PROHIBITION NOTICES AND PROHIBITION ORDERS

Protections for service providers of intermediary services

- 8 (1) A prohibition notice or prohibition order may not include terms which impose liabilities on service providers of intermediary services so far as the imposition of those liabilities would result in a contravention of Article 12, 13 or 14 of the E-Commerce Directive (various protections for service providers of intermediary services) [^{F1}, reading those Articles as if the requirements imposed on a Member State were imposed on the person giving the notice or the court making the order].
 - (2) A prohibition notice or prohibition order may not include terms which impose a general obligation on service providers of intermediary services [^{F2}falling within the descriptions contained in] Article 12, 13 or 14 of the E-Commerce Directive—
 - (a) to monitor the information which they transmit or store when providing those services, or
 - (b) actively to seek facts or circumstances indicating illegal activity when providing those services.
