OFFENCES, AND THE PROSECUTION AND PUNISHMENT OF OFFENCES

Suppression of brothels

Tenant permitting premises to be used for prostitution.

It is an offence for the tenant or occupier of any premises knowingly to permit the whole or part of the premises to be used for the purposes of habitual prostitution. [FI (whether any prostitute involved is male or female)]
