COMMENCEMENT AND TRANSITORY PROVISION

- 33 (1) Parts 1 and 3 of this Schedule come into force at the end of the period of 2 months beginning with the day on which this Act is passed.
 - (2) Part 2 of this Schedule comes into force—
 - (a) for the purposes of making regulations under Part 5 of FA 2014, on the day on which this Act is passed, and
 - (b) for remaining purposes, at the end of the period of 2 months beginning with the day on which this Act is passed.
- Before the coming into force of the repeals in section 4C of SSCBA 1992 made by Part 1 of Schedule 14 to Welfare Reform Act 2012 c. 5>WRA 2012 (abolition of benefits superseded by universal credit), the reference in paragraph 22 to a jobseeker's allowance is to be treated as a reference to a contribution-based jobseeker's allowance (within the meaning of JA 1995).
