PERFORMANCE OF THE CONTRACT

34 Buyer's right of examining the goods.

 $[^{F1}(1)]^{F2}...$

Unless otherwise agreed, when the seller tenders delivery of goods to the buyer, he is bound on request to afford the buyer a reasonable opportunity of examining the goods for the purpose of ascertaining whether they are in conformity with the contract [F3 and, in the case of a contract for sale by sample, of comparing the bulk with the sample.]

[F4(2) Nothing in this section affects the operation of section 22 (time limit for short-term right to reject) of the Consumer Rights Act 2015.]
