PART 1

CONSEQUENTIAL PROVISION

European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 (c. 16)

2 Section 4 of the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 (saving for rights etc under section 2(1) of the European Communities Act 1972) ceases to apply to rights, powers, liabilities, obligations, restrictions, remedies and procedures that are derived from—

- (a) the Convention on Jurisdiction, Applicable Law, Recognition, Enforcement and Co-operation in respect of Parental Responsibility and Measures for the Protection of Children concluded on 19th October 1996 at The Hague,
- (b) the Convention on Choice of Court Agreements concluded on 30th June 2005 at The Hague, or
- (c) the Convention on the International Recovery of Child Support and Other Forms of Family Maintenance done at The Hague on 23 November 2007.
