aforesaid.

IV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken Public Act. to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.

V. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take Commenceeffect from the Fourth Thursday next after the passing of the said recited Act, and shall continue and be in force and be executed for and during Continuance the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
