SCHEDULE 1

THE UNIFORM LAW ON THE INTERNATIONAL SALE OF GOODS

CHAPTER IV.—OBLIGATIONS OF THE BUYER

Section II.—Taking delivery

- 2 Where the contract is not avoided, the seller shall have the right to require the buyer to take delivery of the goods in accordance with the details thereof and shall fix a reasonable period of time within which the buyer may submit a different specification. If the buyer fails to do so the specification made by the seller shall be binding.
