- (3) If a designated derogation is amended or replaced it ceases to be a designated derogation.
- (4) But subsection (3) does not prevent the [F4Secretary of State] from exercising his power under subsection (1) F5. . . to make a fresh designation order in respect of the Article concerned.
- (5) The [F6Secretary of State] must by order make such amendments to Schedule 3 as he considers appropriate to reflect—
 - (a) any designation order; or
 - (b) the effect of subsection (3).

(1) In this Act "designated derogation" means—

(6) A designation order may be made in anticipation of the making by the United Kingdom of a proposed derogation.
