SCHEDULE 5

FORFEITURE ON CONVICTION

Forfeiture in relation to restricted apparatus

- 2
- (1) Where a person is convicted of an offence under Part 2, 3 or 6 involving restricted apparatus, the court must order the apparatus to be forfeited to OFCOM unless the defendant or a person who claims to be the owner of, or otherwise interested in, the apparatus shows cause why it should not be forfeited.
 - (2) This paragraph does not affect the operation of paragraph 1 in relation to apparatus that is not restricted apparatus.
 - (3) Apparatus is restricted apparatus if custody or control of apparatus of any class or description to which it belongs is for the time being restricted by a restriction order under section 62.
